1. The Ministry of Corporate Affairs ("MCA") vide its General Circulars No. 14/2020 dated April 08, 2020, 17/2020 dated April 13, 2020, 20/2020 dated May 05, 2020, and other relevant circulars including General Circular No. 03/2025 dated September 22, 2025 ("MCA Circulars"), permitted holding of the Annual General Meeting ("AGM") through Video Conferencing ("VC")/ Other Audio Visual Means ("OAVM") without the physical presence of the members at a common venue. Accordingly, in compliance with the MCA Circulars, the AGM of the Company is being held through VC / OAVM. The proceedings of the AGM shall be deemed to be conducted at the Registered Office of the Company which shall be the deemed Venue of the AGM.
2. Explanatory Statement pursuant to the provisions of Section 102 of the Act in respect of Special Business stating material facts and reasons for the proposed resolutions is annexed hereto.



3. A statement giving relevant details of the directors seeking appointment/ reappointment, as required under SEBI (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 is annexed herewith as Annexure-I.
4. Pursuant to the provisions of the act, a member entitled to attend and vote at the AGM is entitled to appoint a proxy to attend and vote on his/her behalf and the proxy need not be a member of the company. Since the AGM is being held pursuant to the MCA Circulars through VC /OAVM, physical attendance of members has been dispensed with. Accordingly, the facility for appointment of proxies by the members will not be available for the AGM and hence, the Proxy Form and Attendance Slip are not annexed to this Notice.
5. In pursuance of Section 112 and Section 113 of the Act, Corporate Members are entitled to appoint their authorized representatives to attend the AGM through VC/ OAVM on their behalf and to vote through electronic means. Corporate/Institutional members (i.e. other than individuals, HUF, NRI, etc.) are required to send scanned copy of its Board or governing body resolution/authorization etc., authorizing its representative to attend AGM through VC/OAVM on its behalf and to vote through remote e-voting. The said Resolution/Authorization be sent to the Scrutinizer by email through its registered email address to pkmishra59@yahoo.com with a copy marked to evoting@nsdl.co.in.
6. The Members can join the AGM in the VC/OAVM mode 15 minutes before and after the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notice. The facility of participation at the AGM through VC/OAVM will be made available for 1000 members on first come first served basis. This will not include large Shareholders (Shareholders holding 2% or more shareholding), Promoters, Institutional Investors, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, the Chairpersons of the Audit Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee and Stakeholders Relationship Committee, Auditors etc. who are allowed to attend the AGM without restriction on account of first come first served basis.
7. The attendance of the Members attending the AGM through VC/OAVM will be counted for the purpose of reckoning the quorum under Section 103 of the Companies Act, 2013. In case of joint holders attending the Meeting, only such joint holder who is higher in the order of names will be entitled to vote.
8. Since the AGM will be held through VC / OAVM Facility, the Route Map is not annexed to this Notice.
9. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (as amended) and Regulation 44 of SEBI (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations 2015 (as amended), and the aforesaid MCA and SEBI Circulars the Company is providing facility of remote e-Voting to its Members in respect of the business to be transacted at the AGM. For this purpose, the Company has entered into an agreement with National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL) for facilitating voting through electronic means, as the authorized agency. The facility of casting votes by a member using remote e-Voting system as well as venue voting on the date of the AGM will be provided by NSDL.
10. In compliance with the aforesaid MCA and SEBI Circulars, notice of AGM along with the Annual Report is being sent by electronic mode to those members whose email addresses are registered with the Company/ Registrar & Share Transfer Agent (RTA) or Depositories. Members may note that the Notice calling AGM along with the explanatory statement and Annual Report are available on the website of the Company at smartfinsec.com. The Notice can also be accessed from the websites of the Stock Exchange i.e. BSE Limited at www.bseindia.com and the AGM Notice is also available on the website of NSDL (agency for providing the Remote e-Voting facility) i.e. www.evoting.nsdl.com. Additionally, in accordance with Regulation 36(1)(b) of the Listing Regulations, the Company is also sending a letter to members whose e-mail ids are not registered with Company/RTA/DP providing the

weblink of Company's website from where the Annual Report for financial year 2025-26 can be accessed.

11. Members who have not yet registered their e-mail addresses are requested to register the same with their Depository Participants ("DP") in case the shares are held by them in electronic form and with the RTA in case the shares are held by them in physical form.
12. A person who has acquired the shares and has become a member of the Company after the dispatch of the Notice of the AGM and prior to the Cut-off date i.e. Monday, September 14, 2026 shall be entitled to exercise his/her vote either electronically i.e. remote e-voting or e-voting system on the date of AGM.
13. Once the vote on a resolution is cast by the member, he/she shall not be allowed to change it subsequently or cast the vote again.
14. In terms of the SEBI Listing Regulations, the listed companies shall process all investor service requests only in dematerialised form, including requests related to issuance of duplicate securities certificates, renewal/exchange of securities certificates, endorsement, sub-division/splitting of securities certificate, consolidation of securities certificates/ folios, transmission and transposition. Further, SEBI has simplified the procedure and standardised the format of documents for transmission of securities. Accordingly, Members are requested to submit their service requests by submitting a duly filled and signed Form ISR-4 and ISR-5 (in case of transmission), As mandated by SEBI, all such service requests will be processed by the Company/RTA in dematerialised mode only. Members who are still holding shares in physical form are requested to dematerialise their shares by approaching any of the registered DPs, to eliminate all risks associated with physical shares.
15. The Register of Members and Share Transfer Books of the Company will remain closed from Tuesday, September 15, 2026 to Monday, September 21, 2026 (both days inclusive).

THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR MEMBERS FOR REMOTE E-VOTING AND JOINING GENERAL MEETING ARE AS UNDER:

The remote e-voting period begins on Friday, September 18, 2026 at 9:00 A.M. and ends on Sunday, September 20, 2026 at 5:00 P.M. The remote e-voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting thereafter. The Members, whose names appear in the Register of Members / Beneficial Owners as on the record date (cut-off date) i.e. Monday, September 14, 2026, may cast their vote electronically. The voting right of shareholders shall be in proportion to their share in the paid-up equity share capital of the Company as on the cut-off date, being Monday, September 14, 2026.

How do I vote electronically using NSDL e-Voting system?

The way to vote electronically on NSDL e-Voting system consists of "Two Steps" which are mentioned below:

Step 1: Access to NSDL e-Voting system

A) Login method for e-Voting and joining virtual meeting for Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode

In terms of SEBI circular dated December 9, 2020 on e-Voting facility provided by Listed Companies, Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode are allowed to vote through their demat account maintained with Depositories and Depository Participants. Shareholders are advised to update their mobile number and email Id in their demat accounts in order to access e-Voting facility. You will have to enter your User ID (i.e. your sixteen digit demat account number hold with NSDL), Password/OTP and a Verification Code as shown on the screen. After successful authentication, you will be redirected to NSDL Depository site wherein you can see e-Voting page. Click on company name or e-Voting service provider i.e. NSDL and you will be redirected to e-Voting website of NSDL for casting your vote during the remote e-Voting period or joining virtual meeting & voting during the meeting. - Shareholders/Members can also download NSDL Mobile App “NSDL Speede” facility by scanning the QR code mentioned below for seamless voting experience. NSDL Mobile App is available on  App Store  Google Play  
Individual Shareholders holding securities in demat mode with CDSL	- Users who have opted for CDSL Easi / Easiest facility, can login through their existing user id and password. Option will be made available to reach e-Voting page without any further authentication. The users to login Easi /Easiest are requested to visit CDSL website www.cdslindia.com and click on login icon & New System Myeasi Tab and then user your existing my easi username & password. - After successful login the Easi / Easiest user will be able to see the e-Voting option for eligible companies where the evoting is in progress as per the information provided by company. On clicking the evoting option, the user will be able to see e-Voting page of the e-Voting service provider for casting your vote during the remote e-Voting period or joining virtual meeting & voting during the meeting. Additionally, there is also links provided to access the

2. Once the home page of e-Voting system is launched, click on the icon "Login" which is available under 'Shareholder/Member' section.

3. A new screen will open. You will have to enter your User ID, your Password/OTP and a Verification Code as shown on the screen.
Alternatively, if you are registered for NSDL eservices i.e. IDEAS, you can log-in at <https://eservices.nsdl.com/> with your existing IDEAS login. 7. After entering your password, tick on Agree to "Terms and Conditions" by selecting on the check box.
8. Now, you will have to click on "Login" button.
9. After you click on the "Login" button, Home page of e-Voting will open.

Step 2: Cast your vote electronically and join General Meeting on NSDL e-Voting system.

How to cast your vote electronically and join General Meeting on NSDL e-Voting system

1. After successful login at Step 1, you will be able to see all the companies "EVEN" in which you are holding shares and whose voting cycle and General Meeting is in active status.
2. Select "EVEN" of company for which you wish to cast your vote during the remote e-Voting period and casting your vote during the General Meeting. For joining virtual meeting, you need to click on "VC/OAVM" link placed under "Join Meeting"
3. Now you are ready for e-Voting as the Voting page opens
4. Cast your vote by selecting appropriate options i.e. assent or dissent, verify/modify the number of shares for which you wish to cast your vote and click on "Submit" and also "Confirm" when prompted.
5. Upon confirmation, the message "Vote cast successfully" will be displayed.
6. You can also take the printout of the votes cast by you by clicking on the print option on the confirmation page.
7. Once you confirm your vote on the resolution, you will not be allowed to modify your vote.

General Guidelines for shareholders

1. Institutional shareholders (i.e. other than individuals, HUF, NRI etc.) are required to send scanned copy (PDF/JPG Format) of the relevant Board Resolution/ Authority letter etc. with attested specimen signature of the duly authorized signatory(ies) who are authorized to vote, to the Scrutinizer by e-mail to pkmishra59@yahoo.com with a copy marked to evoting@nsdl.co.in. Institutional shareholders (i.e. other than individuals, HUF, NRI etc.) can also upload their Board Resolution / Power of Attorney / Authority Letter etc. by clicking on "Upload Board Resolution / Authority Letter" displayed under "e-Voting" tab in their login.
2. It is strongly recommended not to share your password with any other person and take utmost care to keep your password confidential. Login to the e-voting website will be disabled upon five unsuccessful attempts to key in the correct password. In such an event, you will need to go through the "[Forgot User Details/Password?](#)" or "[Physical User Reset Password?](#)" option available on www.evoting.nsdl.com to reset the password.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT IN RESPECT OF THE SPECIAL BUSINESS PURSUANT TO SECTION 102 OF THE COMPANIES ACT, 2013

Items No. 3&4:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 180(1)(c) and 180(1)(a) of the Companies Act, 2013, the following powers can be exercised by the Board of Directors with the approval of the members by way of a Special Resolution.

- To borrow money, where the money to be borrowed, together with the money already borrowed by the Company will exceed the aggregate of the Company's paid-up share capital and free reserves and securities premium, apart from temporary loans obtained from the company's bankers in the ordinary course of business, except;
- To sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the whole, or substantially the whole of the undertaking or undertakings.

2. REVIEW OF OPERATIONS AND STATE OF THE COMPANY'S AFFAIRS

The performance of the Company during the year under review, as compared with the previous financial year, is summarized below:

The Company's total income stood at ₹196.73 lakh during FY 2025-26 as against ₹236.77 lakh during FY 2024-25, representing a decrease of approximately 16.91%. The decrease in total income was primarily attributable to lower income from F&O/Jobbing activities and lower income from sale of share.

The Company's profit before tax stood at ₹133.47 lakh during FY 2025-26 as compared to ₹150.08 lakh during FY 2024-25. MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT**Overview**

Smart Finsec Limited is registered with Reserve Bank of India (RBI) as non-deposit accepting NBFC. In terms of the Scale Based Regulatory Framework for NBFCs notified by RBI, the Company falls under the category of Base Layer NBFC (NBFC-BL).

ECONOMIC SCENARIO*Global Economic Environment*

The global economy remained resilient during FY 2025-26, although the operating environment was characterised by heightened geopolitical uncertainty, evolving trade policies and volatility in commodity and financial markets. Global economic activity continued to be supported by resilient consumption and investment, while geopolitical tensions, trade fragmentation and disruptions to critical trade and shipping routes increased uncertainty around energy prices, supply chains and global financial conditions.

The global outlook remains one of moderate growth, with the pace of expansion expected to remain below historical averages. Geopolitical developments, trade-policy uncertainty and commodity-price movements, particularly crude oil, remain key risks to the global economic outlook. At the same time, moderating inflation and continued investment in technology and productive capacity provide support to global economic activity.

Indian Economic Environment

India remained among the fastest-growing major economies during FY 2025-26, supported by resilient domestic demand, private consumption, investment activity and continued government-led infrastructure expenditure. As per the latest provisional estimates released by the National Statistical Office (MoSPI), India's real GDP is estimated to have grown by 7.8% in FY 2025-26, compared with 6.5% in FY 2024-25. The growth momentum was supported by domestic consumption and investment, while services, manufacturing and agriculture contributed to overall economic activity.

Domestic demand continued to provide a strong foundation for economic activity. Private consumption benefited from moderating inflation and improving purchasing power, while investment remained supported by public capital expenditure, infrastructure development and improving capacity utilisation. The Government's continued focus on infrastructure and capital expenditure, together with structural reforms and increasing formalisation of economic activity, is expected to support India's medium-term growth prospects.

Inflation and Monetary Policy

Inflation conditions remained favourable through a significant part of FY 2025-26, supported by moderation in food prices, improved agricultural supply and favourable base effects. The relatively benign inflation environment provided room for monetary easing and supported financial conditions.

The Reserve Bank of India reduced the policy repo rate during 2025, with the rate reaching 5.25% by December 2025. The Monetary Policy Committee subsequently maintained the repo rate at 5.25% and continued with a neutral stance, while keeping a close watch on evolving growth, inflation and external risks. The moderation in inflation and easing monetary conditions provided a supportive backdrop for economic activity, while volatility in international commodity prices, particularly crude oil, remained an important upside risk to inflation and financial conditions.

Outlook for FY 2026-27

The outlook for the Indian economy remains constructive, supported by resilient domestic demand, government-led capital expenditure, infrastructure development, investment activity and the continued formalisation of the economy. India's strong domestic fundamentals are expected to provide resilience against external volatility and support sustainable economic growth.

At the same time, the outlook remains subject to risks arising from geopolitical developments, crude oil and commodity-price volatility, global trade disruptions, movements in the Indian Rupee and volatility in international financial markets. The balance between domestic growth momentum and these external risks is expected to shape the economic environment during FY 2026-27. Continued policy support, infrastructure investment and robust domestic consumption are expected to remain important drivers of economic activity.

INDUSTRY STRUCTURE AND CURRENT SCENARIO*NBFC Industry*

The Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs) sector plays a significant role in the Indian financial system. NBFCs have become a key financial provider for a large segment of the population including small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) and economically unserved and underserved people. The sector remained subject to a strengthening regulatory framework, with emphasis on prudent underwriting, capital adequacy, liquidity management, asset-liability management, governance and risk management. The evolving interest-rate and liquidity environment also remained relevant for the sector's funding costs and credit growth.

Against this backdrop, the Company did not undertake any lending activities during FY 2025-26 and accordingly did not have an active loan portfolio or lending customer base during the year.

Capital Markets

Indian capital markets witnessed a mixed and volatile environment during FY 2025-26, influenced by geopolitical uncertainties, global trade developments, movements in crude oil prices and changing investor sentiment. Despite periods of market volatility, domestic investor participation continued to provide resilience to the Indian capital markets, while activity in the equity derivatives segment remained significant. The regulatory environment also continued to evolve, with greater emphasis on risk management, investor protection and strengthening the framework governing derivatives and market participants.

Against this backdrop, the Company's activities in the capital markets, including F&O trading and jobbing, remained subject to prevailing market conditions, liquidity, volatility and regulatory requirements. The Company earned a profit of ₹67.74 lakh from F&O activities during FY 2025-26, as compared with ₹96.38 lakh during FY 2024-25.

Real Estate Sector

The Indian real estate sector continued to remain an important contributor to economic activity during FY 2025-26, supported by urbanisation, infrastructure development, economic growth and sustained demand across residential and commercial segments. The sector remained influenced by factors such as interest rates, construction costs, regulatory developments and overall economic conditions.

The Company's involvement in the real estate segment remained limited and primarily comprised letting out its properties, with rental income being the principal source of revenue from this segment during the year.

Opportunities and Threats

Opportunities

- Continued development of the Indian financial services and NBFC sector, along with evolving regulatory and market conditions, may provide opportunities for the Company to selectively explore suitable business activities in line with its risk appetite.
- Continued development of Indian capital markets and increasing investor participation may provide opportunities in F&O trading and jobbing activities.
- Adoption of digital platforms can drive operational efficiency, improve customer engagement, and support innovation in product development.
- Working with fintech companies or other financial firms can bring new technology, more customers, and diversified service offerings.

Threats

- Rising competition from traditional banks, fintech players, and other NBFCs poses a challenge to market positioning and customer retention.
- As digital transformation accelerates, so do cybersecurity threats—demanding stronger safeguards to protect financial data and systems.
- Cybersecurity threats and technology-related disruptions may affect trading operations and information security.
- Volatility in equity and derivatives markets may adversely affect trading performance.
- Changes in the regulatory environment applicable to NBFCs and financial services may increase compliance requirements and operational costs.

Area /Product Wise Performance

The Company is a Non-Banking Finance Company (NBFC) engaged in investment in shares and securities, capital market activities and the real estate segment. During FY 2025-26, the Company's activities primarily comprised investment/capital market activities and income from its real estate assets. The Company did not undertake lending activities during the year.

During the year under review, the Company continued its activities in F&O trading and jobbing. Profit from F&O / Jobbing stood at ₹67.74 lakh, as compared with ₹96.38 lakh in FY 2024-25. The Company also undertook transactions in shares during the year, with performance dependent on prevailing market conditions. Interest income comprised interest earned on margin deposits, tax-free bonds and income tax refund. Interest on margin deposits stood at ₹84.05 lakh, compared with ₹73.95 lakh in the previous year, while interest on tax-free bonds and income tax refund amounted to ₹0.77 lakh and ₹0.03 lakh, respectively. The Company's activities in the real estate segment remained limited to letting out its properties. Rental income during FY 2025-26 stood at ₹29.69 lakh, compared with ₹28.97 lakh in FY 2024-25.

Overall, the Company recorded a net profit of ₹97.96 lakh during FY 2025-26 as compared with ₹117.39 lakh in FY 2024-25.

Outlook

The outlook for the Company remains closely linked to the evolving economic environment, capital market conditions and regulatory developments. 1. Basis of accounting and preparation of Financial Statements**A. Corporate Overview**

Smart Finsec Limited (The "Company") (Corporate ID No. L74899DL1995PLC063562), is a Company limited by shares, was incorporated on 2nd May 1995 and domiciled in India. The shares of the Company are listed on Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE). The Company is mainly engaged in the business of lending small loans and investments in stocks, securities and bonds. The Company is a non-deposit taking Non-Banking Finance Company (NBFC) and registered with Reserve Bank of India.

B. Basis of preparation of accounts

The Company has prepared its financial statements in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) as prescribed in the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015 as amended from time to time and notified under the Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, (Act) along with other relevant provisions of the Act, and guidelines issued by Reserve Bank of India (RBI) from time to time.

The standalone financial statements are presented in Indian Rupee which is also the functional currency of the Company, in denomination of lakh with rounding off to two decimals as permitted by Schedule III to the Act. The financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis on historical cost convention, except for certain financial instruments that are measured at fair value or as stated otherwise.

Accounting policies have been consistently applied except where a newly issued accounting standard is initially adopted or a revision to an existing accounting standard requires a change in the accounting policy hitherto in use with those of the previous year.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis, as the Management is satisfied that the Company shall be able to continue its business for the foreseeable future and no material uncertainty exists that may cast significant doubt on the going concern assumption. In making this assessment, the Management has considered a wide range of information relating to present and future conditions, including future projections of profitability, cash flows and capital resources.

The Company presents its Balance Sheet in order of liquidity. The Company prepares and present its Balance Sheet, the Statement of Profit and Loss and the Statement of Changes in Equity in the format prescribed by Division III of Schedule III to the Act. The Statement of Cash Flows has been prepared and presented as per the requirements of Ind AS 7 'Statement of Cash Flows'. The Company generally reports financial assets and financial liabilities on a gross basis in the Balance Sheet. They are offset and reported net only when Ind AS specifically permits the same or it has an unconditional legally enforceable right to offset the recognised amounts without being contingent on a future event. Similarly, the Company offsets incomes and expenses and reports the same on a net basis when permitted by Ind AS specifically unless they are material in nature.

C. Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principle requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon the Management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known / materialized.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that

period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

a. Property, plant and equipment

Useful lives of the tangible assets are based on the life prescribed in Schedule II of the Companies Act 2013. Assumptions are also made, when company assesses, whether an assets may be capitalised and which components of the cost of the assets may capitalised.

b. Provision for contingencies

Provision for expense related liabilities is made on the basis of Management judgement and estimation for possible outflow of resources, if any, in respect of:

Contingencies/claim/litigations against the Company.

2. Significant accounting policies

A. Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at original cost net of tax/ duty credit availed, less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, when significant part of the property, plant and equipment are required to replace at intervals, the company derecognized the replaced part and recognized the new parts with its own associated useful life and it depreciated accordingly. Likewise when a major inspection is performed, its cost is recognized in the carrying amount of the plant and equipment as a replacement if the recognition criteria are satisfied. All other repair and maintenance cost are recognized in the statement of the profit and loss as incurred. The present value of the expected cost for the decommissioning of the asset after its use is included in the cost of the respective asset if the recognition criteria for a provision are met.

Property, plant and equipment are derecognised from the financial statement, either on disposal or when no economic benefits are expected from its use or disposed. Losses arising in the case of retirement of property, plant and equipment and gain or losses arising from disposal of property, plant and equipment are a recognized in the statement of profit and loss in the year of occurrence.

B. Inventories

Inventory includes shares, securities and stock in trade.

- a) Inventories are valued at lower of cost or net realisable value. Cost includes purchase price, taxes (excluding those subsequently recoverable by the enterprise from the concerned revenue authorities), and other expenditure incurred in bringing such inventories to their present location and condition.
- b) Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business.
- c) The comparison of cost or net realisable value is made on every type of security.

C. Investments

Investments are classified into long term investments and current investments. Investments that are intended to be held for one year or more are classified as long-term investments and investments that are intended to be held for less than one year are classified as current investments. Long term investments are

valued at fair market value through profit or loss (FVTPL) and difference in market value and cost is recognised in Profit & Loss account as "Net gain or Net loss on fair value changes".

Current investments are valued at cost or market/fair value, whichever is lower. On disposal of an investment, the difference between its carrying amount and net disposal proceeds is charged or credited to the statement of Profit and loss.

Intangible assets

Capital expenditure on purchase and development of identifiable assets without physical substance is recognized as intangible assets in accordance with principles given under AS-26 – Intangible Assets.

The amortization period and the amortization method for an intangible asset with a finite useful life are reviewed at least at the end of each reporting period. Changes in the expected useful life or the expected pattern of consumption of future economic benefits embodied in the assets are considered to modify the amortization period or method, as appropriate, and are treated as changes in accounting estimates.

Depreciation and amortization

Depreciable amount for assets is the cost of an asset, or other amount substituted for cost, less its estimated residual value. Based on technical evaluation carried out by management, depreciation on fixed assets has been provided for all tangible assets on the straight line method as per the useful life and residual value prescribed under Schedule II, Part-C to the Companies Act, 2013. Residual value has been assessed at 5% of cost of the assets.

Depreciation and amortisation on addition to fixed assets is provided on pro-rata basis from the date the assets are ready for intended use. Depreciation and amortisation on sale/ discard from fixed assets is provided for up to the date of sale, deduction or discard of fixed assets as the case may be. Individual assets costing Rs.5,000 or below are depreciated/ amortised in full in the year of purchase. Depreciation/ Amortisation method and useful lives are reviewed at the each reporting date. If the useful life of an asset is estimated to be significantly different from previous estimates, the depreciation/ amortisation period is changed accordingly.

D. Impairment of Non-financial assets

Property, plant and equipment, intangible assets and assets classified as investment property with finite life are evaluated for recoverability whenever there is any indication that their carrying amounts may not be recoverable. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount (i.e. higher of the market value less cost to sell and the value-in-use) is determined on an individual asset basis unless the asset does not generate cash flows that are largely independent of those from other assets. In such cases, the recoverable amount is determined for the Cash Generating Unit (CGU) to which the asset belongs.

If the recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset (or CGU) is reduced to its recoverable amount. An impairment loss is recognized in the statement of profit and loss.

An impairment loss is reversed in the statement of profit and loss if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount. The carrying amount of the asset is increased to its revised recoverable amount, provided that this amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined (net of any accumulated amortization or depreciation) had no impairment loss been recognized for the asset in prior years.

Impairment losses on continuing operations, including impairment on inventories are recognized in the statement of profit and loss, except for properties previously revalued with the revaluation taken to other comprehensive income. For such properties, the impairment is recognized in OCI up to the amount of any previous revaluation surplus.

E. Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand and at bank, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purpose of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash and cash equivalents consists of cash and short term deposits, as defined above, net of outstanding bank overdraft as they being considered as integral part of the Company's cash management.

F. Leases**Operating Leases**

Leases where the Lessor effectively retains substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased item are classified as operating lease. Operating Lease payments are recognized as an expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss on accrual basis or SLM.

G. Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all potential dilutive equity shares.

H. Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets**General**

Provisions are recognized when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event and it is probable that the outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. When the Company expects some or all of a provision to be reimbursed, the expense relating to provision presented in the statement of profit & loss is net of any reimbursement.

If the effect of the time value of money is material, provisions are disclosed using a current pre-tax rate that reflects, when appropriate, the risk specific to the liability. When discounting is used, the increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognized as finance cost.

Contingent liability is disclosed in the notes in case of:

- There is a possible obligation arising from past events, the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the Company.
- A present obligation arising from past event, when it is not probable that as outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation
- A present obligation arises from the past event, when no reliable estimate is possible
- A present obligation arises from the past event, unless the probability of outflow are remote.

Commitments include the amount of purchase order (net of advances) issued to parties for completion of assets.

Provisions, contingent liabilities, contingent assets and commitments are reviewed at each balance sheet date.

Contingent assets

Contingent assets are not recognized in the financial statements.

I. Taxes

Tax expense comprises current income tax and deferred tax. Current income tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the Income-Tax Act, 1961 enacted in India. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that are enacted or substantively enacted, at the reporting date.

Current income tax

Current income tax assets and liabilities are measured at the amount expected to be recovered from or paid to the taxation authorities. Current income tax relating to items recognized directly in equity is recognised in equity and not in the statement of profit and loss. Management periodically evaluates positions taken in the tax returns with respect to situations in which applicable tax regulations are subject to interpretation and establishes provisions where appropriate.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is provided using the balance sheet approach on temporary differences at the reporting date between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts for financial reporting purpose at reporting date. Deferred income tax assets and liabilities are measured using tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date and are expected to apply to taxable income in the years in which those temporary differences are expected to be recovered or settled. The effect of changes in tax rates on deferred income tax assets and liabilities is recognized as income or expense in the period that includes the enactment or the substantive enactment date. A deferred income tax asset is recognized to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profit will be available against which the deductible temporary differences and tax losses can be utilized.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profit will be available to allow all or part of the deferred tax assets to be utilised. Unrecognised deferred tax assets are reassessed at each reporting date and are recognised to the extent that it has become probable that future taxable profits will allow deferred tax assets to be recovered.

The company offsets current tax assets and current tax liabilities, where it has a legally enforceable right to set off the recognized amounts and where it intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realize the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

J. Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the company & revenue is reliably measured.

- a) The Company recognises interest income using effective interest rate (EIR) on all financial assets subsequently measured under amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI). Interest Income is recognized on the time proportionate basis starting from the date of disbursement of loan. In case of Non-Performing Assets, interest income is recognized on receipt basis, as per NBFC Prudential norms.
- b) Dividend income is recognized when the right to receive payment is established.

c) Income from investment in Private Equity Funds ("the fund") is booked as and when the same is distributed by the Fund. Return of capital contribution is reduced from the original cost of investment.

d) In respect of other heads of income the Company accounts the same on accrual basis.

K. Foreign currency translation/conversion

Financial statements have been presented in Indian Rupees (INR), which is the Company's functional and presentation currency.

- **Initial recognition**

Foreign currency transactions are recorded on initial recognition in the functional currency, using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction.

- **Conversion**

Foreign currency monetary items are retranslated using the exchange rate prevailing at the reporting date. Non-monetary items, which are measured in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency, are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction.
