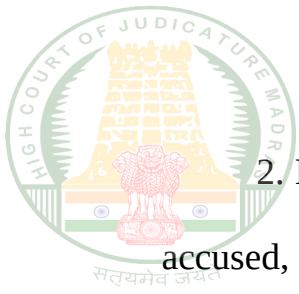
Prayer: Criminal Original Petition has been filed under Section 483 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023, to enlarge the petitioner on bail in Crime No.233 of 2026 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 12.06.2026 for the alleged offences under Sections 8(c) read with Section 22(b), 25, 29(1) of NDPS Act 1985 and Sections 123, 286 of BNS in Crime Number.107 of 2026 on the file of the respondent, seeks bail.



2. It is the case of the prosecution that the petitioner, along with the other accused, was found in illegal possession of 100 Nitrazepam tablets and 9,300 Tapentadol tablets. Hence, the case.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case. He would further submit that the petitioner has been in judicial custody since 12.06.2026 and that the contraband recovered from the petitioner is 300 Tapentadol tablets, which is of intermediate quantity. He also submitted that the petitioner is ready to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he prayed for the grant of bail.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent police, while opposing the grant of bail, reiterated the prosecution case and fairly submitted that, though the total recovery effected is 100 Nitrazepam tablets and 9,300 Tapentadol tablets, 300 Tapentadol tablets were recovered from the petitioner, which is of intermediate quantity. He further submitted that the petitioner has no criminal antecedents.

5. Taking into consideration the period of incarceration undergone by the petitioner since 12.06.2026, the fact that the contraband seized from the petitioner is of intermediate quantity, and the fact that the petitioner has no



criminal antecedents, this Court is inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail, subject to certain conditions.

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6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty-Five Thousand only), with two sureties, each for a like sum, to the satisfaction of the learned Principal Special Court under EC & NDPS Act, Chennai, and subject to the following conditions:

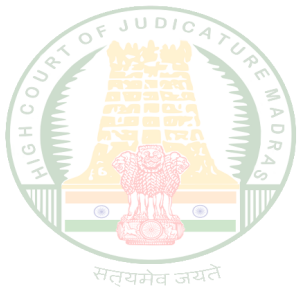
[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the Application for Surety ship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Magistrate shall obtain a copy of any one of the identity proofs to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the Principal Special Court under EC & NDPS Act, Chennai daily at 10.30 a.m for a period of four weeks and thereafter, shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation;

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] on breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions had been imposed and the petitioner



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released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court itself, as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)13 SCC 283]***;

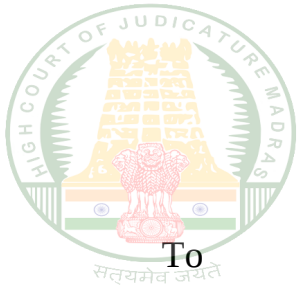
[f] if the petitioner thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR may be registered under Section 269 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

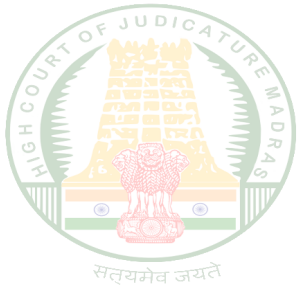
