Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to pass a writ Order or a direction more particularly one in the nature of writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the Respondent Police in insisting for an application and denying the permission to the Petitioners Sangham yearly held ABMS formation day Hall Meeting despite of their written Application dated 14.07.2026 by the 2nd Respondent without assigning any reason though permission

not necessary for any Hall meetings is illegal and unlawful being violative of article 14, 19 and 21 of Constitution of India consequently direct the Respondent Police to permit the Petitioners Amarula Bhandu Mithrula Sangham (ABMS) formation Day Hall Meeting on 18.07.2026 at Katragadda Srinivasa Rao HALL at Sundarayya Vignana Kendram, Bhaghlimgampalli , Hyderabad without insisting for any permission and not to create any hurdles in holding the Martyrs meeting by the participation of their family members and friends as a memorial Meeting of their loved ones from 2 PM to 9PM on 18.07. 2026.

ORDER

This Writ Petition is moved by way of a lunch motion. Challenging the action of the respondent authorities in insisting that petitioners obtain permission from the police for conducting the annual meeting of their Sangham at Katragadda Srinivasa Rao Hall on 18.07.2026, though there is no requirement for such permission. this Writ Petition is filed.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners have already submitted a representation seeking permission to conduct the annual meeting to pay respects to their departed family

members and friends but no decision has been communicated by the authorities so far. It is submitted that, as the meeting is scheduled to be held tomorrow, i.e., 18.07.2026, the petitioners are constrained to approach this Court by way of a lunch motion.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are representatives of the 'Amarula Bandhu Mitrula Samithi', which was established in the year 2002, and that for the past 24 years, annual meetings have been conducted to commemorate and pay condolences to the departed members of their families. It is submitted that there was no requirement or insistence for permission from the police for conducting the meeting in a private hall and it is only for the first time that the hall management insisted upon production of police permission. Accordingly, the petitioners submitted a representation to the police authorities. However, no decision has been communicated to the petitioners till date. Therefore, the present writ petition has been filed.

4. Learned Government Pleader for Home has furnished a copy of the written instructions received by him and submitted that petitioners Nos.1 and 2 are the organizers of the proposed event and that

several criminal cases are registered against them. It is submitted that the petitioners have sought permission to conduct the annual formation day meeting of Amarula Bandhu Mithrula Sangham (ABMS) at Sundarayya Vignana Kendram, Baghlingampally, Hyderabad on 18.07.2026. It is further submitted that the proposed programme is expected to attract a large gathering and, having regard to the locality and the possibility of traffic congestion, public inconvenience and law and order issues, the matter has been placed before the competent authority for an objective assessment. Therefore, no decision has been taken as on date.

5. Having regard to the fact that the said Sangham has been in existence for the past 24 years and the petitioners assert that such meetings have been conducted every year without any untoward incident, and since, except for referring to the criminal cases registered against petitioners Nos.1 and 2 herein, the respondents have not placed any material to show that the earlier meetings had resulted in any law and order problems, this Court is inclined to direct the respondents to allow the petitioners to conduct the meeting as scheduled, subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The meeting shall be confined to the friends and family members of the departed souls, and that the organizers shall ensure that no anti-social element/extremists participate in the gathering.
- (ii) There shall be no inflammatory, provocative or objectionable speeches by the organizers or any other participant.
- (iii) The organizers shall ensure that there is no obstruction to traffic or inconvenience to the general public and that the number of attendees do not exceed the seating capacity of the hall.
- (iv) There shall not be any slogans, speeches or activities in support of any banned or declared extremist organisation or extremist ideology.
- (v) The respondent-police shall make necessary arrangements to maintain law and order. In the event of any violation of the above conditions or any untoward incident, the respondent-

police are at liberty to take appropriate action in accordance with law.

6. Accordingly, this writ petition is disposed of. There shall be no order as to costs.

7. Miscellaneous petitions, if any, pending in this writ petition, shall stand closed.
