1. The parties are represented by their respective counsels.
2. Having perused the entire materials as placed before this Court and having heard the learned counsels for the parties this Court proposes to dispose of the instant writ petition by passing following orders, namely:
 - i. The respondent No. 2 authority shall consider the writ petitioner's representation dated 10.01.2026 in accordance with law and after giving an opportunity of hearing to the writ petitioner and to produce relevant documents, if necessary shall pass a reasoned order and shall forthwith communicate the same to the writ petitioner.
 - ii. The entire exercise as indicate in the forgoing paragraph is to be completed within 45 (forty five) working days from the date of communication of the server copy of this order.
 - iii. In the event while passing reasoned order the respondent No.2 authority finds sufficient merits in

the representation of the writ petitioner, he is directed to take all consequently action soon thereafter.

3. With the aforesaid observation WPA/401/2026 is disposed of.

4. Before parting with it is, however, made clear that while disposing the instant writ petition this Court has not gone into the merits of the representation dated 10.01.2026 and thus all points are kept open before the respondent No.2 authority.

5. Since affidavits have not been called for, the allegation made in the writ petitioner are deemed to have been denied.
