At certain places in the Notes forming part of the Financial Statements, certain figures pertaining to Financial Year 2025 were inadvertently reproduced in place of the corresponding figures for Financial Year 2026 during compilation of the Annual Report.

The said figures have now been duly corrected to reflect the appropriate figures for the relevant financial year.

3. An agenda item of the Notice

In respect of Item No. 2 of the Special Business of the Notice of the Annual General Meeting, a minor correction was inadvertently omitted from the relevant portion of the Notice.

The said correction was, however, duly incorporated in the Explanatory Statement accompanying the Notice. The relevant portion of the Notice has now been corrected to align it with the Explanatory Statement.

ORDINARY BUSINESS

1. Adoption of Audited Financial Statements for FY 2025-26

To receive, consider and adopt the **Audited Standalone Financial Statements** of the Company for the financial year ended **31st March 2026**, together with the Reports of the Board of Directors and Auditors thereon.

2. Re-appointment of Director retiring by rotation – Mr. Brijesh Saxena

To appoint **Mr. Brijesh Saxena (DIN: 06645560)**, Executive Director, who retires by rotation and being eligible, offers himself for re-appointment.

1. Regularisation of Statutory Auditor appointed by Board

To consider and if thought fit, pass the following resolution as an **Ordinary Resolution**:

“RESOLVED THAT pursuant to Sections 139, 141 and other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, the appointment of M/s R. K. Sri & Co., Chartered Accountants (FRN 014141N), as Statutory Auditors of the Company, approved by the Board of Directors at its meeting held on 29th August 2026, be and is hereby ratified and regularised for a term of five (5) consecutive years, to hold office from the conclusion of this AGM until the conclusion of the 37th AGM of the Company.”

2. Reclassification of Promoter Group to Public Category and Reclassification of Mr. Ankur Gogia as Promoter

“RESOLVED THAT pursuant to Regulation 31A of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 and all other applicable provisions, the Company hereby approves the request dated 28 August 2026 received from Mr. Satish Gogia, Ex-Managing Director and existing Promoter, along with M/s Satish Gogia HUF, seeking reclassification from the ‘Promoter/Promoter Group’ category to the ‘Public’ category. The Board notes that the entire shareholding of Mr. Satish Gogia and M/s Satish Gogia HUF has been transferred to Mr. Ankur Gogia through a bona fide Gift, and that they no longer hold any shares in the Company nor exercise any control, influence, or participation in the management or policy decisions of the Company. Their reclassification is therefore in full compliance with the conditions prescribed under Regulation 31A of SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015.

Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA), vide its Circular dated September 19, 2024, read with circular dated April 8, 2020, April 13, 2020 and May 5, 2020 has allowed conducting Annual General Meeting through Video Conferencing (VC) or Other Audio Visual Means (OAVM) and dispensed the personal presence of the members at the meeting. The deemed venue for the ensuing AGM shall be the registered office of the company.
2. The relevant **Explanatory Statements** pursuant to section 102 (1) of the Companies Act, 2013, in respect of Special Businesses at the meeting, is annexed hereto and forms part of this notice. 3. **PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT, A MEMBER ENTITLED TO ATTEND AND VOTE AT THE AGM IS ENTITLED TO APPOINT A PROXY TO ATTEND AND VOTE ON HIS/HER BEHALF AND THE PROXY NEED NOT BE A MEMBER OF THE COMPANY. 4. As per the provisions of clause 3.A.II. of the General Circular No. 20/2020 dated May 5, 2020, issued by the MCA, the matters of Special Business accompanying Notice, are considered to be unavoidable by the Board and hence, form part of this Notice.
5. The Members can join the AGM in the VC/OAVM mode 15 minutes before and after the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notice. The facility of participation at the AGM through VC/OAVM will be made available for 1000 members on first come first served basis. 7. In case of joint holders, the Member whose name appears as the first holder in the order of names as per the Register of Members of the Company will be entitled to vote at the AGM.
8. Members attending the AGM through VC/OAVM shall be counted for the purpose of reckoning the quorum under Section 103 of the Companies Act, 2013.
9. Details of Directors retiring by rotation /seeking appointment /re-appointment at this Meeting are provided in Item No. 2 and 3.
10. In line with the General Circulars No. 20/2020 dated May 5, 2020, No. 02/2021 dated January 13, 2021 and Circular No. 10/2022 dated December 28, 2022 issued by the MCA and the SEBI Circulars, Notice of the AGM along with the Integrated Annual Report 2025-26 is being sent only through electronic mode to those Members whose e-mail addresses are registered with the Company/Depositories/RTA, unless any Member has requested for a physical copy of the same. 13. 21. Brief resume of Directors proposed to be appointed/reappointed as stipulated under Regulations 36(3) of SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015 is provided in this Annual Report.
22. M/s Arpit Garg & Associates through Mr. Arpit Garg, Practicing Company Secretary (COP No.

22703), has been appointed as the Scrutinizer to scrutinize the e-voting process in a fair and transparent manner.

23. In compliance with the General Circulars No. 20/2020 dated May 5, 2020, No. 02/2021 dated January 13, 2021 and Circular No. 10/2022 dated December 28, 2022 issued by the MCA and the SEBI Circulars, Notice of the AGM along with the Integrated Annual Report 2025-26 is being sent only through electronic mode to those Members whose e-mail addresses are registered with the Company/Depositories/RTA, unless any Member has requested for a physical copy of the same. Members who have not registered their e-mail address so far are requested to register their e-mail address for receiving all communication including Annual Report, Notices, Circulars, etc. from the Company electronically. 24. PROCEDURE FOR REMOTE E-VOTING

- (1) Pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (as amended) and Regulation 44 of SEBI (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (as amended), and the Circulars issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs and SEBI, the Company is providing the facility of remote e-Voting to its Members in respect of the business to be transacted at the AGM. For this purpose, the Company has entered into an agreement with National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL) for facilitating voting through electronic means, as the authorized agency. The facility of casting votes by a member using remote e-Voting system as well as venue voting on the date of the AGM will be provided by NSDL.
- (2) The remote e-voting period commences on **Saturday, September 26, 2026, 9:00 a.m. and ends on Monday, September 28, 2026, 5:00 p.m.** During this period, Members of the Company, holding shares either in physical form or in dematerialized form, as on the cut-off date i.e. **Tuesday, September 22, 2026**, may cast their vote electronically through remote e-voting. The remote e-voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting

thereafter. Once the vote on a resolution is cast by the member, the member shall not be allowed to change it subsequently. A person who is not a Member as on the cut-off date should treat this notice for information purposes only.

- (3) The members who have cast their vote by remote e-voting prior to the AGM may also attend the AGM but shall not be entitled to cast their vote again.
- (4) The facility for voting through electronic voting system shall be made available during the AGM and only those Members, who will be present in the AGM through VC/OAVM facility and have not cast their vote on the Resolutions through remote e-voting and are otherwise not barred from doing so, shall be eligible to vote through e-voting system in the AGM.
- (5) In compliance with applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Pursuant to General Circulars No. 14/2020 dated April 8, 2020, No. 17/2020 dated April 13, 2020, No. 20/2020 dated May 5, 2020, No. 02/2021 dated January 13, 2021, No. 21/2021 dated December 14, 2021, No. 2/2022 dated May 5, 2022 and No. 10/2022 dated December 28, 2022 and other subsequent circulars issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (collectively referred to as 'MCA Circulars'), the Company is convening the 32nd Annual General Meeting ('AGM') through Video Conferencing ('VC')/Other Audio Visual Means ('OAVM'), without the physical presence of the Members at a common venue. Further, Securities and Exchange Board of India ('SEBI'), vide its Circulars No. SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD1/CIR/P/2020/79 dated May 12, 2020, SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD2/CIR/P/2021/11 dated January 15, 2021, SEBI/HO/DDHS/P/CIR/2022/0063 dated May 13, 2022 and SEBI/HO/CRD/PoD-2/P/CIR/2023/4 dated January 5, 2023 ('SEBI Circulars') and other applicable circulars issued in this regard, have provided relaxations from compliance with certain provisions of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ('Listing Regulations'). In compliance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act'), the Listing Regulations and MCA Circulars, the 32nd AGM of the Company is being conducted through VC/OAVM Facility, which does not require physical presence of members at a common venue.

25. The process and manner for remote e-voting are as under:

THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR MEMBERS FOR REMOTE E-VOTING AND JOINING GENERAL MEETING ARE AS UNDER: -

The remote e-voting period begins on Saturday, September 26, 2026 at 09:00 A.M. and ends on Monday, September 28, 2026 at 05:00 P.M. The remote e-voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting thereafter. The Members, whose names appear in the Register of Members/Beneficial Owners as on the record date (cut-off date) i.e. September 22, 2026, may cast their vote electronically. The voting right of shareholders shall be in proportion to their share in the paid-up equity share capital of the Company as on the cut-off date, being September 22, 2026.

How do I vote electronically using NSDL e-Voting system?

The way to vote electronically on NSDL e-Voting system consists of "Two Steps" which are mentioned below:

Step 1: Access to NSDL e-Voting system

a. Login method for e-Voting and joining virtual meeting for Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode

In terms of SEBI circular dated December 9, 2020 on e-Voting facility provided by Listed Companies, Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode are allowed to vote through their demat account maintained with Depositories and Depository Participants. Shareholders are advised to update their mobile number and email Id in their demat accounts in order to access e-Voting facility.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 102 OF THE COMPANIES ACT, 2013

Item No. 1 – Regularisation of Statutory Auditor appointed by the Board

The Board of Directors, at its meeting held on **29th August 2026**, appointed **M/s Raj K. Sri & Co.** Chartered Accountants (FRN 014141N), as Statutory Auditors of the Company to fill the vacancy arising due to resignation of the previous auditor. The appointment was made in accordance with Section 139(8) of the Companies Act, 2013, which permits the Board to appoint an auditor in case of a casual vacancy, subject to approval of shareholders at the next general meeting.

The proposed term of **five (5) consecutive years**, commencing from the conclusion of the 32nd AGM until the conclusion of the 37th AGM, is in compliance with Section 139(1) of the Act and Rule 3 of the Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014.

The Audit Committee has evaluated the credentials, peer review status, independence declaration, and experience profile of the firm and recommended their appointment. The Board has also confirmed that the firm satisfies the eligibility criteria under Sections 141 and 144 of the Act.

The Members' approval is therefore sought to regularise the appointment and confirm the tenure of the Statutory Auditor.

None of the Directors or Key Managerial Personnel ("KMP") or their relatives are concerned or interested in this resolution. The Board recommends the resolution for approval.

Item No. 2 – Reclassification of Promoter Group and Reclassification of Mr. Ankur Gogia as Promoter

The Company has received a formal request from Mr. Satish Gogia, Ex-Managing Director and existing Promoter, and M/s Satish Gogia HUF, seeking reclassification from the Promoter/Promoter Group category to the Public category. The request has been made pursuant to Regulation 31A of SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015.

The applicants have represented that:

- They have transferred their entire shareholding in the Company to Mr. Ankur Gogia, Executive Managing Director, through a bona-fide Gift, without any consideration.
- They do not hold any shares in the Company post-transfer, except for 2900 equity shares held in June 2026 by Mr. Satish Gogia.
- They do not exercise any control, management influence, or participation in the affairs of the Company.
- They do not have any special rights such as board representation, voting arrangements, or veto powers.

- They satisfy all conditions prescribed under Regulation 31A(3) and 31A(4) of SEBI LODR.

Further, the Board has taken note of the fact that Late Shri Khem Chand, an erstwhile promoter who passed away more than two decades ago, held 1,00,000 shares in physical form. As the shares continue to remain unclaimed and no control or influence is exercised by his legal heirs, the Board, at its meeting held on 29th August 2026, approved his reclassification to the Public category.

Consequent to the above transfers and in view of his position as Executive Managing Director, the Board has also approved the reclassification of Mr. Ankur Gogia (DIN 05186598) from Public Category to Promoter Category, pursuant to Regulation 31A(3)(b). Mr. Ankur Gogia now holds the entire shareholding previously held by Mr. Satish Gogia and M/s Satish Gogia HUF and is responsible for the management and control of the Company.

The reclassification does not affect the shareholding pattern adversely and does not result in any change in control under SEBI (SAST) Regulations, 2011.

None of the Directors or KMPs except Mr. Ankur Gogia may be deemed concerned or interested in this resolution. The Board recommends the resolution for approval.

Item No. 3 – Approval for Increase in Managerial Remuneration

The Company has witnessed increased operational responsibilities, regulatory compliance requirements, and expansion in business activities. Considering the enhanced role of the Executive Directors and Managing Director, the Board proposes to revise the managerial remuneration payable to them up to **₹1.68 crores per annum**, in line with industry benchmarks and permissible limits.

Their presence on the Board is expected to strengthen governance oversight, risk management, and regulatory compliance.

Report on the audit of Financial Statements

1. Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of **GOGIA CAPITAL GROWTH LIMITED** ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2026, and the statement of Profit and Loss (including other comprehensive income), statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the year ended, notes to the financial statements and summary of the material accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the financial statements").

Verification of Core Trading Terminal Activation and System Readiness	
During the current financial period, management completed technical and capital updates to achieve full activation and readiness across the Company's primary exchange trading networks. We identified this system restoration as a matter of significance to our audit because the live processing status of these terminals serves as the primary gateway for corporate transaction flows and the generation of core operational broking revenues, requiring independent technical validation.	Our audit procedures over this area included confirming the live, active status of the trading networks directly against public exchange infrastructure markers, performing system walk-through tests on the active terminals to verify functional processing stability, and reviewing internal control measures designed to maintain steady infrastructure continuity in live production environments.

4. Information Other than the Financial Statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Director's report along with the annexures, but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. The above reports are expected to be made available to us after the date of this auditor's report.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information identified above when it becomes available and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit, or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

NOTES TO THE STANDALONE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1) Company overview

Gogia Capital Growth Limited ('the Company') was incorporated in India on June 16th, 1994 under the Companies Act, 1956 with its Registered Office at New Delhi CIN NO. L74899DL1994PLC059674.

This company is engaged in providing Stock and Commodity Broking Services to Corporates and Individuals and the shares of the company are listed on BSE.

1. Significant Accounting Policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

These financial statements are prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (IND AS) under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis except for certain financial instruments which are measured at fair values, the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') (to the extent notified).

The Company has adopted IND AS standards and the adoption was carried out in accordance with IND-AS 101 First time adoption of Indian Accounting Standards. The transition was carried out from Indian Accounting Principles generally accepted in India as prescribed under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (IGAAP), which was the previous GAAP. Reconciliations and descriptions of the effect of the transition have been summarized in note to accounts.

Accounting policies have been consistently applied except where a newly issued accounting standard is initially adopted or a revision to an existing accounting standard requires a change in the accounting policy hitherto in use.

2.2 Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with IND AS requires management to make estimates, judgments and assumptions. These estimates, judgments and assumptions affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the period. Application of accounting policies that require critical accounting estimates involving complex and subjective judgments and the use of assumptions in these financial statements have been disclosed at appropriate places.

Accounting estimates could change from period to period. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Appropriate changes in estimates are made as management becomes aware of changes in circumstances surrounding the estimates. Changes in estimates are reflected in the financial statements in the period in which changes are made and, if material, their effects are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

2.3 Current versus Non-Current classification

The Company presents assets and liabilities in the balance sheet based on current/ non-current classification. An asset is treated as current when it is:

- Expected to be realized or intended to be sold or consumed in normal operating cycle,
- Held primarily for the purpose of trading,
- Expected to be realized within twelve months after the reporting period, or
- Cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period

All other assets are classified as non-current Trade receivables which are expected to be realised within 12 months from the reporting date shall be classified as current. Outstanding more than 12 months shall be shown as noncurrent only unless efforts for its recovery have been made and it is likely that payment shall be received within 12 months from the reporting date. A Judicious decision shall be taken by units in this regard.

A liability is current when:

- It is expected to be settled in normal operating cycle,
- It is held primarily for the purpose of trading,
- It is due to be settled within twelve months after the reporting period, or
- There is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period

A payable shall be classified as Trade Payable if it is in respect of the amount due on account of goods purchased or services received in the normal course of business.

Trade payables which are expected to be settled within 12 months from the reporting date shall be shown as current.

The Company classifies all other liabilities as non-current.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are classified as non-current assets and liabilities.

2.4

a) Revenue recognition

The Company earns revenue mainly from providing Stock and Commodity Broking Services to Corporate and Individuals and trading in shares and securities.

The Company also earns revenue from rendering depository services. Brokerage income is recognized on the trade data of transaction, upon confirmation of transactions by stock exchange and clients. Income from Depository services and penal charges are recognised on the basis of agreements entered into with clients and when the right to receive income is established. Income/Loss from trading is calculated on net of STT (Security Transaction Tax) paid during the year.

Interest income is recognized using the effective interest rate method.

Dividend income is recognized when the shareholder's right to receive the payment is established which is generally after the shareholder approve the dividend.

b) Employee benefits

i. Short-term obligations

Liabilities for salaries, including non-monetary benefits that are expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employees render the related service are recognised in respect of employees' services up to the end of the reporting period and are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liabilities are settled. The liabilities are presented as current employee benefit obligations in the balance sheet.

ii. Other long-term employee benefit obligations

The liabilities for earned leave and sick leave are not expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employees render the related service. They are therefore measured as the present value of expected future payments to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the end of the reporting period using the projected unit credit method. The benefits are discounted using the market yields at the end of the reporting period that have terms approximating to the terms of the related obligation. Re measurements as a result of experience adjustments and changes in actuarial assumptions are recognised in profit or loss.

The obligations are presented as current liabilities in the balance sheet if the entity does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the reporting period, regardless of when the actual settlement is expected to occur.

iii. Post-employment obligations

The Company operates the following post-employment schemes:

- (a) Defined benefit plans such as gratuity and
- (b) Defined contribution plans such as provident fund.

Defined benefit plans

The Company's gratuity scheme is a defined benefit plan. A defined benefit plan is a post employment benefit plan. The Company's net obligation in respect of defined benefit plans is calculated by estimating the amount of future benefits that employee have earned in return for their services in the current and prior periods.

Defined contribution plans

The company's provident fund scheme is a defined contribution plan. A defined contribution plan is a post employment benefit plan under which an entity pays fixed contributions and will have no obligation to pay further amounts. Obligation for contributions to defined contribution plans are recognised as employees benefit expenses in the statement of Profit and Loss when they are due.

i. Gratuity

Gratuity is a post employment defined benefit plan. The liability recognised in the Balance Sheet in respect of gratuity is the present value of the defined benefit obligation at the Balance Sheet date. The Company's liability is actuarially determined at the end of each year. Actuarial gains/ losses through re-measurement are recognised in other comprehensive income.

ii. Gratuity obligations

The liability or asset recognised in the balance sheet in respect of gratuity plans is the present value of the defined benefit obligation at the end of the reporting period less the

fair value of plan assets. The defined benefit obligation is calculated annually by actuaries using the projected unit credit method.

The present value of the defined benefit obligation denominated in INR is determined by discounting the estimated future cash outflows by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have terms approximating to the terms of the related obligation. The benefits which are denominated in currency other than INR, the cash flows are discounted using market yields determined by reference to high-quality corporate bonds that are denominated in the currency in which the benefits will be paid, and that have terms approximating to the terms of the related obligation.

The net interest cost is calculated by applying the discount rate to the net balance of the defined benefit obligation and the fair value of plan assets. This cost is included in employee benefit expense in the statement of profit and loss.

Re-measurement gains and losses arising from experience adjustments and changes in actuarial assumptions are recognised in the period in which they occur, directly in other comprehensive income.

They are included in retained earnings in the statement of changes in equity and in the balance sheet. Changes in the present value of the defined benefit obligation resulting from plan amendments or curtailments are recognised immediately in profit or loss as past service cost.

c) Taxes

Current Tax

The current tax expense for the period is determined as the amount of tax payable in respect of taxable income for the period, based on the applicable income tax rates. Current tax relating to items recognised in other comprehensive income or equity is recognised in other comprehensive income or equity, respectively.

Deferred Tax

Deferred tax is provided using the liability method on temporary differences between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts for financial reporting purposes at the reporting date.

Deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all taxable temporary differences. Deferred tax assets are recognised for all deductible temporary differences and, the carry forward of unused tax credits and any unused tax losses. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that taxable profit will be available against which the deductible temporary differences, the carry forward of unused tax credits and unused tax losses can be utilised.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the year when the asset is realised or the liability is settled, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted at the reporting date.

Deferred tax relating to items recognised in other comprehensive income or equity is recognised in other comprehensive income or equity, respectively.

Deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities are offset if a legally enforceable right exists to set off current tax assets against current tax liabilities.

d) Property, plant and equipment

All items of Property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost less depreciation and impairment if any. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items until they are ready for use. Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognized as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. The carrying amount of any component accounted for as a separate asset is derecognized when replaced. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to profit or loss during the reporting period in which they are incurred. The cost and related accumulated depreciation are eliminated from the financial statements upon sale or retirement of the asset and the resultant gains or losses are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

i. Depreciation methods / estimated useful lives and residual value

Depreciation is provided on pro rata basis on Straight Line Method over the estimated useful life of the assets based upon the technical evaluation done by the management. The estimates of the useful life of assets are as follows: -

The assets residual values and useful life are reviewed by the management at the end of each reporting period. The asset carrying amount is written down to its recoverable amount if the assets carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Intangible assets

Intangible assets are stated at cost less accumulated amortization and impairment. Intangible assets are amortized over their respective individual estimated useful lives on a straight-line basis, from the date that they are available for use.

Depreciation is calculated using the straight-line method to allocate their cost, net of their residual values, over their estimated useful lives as estimated by the management.

ii. Inventories

The Company does not have any inventories since the company is engaged in share and commodity broking services

iii. Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets

A provision is recognized if, as a result of a past event, the company has a present legal or constructive obligation that is reasonably estimable, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed in respect of possible obligations that have arisen from past events and the existence of which will be confirmed only by the

occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the enterprise, or is a present obligation that arises from past events but is not recognised because either it is not probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation, or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made. A contingent asset is generally neither recognised nor disclosed.

e) Foreign currency transactions

Foreign currency denominated monetary transactions is recorded at the exchange rates prevailing on the date of respective transactions. Realized gains and losses on foreign currency transactions during the year are recognised in Profit and Loss Account.

Foreign-currency denominated monetary assets and liabilities remaining unsettled at the Balance Sheet date are translated at exchange rates in effect at the balance sheet date. The gains or losses resulting from such translations are included in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

f) Financial Instruments

Component of Financial Instruments

(i) Financial Assets includes, in particulars, cash and cash equivalents, trade receivables, other current receivables and callable security deposits.

(ii) Financial Liabilities includes, in particulars, borrowings, trade payables and other current Payables.

Initial Recognition:-

The company recognises financial assets and financial liabilities when it becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instruments. All the financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised at fair value, which represents the transaction cost at the date of transaction.

Subsequent recognition & impairment : Subsequent recognition of financial assets and financial liabilities are at fair value, if the carrying amount is a reasonable approximation of the fair value it is maintained at that value. Any diminution / impairment in value is recognised in statement of profit and loss as impairment gain /loss.

Derecognition of financial assets and financial liabilities.

A financial assets is derecognised when the contractual rights to the cash flow is realised or forfeited. The financial liability is derecognised when the underlying obligation relating to the liability is fulfilled, terminated or extinguished.

g) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of an asset that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use or sale are capitalised as part of the cost of the asset. All other borrowing costs are expensed in the period in which they occur. Borrowing costs consist of interest and other costs that an entity incurs in connection with the borrowing of funds.

h) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalent in the balance sheet comprise cash at banks and on hand and short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less, which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and short-term deposits, as defined above, net of outstanding bank overdrafts as they are considered an integral part of the Company's cash management.

i) Cash Flow Statement:

Cash Flows are reported using the indirect method as per Ind AS 07, Statement of Cash Flow.

j) Cash dividend to equity holders

The Company recognises a liability to make cash distributions to equity holders of the Company when the distribution is authorised and the distribution is no longer at the discretion of the Company. As per the corporate laws in India, a distribution is authorised when it is approved by the shareholders. A corresponding amount is recognised directly in equity.

k) Earnings per Share

Basic EPS amounts are calculated by dividing the profit for the year attributable to equity holders of the parent by the weighted average number of Equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted EPS amounts are calculated by dividing the profit attributable to equity holders of the parent (after adjusting for interest on the convertible preference shares) by the weighted average number of Equity shares outstanding during the year plus the weighted average number of Equity shares that would be issued on conversion of all the dilutive potential Equity shares into Equity shares.

l) Leases

Lease payments under an operating lease are recognised as an expense in the profit and loss account on accrual basis.

m) Impairment of assets

The company assesses, at each reporting date, whether there is an indication that an asset may be impaired. If any indication exists, or when annual impairment testing for an asset is required, the company estimates the asset's recoverable amount. An asset's recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's or cash-generating unit's (CGU) fair value less costs of disposal and its value in use. Recoverable amount is determined for an individual asset, unless the asset does not generate cash inflows that are largely independent of those from other assets or groups of assets. When the carrying amount of an asset or CGU exceeds its recoverable amount, the asset is considered impaired and is written down to its recoverable amount.

2.5 Adoption of IND-AS

These standalone financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2026 have been prepared in accordance with IND AS. For the purposes of transition to IND AS, the Company has followed the guidance prescribed in IND AS 101 - Adoption of Indian Accounting Standard, with April 1st, 2016 as the transition date and IGAAP as the previous GAAP.

The transition to IND AS has resulted in changes in the presentation of the financial statements, disclosures in the notes thereto and accounting policies and principles. The accounting policies set out in Note 2 have been applied in preparing the standalone financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2026 and the comparative information. An explanation of how the transition from previous GAAP to IND AS has affected the Company's Balance Sheet, Statement of Profit and Loss, is explained by way of reconciliation between previous GAAP and Ind AS.

Exemptions availed on adoption

a) Deemed Cost: - Ind AS 101 provides an option under Ind AS 16 "Property, Plant and Equipment", to continue with the carrying value of all its property, plant and equipment as recognized in financial statements as on transition date, measured as per the previous GAAP and use that as its deemed cost after making necessary adjustments for de-commissioning liabilities instead of measuring at fair value on the transition date.

b) Investment in subsidiaries, joint ventures and associates: - Ind AS 101 provides an option under Ind AS 27 "Separate Financial Statements", to continue with the previous GAAP carrying amount in respect of an entity's investment in subsidiaries, joint ventures and associates in the entity's separate financial statements.

The company has accordingly elected to measure such investments in subsidiary as on the transition date at their previous GAAP carrying value

2.6 Reconciliations between previous GAAP and Ind AS

1 Market risk

Market risk is the risk that changes in market prices, such as foreign exchange rates, interest rates and equity price will affect the company's income or the value of its holding of financial instruments. The objective of the market risk management is to manage and control market risk exposures with acceptable parameters while optimizing the return. The sensitivity analysis excludes the impact of movements in the market variables on the carrying value of the post employment benefit obligations and on the non-financial assets and liabilities. The sensitivity of the relevant profit and loss item is the effect of the assumed changes in respective market risk. Financial instruments affected by market risk includes borrowings, deposit, and other financial instruments.

i. Interest rate risk

This refer to risk to company's cash flow and profit on account of movement in market interest rates.

The company is not exposed to interest rate risk as it doesn't have any borrowings.

ii. Foreign Currency risk

Currency risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flow fluctuate because of changes in market prices. The company is not exposed to foreign currency risk as no transaction made in any other currency other than rupee.

iii Credit Risk

Credit risk is the risk of financial loss to the company if a customer or counterparty to a financial instrument fails to meet its contractual obligations and arises principally from the company's receivables from customers, loans and deposits given, investments and balances at bank. The company measures the expected credit loss of trade receivables based on financial conditions/market practices, credit track record in the market, analysis of historical bad debts and past dealings for extension of credit to customers. Individual credit limits are set accordingly. The company monitors the payment track record of the customers and ageing of receivables. Outstanding customer receivables are regularly monitored. The company considers the concentration of risk with respect to trade receivables as low, as its customers are are located in several jurisdictions and industries and operate in largely independent markets. The company has also taken advances and security deposits from some of its customers, which mitigate the credit risk to an extent.
