This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts giving rise to present IA (re-filing) are that the Appellants e-filed the Memo of Appeal on 27.05.2026. The Office after scrutiny of the Memo of Appeal on 02.06.2026, intimated the defects to the Appellants on the same day. The Appellants re-filed the Appeal on 17.08.2026. It is stated in the IA that defects pointed out by the Registry were numerous, curing which took some time. Registry also required specific clarification in relation to subsequent IA referred to in the Appeal and its connection with the proceedings arising out of IA (IBC)/143/GB/2025 and the impugned order. Upon re-filing, the Registry pointed out further defects which required proper typed copies of annexures along with legible scanned documents, pagination, annexure marking, indexing and bookmarking etc. The relevant records and supporting papers were required to be arranged and transmitted from Guwahati, Assam, where the Appellant and the source documents are situated. Hence, there is delay of 69 days in re-filing the Memo of Appeal, so the same may be condoned.

Heard Ld. Counsel appearing for the Appellants and perused the averments made in the IA as well as Office report.

The Appellants were required to re-file the Memo of Appeal within seven days from the date of intimation of the defects. However, the Appellants re-filed the Memo of Appeal with a delay of 69 days, hence, the case be placed before the Hon'ble Bench with defect for appropriate orders.
