The Ministry of Corporate Affairs (“MCA”) has, vide its General Circular dated September 22, 2025 read together with circulars dated April 8, 2020, April 13, 2020, May 5, 2020, January 13, 2021, December 8, 2021, December 14, 2021, May 5, 2022, December 28, 2022, September 25, 2023 and September 19, 2024 (collectively referred to as “MCA Circulars”), permitted convening the Annual General Meeting (“AGM” / “Meeting”) through Video Conferencing (“VC”) or Other Audio Visual Means (“OAVM”), without physical presence of the members at a common venue. In accordance with the MCA Circulars and applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 (“Act”) read with Rules made thereunder and the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (“Listing Regulations”), the AGM of the Company is being held through VC / OAVM. In compliance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 (“the Act”), SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (“Listing Regulations”) and MCA Circulars, the 08th Annual General Meeting (“Meeting” or “AGM”) of the Company is being held through VC / OAVM on **Tuesday, 29th day of September 2026 at 03:30 P.M. (“IST”)**. The proceedings of the AGM deemed to be conducted at the Registered Office of the Company situated at Office Flat No.1111-A, 11th Floor, Indra Prakash Building, 21, Barakhamba Road, NewDelhi-110001, Connaught Place, Central Delhi, New Delhi, India, 110001’.

PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT, A MEMBER ENTITLED TO ATTEND AND VOTE AT THE AGM IS ENTITLED TO APPOINT A PROXY TO ATTEND AND VOTE ON HIS/HER BEHALF AND THE PROXY NEED NOT BE A MEMBER OF THE COMPANY. SINCE THIS AGM IS BEING HELD PURSUANT TO THE MCA CIRCULARS THROUGH VC OR OAVM, THE REQUIREMENT OF PHYSICAL ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS HAS BEEN DISPENSED WITH.

ACCORDINGLY, IN TERMS OF THE MCA CIRCULARS, THE FACILITY FOR APPOINTMENT OF PROXIES BY THE MEMBERS WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR THIS AGM AND HENCE THE PROXY FORM, ATTENDANCE SLIP AND ROUTE MAP OF AGM ARE NOT ANNEXED TO THIS NOTICE.

2. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (as amended) and Regulation 44 of SEBI (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations 2015 (as amended), and MCA Circulars dated December 28, 2022, May 05, 2022, December 14, 2021, January 13, 2021, April 08, 2020, April 13, 2020 and May 05, 2020 the Company is providing facility of remote e-voting to its Members in respect of the business to be transacted at the AGM. For this purpose, the Company has entered into an agreement with Bigshare for facilitating voting through electronic means, as the authorized e-Voting’s agency. The facility of casting votes by a member using remote e-voting as well as the e-voting system on the date of the AGM will be provided by Bigshare.
3. The Members can join the AGM in the VC/OAVM mode 15 minutes before and after the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notice. The facility of participation at the AGM through VC/OAVM will be made available to at least 1000 members on first come first served basis. This will not include large Shareholders (Shareholders holding 2% or more shareholding), Promoters, Institutional Investors, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, the Chairpersons of the Audit Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee and Stakeholders Relationship Committee, Auditors etc. who are allowed to attend the AGM without restriction on account of first come first served basis.

To facilitate the same and ensure adequate financial flexibility, it may be necessary for the Company to avail funds through loans, borrowings, issuance of debentures, Inter-Corporate Deposits (ICDs), borrowings from banks and other permissible sources.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 180(1)(c) of the Companies Act, 2013, the Board of Directors is required to obtain the prior approval of the Members by way of a Special Resolution where the aggregate borrowings of the Company, apart from temporary loans obtained from the Company's bankers in the ordinary course of business, may exceed the aggregate of its paid-up share capital, free reserves and securities premium account.

Accordingly, it is proposed to obtain the approval of the Members to authorize the Board of Directors to borrow funds, from time to time, through issuance of secured or unsecured debentures, term loans, Inter-Corporate Deposits, secured or unsecured loans from banks and other permissible modes, such that the total outstanding borrowings of the Company at any time shall not exceed Rs. 100 Crores (Rupees One Hundred Crores only).

The proposed borrowing limit will provide the Company with the necessary flexibility to meet its financial requirements and support its business operations and growth plans in an efficient and timely manner.

The Board of Directors recommends the passing of the proposed Special Resolution as set out at **Item No. 6** of the Notice for approval of the Members.

None of the Directors, Key Managerial Personnel of the Company or their respective relatives is concerned or interested, financially or otherwise, in the proposed resolution, except to the extent of their respective shareholding, if any, in the Company.

ITEM NO.: 07

The Company, in order to meet its working capital requirements, capital expenditure, business expansion, general corporate purposes and other financial requirements, may be required to avail various financial facilities and borrowings from banks, financial institutions, investment institutions and other lending agencies.

For securing such borrowings and financial facilities, the Company may be required to create mortgage, pledge, charge, hypothecation or any other security interest over its movable and/or immovable assets and properties, both present and future, including, where applicable, the whole or substantially the whole of the undertaking of the Company.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 180(1)(a) of the Companies Act, 2013, the Board of Directors is required to obtain the prior approval of the Members by way of a Special Resolution for creating security over the whole or substantially the whole of the undertaking of the Company.

Accordingly, it is proposed to obtain the approval of the Members to authorize the Board of Directors to create mortgage, pledge, charge, hypothecation and/or any other security interest over the movable and/or immovable assets and properties of the Company, both present and future, in favour of banks, financial institutions, lending agencies, trustees for debenture/bond holders and other permissible entities, for securing borrowings and other financial facilities.

The proposed authority shall be subject to an aggregate outstanding amount not exceeding **Rs. 100 Crores (Rupees One Hundred Crores only)** and will provide the Company with the flexibility to secure its borrowings and financial arrangements as and when required for its business and operational needs.

None of the Directors, Key Managerial Personnel of the Company or their respective relatives is concerned or interested, financially or otherwise, in the proposed resolution, except to the extent of their respective shareholding, if any, in the Company.

The Board of Directors recommends the passing of the proposed Special Resolution as set out at **Item No. 7** of the Notice for approval of the Members.

ITEM NO.: 08

The Company, in the course of its business and for promoting its business interests, may be required to provide financial assistance to other persons and body corporates by way of loans, guarantees, securities and/or investments in securities from time to time.

Section 186 of the Companies Act, 2013, prescribes certain limits for making investments, granting loans, giving guarantees or providing securities. Where the aggregate of such loans, guarantees, securities and investments exceeds the limits prescribed under the said Section, prior approval of the Members by way of a Special Resolution is required.

Accordingly, approval of the Members is sought to authorize the Board of Directors to grant loans to any person or body corporate, give guarantees or provide securities in connection with loans, and/or make investments by way of subscription, purchase or otherwise in the securities of any body corporate, up to an aggregate amount not exceeding **Rs. 100 Crores (Rupees One Hundred Crores only)**, notwithstanding that such amount may exceed the limits prescribed under Section 186 of the Companies Act, 2013.

The proposed authorization will enable the Company to deploy its surplus funds efficiently, provide financial support to its business associates and group entities, wherever considered appropriate, and make strategic investments in furtherance of the Company's business objectives and interests.

The Board of Directors, after considering the present and future financial requirements and business plans of the Company, is of the view that the proposed resolution is in the best interest of the Company and accordingly recommends the passing of the proposed Special Resolution as set out at **Item No. 8** of the Notice.

The relevant documents, if any, relating to the proposed resolution shall be available for inspection by the Members at the Registered Office of the Company during business hours on all working days up to the date of the ensuing General Meeting.

None of the Directors, Key Managerial Personnel of the Company or their respective relatives is concerned or interested, financially or otherwise, in the proposed resolution, except to the extent of their respective shareholding, if any, in the Company.

ITEM NO.: 09

As per the provisions of Section 185 of the Companies Act, 2013, no company shall, directly or indirectly, advance any loan including any loan represented by a book debt, to any of its Directors or to any other person in whom the Director is interested or give any guarantee or provide any security in connection with any loan taken by him or such other person. In terms of the amended Section 185 of the Act, a company may advance any loan, including any loan represented by a book debt, to any person in whom any of the Directors of the Company is interested or give any guarantee or provide any security in connection with any loan taken by any such person, subject to the condition that approval of the shareholders of the Company is obtained by way of passing a Special Resolution.

The management is of the view that the Company may be required to invest surplus funds, if available in its subsidiary Companies or to any other body corporate(s) in which the Directors of the Company are interested, as and when required. Hence, as an abundant caution, the Board decided to seek approval of the shareholders pursuant to the amended provisions of Section 185 of the Act to provide financial assistance by way of loan or give guarantee or provide security in respect of loans taken by such any person, for their principal business activities. The Members may note that Board of Directors would carefully evaluate proposals and provide such loan, guarantee or security through deployment of funds out of internal resources/accruals and/or any other appropriate sources, from time to time, only for principal business activities of such Entities.

None of the Directors, Key Managerial Personnel of the Company or their relatives or any of other officials of the Company as contemplated in the provisions of Section 102 of the Companies Act, 2013 is, in any way, financially or otherwise, concerned or interested in the resolution.

The Board of Directors recommends resolution as set out in **item No. 9** for approval of the members of the Company by way of passing a Special Resolution.

In this regard, we would like to apprise you of the fact that the Management has taken note of the Order passed by the Joint Commissioner, Adjudication, CGST Delhi North, and the consequential penalty imposed on the Company. The Management is of the considered view that the allegations and the penalty imposed are not sustainable and intends to pursue appropriate legal remedies before the relevant authorities. The Management is in the process of evaluating the matter and taking necessary steps in this regard. Accordingly, based on the Management's assessment of the matter and the legal

		remedies available, no provision has been recognised in the books of account and the matter has been appropriately disclosed as a contingent liability. The Management shall continue to monitor the matter and take all necessary actions to protect the interests of the Company.

The Secretarial Auditor has provided certain observations in their report. The company has duly noted these observations and assures that appropriate measures will be taken to address them in the future.

Pursuant to the order dated December 21, 2020, passed by the DRT-III, Delhi, the Company has been restrained from selling, transferring or otherwise creating any third-party interest in respect of the mortgaged property, being the commercial shop owned by Mrs. Puspha Gupta, Director of the Company, until further orders. The matter is pending adjudication before the DRT.

Further, vide order dated December 26, 2026 passed by the Joint Commissioner, Adjudication, CGST Delhi North, inter alia, the Company has been held to be a non-genuine taxable entity, with allegations relating to fraudulent availment of Input Tax Credit (“ITC”) from its suppliers and passing on of such ITC to its customers. Consequently, a penalty amounting to ₹2,223.54 lakh has been imposed on the Company under the provisions of the Central Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017, and the rules made thereunder. The aforesaid order and the related proceedings may have a material impact on the financial position, liquidity and future operations of the Company, subject to the outcome of any appeal, review or other legal remedies available to the Company under applicable law.

37. CORPORATE GOVERNANCE

Majority decision is carried through while the dissenting members' views are captured and recorded as part of the minutes.

We further report that the Company had outstanding credit facilities of INR 2.00 crore from Axis Bank Limited, with ₹2.06 crore outstanding as at the balance sheet date since December 31, 2019. The matter is pending before the Debt Recovery Tribunal-III, Delhi, pursuant to which the Company has been restrained from creating any third-party interest in the mortgaged property. Further, no provision for interest on the outstanding amount has been made by the Company, as reported by the Statutory Auditor.

We further report that based on report of Statutory Auditor of the company, pursuant to an Order of the Joint Commissioner, Adjudication, CGST Delhi North, held that the Company was a non-genuine taxable entity in relation to alleged fraudulent availment and passing on of Input Tax Credit, and a penalty of ₹2,223.54 lakh was levied on the Company under the Central Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 and the rules made thereunder.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Overview

Your Directors are pleased to present the Management Discussion and Analysis Report for the year ended 31st March, 2026.

The Management Discussion and Analysis have been included in consonance with the Code of Corporate Governance as approved by The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI). Opportunities and Threats

Our Company is exposed to specific risks that are particular to its business and the environment within which it operates.

We believe that the principal factors affecting competition in our business include client relationships reputation, the abilities of employees, market focus and the liquidity on the Balance Sheet.

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of **Glaam Up Jewel Limited** (formerly known as **Gleam Fabmat Limited**) (**"the Company"**) which comprises the Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2026, the Statement of Profit and Loss (including Other Comprehensive Income), Statement of Changes in Equity and Statement of Cash Flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the standalone financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, **except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report**, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting standards specified under section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (as amended) and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31 March 2026 and profit and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

(1) The Company was having credit facility of Rs. 2 crores with Axis Bank Limited and defaulted in payment of demands raised by the bank. The aggregate amount of Rs. 2.06 crores were outstanding as on the date of balance sheet and the same was carried since 31st December 2019. The bank has applied to the Debt Recovery Tribunal ("DRT") for recovery of outstanding dues. As per the order dated on 21st December 2020 in DRT-III, Delhi, the Company is restrained from selling, transferring or otherwise creating third party interest with regards to mortgaged property (i.e. Commercial Shop owned by Mrs. Puspha Gupta, Director) until further orders. The aforesaid matter is pending for next hearing before DRT and the next hearing date is 28 July 2026.

Since the matter under consideration before Debt Recovery Tribunal-III, Delhi for recovery of overdue payments of credit facility from Axis Bank Limited, therefore, the Company has not made any provision for interest payable on the outstanding amount.

(2) Vide Order dated 26th December 2026, the Joint Commissioner, Adjudication, CGST Delhi North has, inter alia, held that the Company is a non-genuine taxable entity, alleging fraudulent availment of Input Tax Credit ("ITC") from its suppliers and passing on of the same to its customers. Consequently, a penalty of INR 2,223.54 lacs has been levied on the Company under the Central Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 and the rules made thereunder.

The Management is of the view that the said penalty is not sustainable and intends to pursue appropriate legal remedies before the relevant authorities. Accordingly, no provision has been recognised in the books of account, and the matter has been disclosed as a contingent liability as at the balance sheet date.

However, in the absence of a legal opinion or other sufficient appropriate evidence supporting the view that the said liability is not probable, we are unable to concur with the Management's position. In case such provision has been recognised, the profit for the year would have been reduced and the corresponding liability increased by INR 2,223.54 lacs. Consequently, this matter may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern if the liability ultimately materialises.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the standalone financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion on the Standalone Financial Statements.

Emphasis of Matters

- (a)** *Note No.33 to the financial statements, Company has not obtained Actuarial Valuation with regards to Employee's terminal benefits i.e., Gratuity and Leave Encashment as mandated by Accounting Standard 15 issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. In view of lesser number of employees on rolls, the Company has made provision for these benefits on actual basis as on the Balance Sheet date.*
- (b)** *Note No.35 to the financial statements, Company has not maintained the adequate records for the inventory lying as stock in trade. In the absence of quantitative details, valuation of these stocks is not ascertainable/measured. We have relied on the representation made to us by the management.*
- (c)** *Note No.41 to the financial statements, the registration under Goods and Service Tax Act of Delhi State was cancelled by the GSTO vide Order ID ZA070821027560S dated 06 August 2021 on account of registered premises not found during their physical verification and the same is inactive as on the date of the results. Therefore, no sale and purchase have been made in Delhi State after the cancellation order. Further, the Company had established its corporate office in the state of Gujarat during the previous year 2022-23, accordingly, registration under Goods and Service Tax Act was taken w.e.f. 20 January 2023. Currently, the Company has started the trading of precious and non precious stones and metals including rough diamonds in the state of Gujarat.*
- (d)** *Note No.42 to the financial statements, as per the information provided by the management, stock amounting to Rs. 304.44 lacs is located at the commercial premises situated at 5504/15, Basti Harpool Singh, Sadar Thana Road, Delhi - 110006. However, the premises have been sealed by Axis Bank Limited due to non-payment of the loan. Due to the sealing of the premises, the physical verification of the stock is not possible, hence, the stock value has been taken as reported by the management.*

Our opinion is not modified in respect of these matters.

NOTES TO ACCOUNTS ON STANDALONE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

01 CORPORATE INFORMATION

Glaam Up Jewel Limited (formerly known as Gleam Fabmat Limited) (“the Company”) is a limited company incorporated under Indian Companies Act, 2013, having its registered office at Office Flat No.1111-A, 11th Floor, Indra Prakash Building 21, Barakhamba Road, New Delhi-110001. The Company is in the business of trading of precious and non precious stones and metals including rough diamonds in the state of Gujarat.

02 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of Accounting and Preparation of the Financial Statements

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (“GAAP”) and in accordance with the applicable Accounting Standards (“AS”) as specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (“the 2013 Act”) and the relevant provisions of the 1956 Act / 2013 Act, as applicable. The financial statements of the Company are prepared under the historical cost convention using the accrual method of accounting. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those of the previous year. All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company’s normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in Schedule III to the 2013 Act.

(b) Use of Estimates

The presentation of the financial statements, in conformity with Indian GAAP, requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, revenues and expenses and disclosure of contingent liabilities. Management believes that the estimates used in the preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable, future results could differ, the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known / materialize.

(c) Property, plant and equipment (PPE)

Tangible assets are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. Cost comprises of the purchase price including import duties and non-refundable taxes, and directly attributable expenses incurred to bring the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of being operated in the manner intended by management. Capital expenditure incurred on rented properties is classified as ‘Leasehold improvements’ under property, plant and equipment.

Subsequent costs related to an item of Property, Plant and Equipment are recognized in the carrying amount of the item if the recognition criteria are met. Items of Property, Plant and Equipment that have been retired from active use and are held for disposal are stated at the lower of their net carrying amount and net realizable value and are shown separately in the financial statements under the head ‘Other current assets’. Any write-down in this regard is recognized immediately in the Statement of Profit and Loss. An item of Property, Plant and Equipment is derecognized on disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. The gain or loss arising on derecognition is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Depreciation on tangible asset is recognized on a straight line basis based on a useful life of the assets prescribed in Schedule II to the Act. If the management’s estimates of the useful life of an asset at the time of acquisition of assets or of the remaining useful life on a subsequent review is shorter than that envisaged in the aforesaid schedule, depreciation is provided at a higher rate owing to their risk of higher obsolesce / wear & tear. The useful life of the assets has been reassessed based on the number of years for which the assets have already been put to use and the estimated minimum

balance period for which the assets can be used in the Company. The estimated life of property, plant and equipment has been determined as follows:

No further depreciation is provided in respect of assets that are fully written down but are still in use.

Leasehold land in the nature of perpetual lease is not amortised. Other leasehold land are amortised over the period of the lease. All property, plant and equipment individually costing less than ₹5,000/- are fully depreciated in the year of purchase.

(d) Intangible assets

Intangible assets are stated at acquisition cost, net of accumulated amortization and accumulated impairment losses, if any. Intangible assets are amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives. A rebuttable presumption that the useful life of an intangible asset will not exceed fifteen years from the date when the asset is available for use is considered by the management. The amortisation period and the amortisation method are reviewed at least at each financial year end. If the expected useful life of the asset is significantly different from previous estimates, the amortisation period is changed accordingly.

Gains or losses arising from the retirement or disposal of an intangible asset are determined as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and recognized as income or expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss. The estimated useful lives of intangible assets are as follows:

(e) Inventories

The figure of closing stock is taken on the basis of physical count of stock by the management at the end of the year.

Inventories are valued at lower of historical cost and net realizable value.

Cost of inventories have been computed to include all costs of purchases, cost of conversion, all non-refundable duties & taxes and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition.

Stock-in-trade are based on weighted average cost basis.

Obsolete, slow moving and defective inventories are valued at net realizable value i.e. scrap rate.

Goods in transit are stated at actual cost incurred up to the date of Balance Sheet.

Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less estimated cost of completion and estimated cost necessary to make the sale. Necessary adjustment for shortage / excess stock is given based on the available evidence and past experience of the Company.

(f) Revenue Recognition

1) Revenue from sale of product

Revenue is recognized in respect of sales on dispatch of product from warehouse to customers. Quality rebates, claims and other discounts, if any, are disclosed separately.

2) Other revenue

Interest on bank deposits is recognized on the time proportion basis taking into account the amounts invested and the rate of interest as applicable.

Dividend income on investment is accounted for when the right to receive the dividend is established. Profit/Loss on sale of mutual funds is recognized when the title to mutual funds ceases to exist.

(g) Employee Benefits

1) Gratuity

Gratuity is calculated in the manner prescribed under Income Tax Act, 1961 and is recognized as expense on actual payment basis.

2) Other Short Term Benefits

Other short-term benefits are recognized as expenses on actual payment basis for the period during which services are rendered by the employee.

(h) Taxation

The tax expense comprises of current tax and deferred tax. Current tax is the amount of income tax determined to be payable in respect of taxable income for a period as per the provisions of Income Tax Act, 1961. Deferred tax is the effect of timing differences between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date and recognised/derecognised only to the extent that there is reasonable/virtual certainty, depending on the nature of the timing differences, that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised.

Minimum Alternate Tax ('MAT') credit is recognised as an asset only when and to the extent there is convincing evidence that the Company will pay normal income tax during the specified period. In the year in which MAT credit becomes eligible to be recognised as an asset in accordance with the recommendations contained in Guidance Note on Accounting for Credit Available in respect of Minimum Alternative Tax under the Income-tax Act, 1961, the said asset is created by way of a credit to the Statement of Profit and Loss and shown as MAT credit entitlement. The Company reviews the same at each balance sheet date and writes down the carrying amount of MAT credit entitlement to the extent it is not reasonably certain that the Company will pay normal income tax during the specified period.

(i) Contingent liabilities and provisions

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the Company or a present obligation that is not recognised because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation. A contingent liability also arises in

extremely rare cases where there is a liability that cannot be recognised because it cannot be measured reliably.

A disclosure is made for a contingent liability when there is a:

- a) possible obligation, the existence of which will be confirmed by the occurrence/non-occurrence of one or more uncertain events, not fully within the control of the Company;
- b) present obligation, where it is not probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation;
- c) present obligation, where a reliable estimate cannot be made.

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are not disclosed to their present value and are determined based on best estimates required to settle the obligation at the reporting date. These estimates are reviewed at each reporting date and are adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

(j) Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

(k) Cash, Cash Equivalents and Bank Balances

Cash, Cash Equivalents and Bank Balances for the purpose of Cash Flow Statement comprise Cash at Bank, Cash in Hand, Cheques / Drafts in Hand, Deposits with Bank within 12 months maturity and other permissible instruments as per Accounting Standard AS-3.

(l) Others

Amounts related to previous years, arisen / settled during the year have been debited / credited to respective heads of accounts.

- 31** The Government of India has consolidated 29 existing labour legislations into a unified framework comprising four Labour Codes, namely the Code on Wages, 2019, the Code on Social Security, 2020, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020 and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 (collectively referred to as the "New Labour Codes"). These Codes have become effective from November 21, 2025. The Ministry of Labour and Employment has issued draft Central Rules and related FAQs to facilitate assessment of the financial impact arising from the implementation of the New Labour Codes.

The Company has assessed the implications of the New Labour Codes and, based on management's evaluation, does not expect any material impact on employee benefit obligations. Accordingly, no adjustment has been considered necessary in these financial results/financial statements.

- 32** In opinion of the Board, the loans & advances and other current assets have a value, which if realized in the ordinary course of business, will not be less than the value stated in the Balance Sheet.
- 33** The Company has not obtained Actuarial Valuation with regards to Employee's terminal benefits i.e., Gratuity and Leave Encashment as mandated by Accounting Standard 15 issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. In view of lesser number of employees on rolls, the Company has made provision for these benefits on actual basis as on the Balance Sheet date.
- 34** Balance appearing under loans & advances, trade receivables, trade payables, current assets and current liabilities are subject to confirmations in certain cases.
- 35** The Company has not maintained the adequate records for the inventory lying as stock in trade. In the absence of quantitative details, valuation of these stocks is not ascertainable/measured. We have relied on the representation made to us by the management.
- 36** During the year, the Company has conducted physical verification of its property, plant and equipment in order to ensure their location, existence and assess their working condition. No discrepancies have been reported during such verification. No further depreciation is provided in respect of assets that are fully written down but are still in use.
- 37** The Company was having credit facility of Rs. 2 crores with Axis Bank Limited and defaulted in payment of demands raised by the bank. The aggregate amount of Rs. 2.06 crores was outstanding as on the date of balance sheet and the same was carried since 31st December 2019. The bank has applied to the Debt Recovery Tribunal ("DRT") for recovery of outstanding dues. As per the order dated on 21st December 2020 in DRT-III, Delhi, the Company is restrained from selling, transferring or otherwise creating third party interest with regards to mortgaged property (i.e. Commercial Shop of Mrs. Puspha Gupta, Director) until further orders. The aforesaid matter is pending for next hearing before DRT and the next hearing date is 28 July 2026.

Since the matter under consideration before Debt Recovery Tribunal-III, Delhi for recovery of overdue payments of credit facility from Axis Bank Limited, therefore, the Company has not made any provision for interest payable on the outstanding amount.

- 38 Vide Order dated 26th December 2025, the Joint Commissioner, Adjudication, CGST Delhi North has, inter alia, held that the Company is a non-genuine taxable entity, alleging fraudulent availment of Input Tax Credit ("ITC") from its suppliers and passing on of the same to its customers. Consequently, a penalty of INR 2,223.54 lacs has been levied on the Company under the Central Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 and the rules made thereunder.

The Management is of the view that the said penalty is not sustainable and intends to pursue appropriate legal remedies before the relevant authorities. Accordingly, no provision has been recognised in the books of account, and the matter has been disclosed as a contingent liability as at the balance sheet date.

However, in the absence of a legal opinion or other sufficient appropriate evidence supporting the view that the said liability is not probable, we are unable to concur with the management's position. In case such provision has been recognised, the profit for the year would have been reduced and the corresponding liability increased by INR 2,223.54 lacs. Consequently, this matter may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern if the liability ultimately materialises.

39 Additional regulatory information

- (i) There are no proceedings that have been initiated or pending against the Company for holding any benami property under the Prohibition of Benami Property Transactions Act, 1988 (as amended from time to time) (earlier Benami Transactions (Prohibition) Act, 1988) and the rules made thereunder.
- (ii) The Company has been declared wilful defaulter by Axis bank (refer note no. 37).
- (iii) There are no transactions / relationship with struck off companies.
- (iv) The Company does not have any transaction not recorded in the books of accounts that has been surrendered or disclosed as income during the year in the tax assessments under the Income-tax Act, 1961 (such as, search or survey or any other relevant provisions of the Income-tax Act, 1961). Further, there was no previously unrecorded income and no additional assets were required to be recorded in the books of account during the year.
- (v) The Company has neither traded nor invested in Crypto currency or Virtual Currency during the year ended March 31, 2026. Further, the Company has also not received any deposits or advances from any person for the purpose of trading or investing in Crypto Currency or Virtual Currency.
- (vi) The Company has not advanced or loaned or invested funds (either borrowed funds or share premium or any other sources or kind of funds) to any other person or entity, including foreign entities ("Intermediaries") with the understanding (whether recorded in writing or otherwise) that the Intermediary shall, whether directly or indirectly lend or invest in other persons/entities identified in any other manner whatsoever by or on behalf of the Company ('ultimate beneficiaries') or provide any guarantee, security or the like on behalf of the Ultimate Beneficiaries.
- (vii) The Company has not been sanctioned working capital limits from banks or financial institutions during any point of time of the year on the basis of security of current assets.

- 41 During the previous year 2021-22, the registration under Goods and Service Tax Act of Delhi State was cancelled by the GSTO vide Order ID ZA070821027560S dated 06 August 2021 on account of registered premises not found during their physical verification and the same is inactive as on the date of the results. Therefore, no sale and purchase have been made in Delhi State after the cancellation order. Further, the Company had established its corporate office in the state of Gujarat during the previous year 2022-23, accordingly, registration under goods and service tax act was taken w.e.f. 20 January 2023. During the year 2023-24, the Company has started its business operations in the Gujarat State.
