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ORAL ORDER

The question for consideration is: *whether this Court must intervene under Article 226 of the Constitution of India to quash the Confirmation Order dated 30.07.2026 under Section 243(3)(e) of the Greater Bengaluru Governance Act, 2024* [for short, '*the GBG Act*'].

Mr. Srinivasa Gowda M, the learned counsel for the petitioner, and Mr. Pawan Kumar, a learned Standing counsel who accepts notice for the respondents, are heard as this Court opines that even the question of violation of principles of natural justice can be examined in the statutory appeal under Section 250 of the GBG Act.

As such, the petition stands disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to avail such remedy observing that if the petitioner avails such remedy along with an application for interim order, the same



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shall be considered at the earliest avoiding
precipitation rendering the appellate remedy
nugatory.
