Mr. Yogesh Pande, learned Deputy Advocate General for the State of Uttarakhand. 3. Mr. Sandeep Tiwari, learned counsel for the respondent-BCI. 4. Mr. Bhupesh Kandpal, learned counsel for the respondent-Uttarakhand Technical University. 5. By means of this writ petition, petitioner has sought the following relief:- a) Issue a writ order or direction in the nature of Mandamus commanding and directing the respondent University to conduct inspection of the petitioner institution within time bound period for the purposes of extension of affiliation/approval for academic year 2025-26 and 2026-27 for which the online application has already been submitted by the petitioner within time along with prescribed fee. b) Issue a writ order or direction in the nature of Mandamus commanding and directing the respondent University to grant extension of affiliation to the petitioner institution for BA LLB, BBA LLB and LLM courses for academic year 2025-26 and 2026-27 c) Issue a writ order or direction in the nature of



			Mandamus commanding and directing the respondent Bar Council of India to सरकार process on the approval of affiliation of the petitioner without insisting for late fee penalty for not furnishing the letter of extension of affiliation from the University. d) Issue a writ order or direction in the nature of Mandamus commanding and directing the respondent BCI to extend the last date to complete the applications i.e. 31.7.2026 prescribed vide its circular dated 13.7.2026 (Annexure 11 page 50.to. 5.3 writ petition) in the peculiar facts and circumstances of the present case. e) Issue a writ order or direction restraining the BCI from acting upon its circular dated 31.7.2026 (Annexure 12 page. 5.4 to55.writ petition) until the respondent University channelizes the extension of affiliation/ approval for the academic year 2025-26 and 2026-27, in accordance with the law. f) Issue a writ order or direction in the nature of Mandamus commanding and directing the respondents University and Bar Council of India to permit the petitioner institute to get admission of the students in BA LLB, BBA LLB and LLM courses as per their sanctioned intake, for academic year 2026-27. 6. Petitioner is imparting education in LLB, BA LLB, LLM, BBA LLB and LLM courses in its College situate at Roorkee, District Haridwar. According to petitioner, Bar Council of India granted interim approval for running BA LLB Course to petitioner College in 2024, while instructions in LLB course is imparted before 2024, after approval from Bar Council of India. 7. According to petitioner, since University has not inspected the College, despite its notification issued on 16.06.2026 and has not processed petitioner's application for affiliation for the current academic session, i.e. 2026-27, and for approval of Bar Council of
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			India, affiliation from the University is necessary, therefore, petitioner is not in a position to apply to the Bar Council of India for approval. 8. Mr. Bhupesh Kandpal, learned counsel appearing for Uttarakhand Technical University assures that inspection will be carried out within three weeks and necessary order shall be passed, as per law, within one week thereafter. 9. The writ petition is, accordingly, disposed of by taking the statement made by learned counsel for Uttarakhand Technical University on record.
