TNPCB contradicts Metro Water claims on Puzhal pollution

IS water in Puzhal lake polluted? Yes says the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB), and no says Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (Metro Water).

The contradiction has surfaced through a TNPCB report filed before the National Green Tribunal's (NGT) southern bench, which is hearing a suo motu case on pollution in the lake.

The board claimed the sewage from houses is entering the reservoir that supplies drinking water to Chennai.

The TNPCB conducted an inspection and collected water samples from the lake in February, finding fecal coliform an indicator of organic and fecal contamination. It subsequently wrote to Metro Water highlighting the results.

"The rear side of the Redhills Lake (Puzhal lake) in the Venkateshwar Nagar, Pudur, Bhanu Nagar and Kallikuppam area were inspected and it was noticed that some of the residences in these areas have let out the sewage into the storm water drain which finally reaches the Redhills Lake," the TNPCB said in the letter.

It also flagged that untreated sewage and sullage from Sakthi Nagar is being illegally discharged directly into the lake through open storm water drains, and directed Metro Water to ensure 100% of houses in Kallikuppam, Banu Nagar, Pudur and Venkatachalam Nagar in Ambattur zone are connected to a functional underground sewerage system.

Metro Water, on the other hand, said no sewage flow was seen entering the lake through storm water drains.

Meanwhile, residents in Ambattur localities without underground sewerage connections allege households lacking sewage hookups routinely let wastewater into storm water drains and canals, possibly lending weight to the TNPCB's concern.

A Metro Water official said a DPR has been prepared to extend sewerage connections to unserved areas, and works would begin after government approval.

To ensure smooth traffic, work to improve 94 bell mouths begins

IN a bid to improve traffic flow and enhance road safety, the Greater Chennai Corporation has launched works to improve bell mouths (road junction curves) across the city. As part of the first phase, the civic body has taken up works at 94 major road junctions at an estimated cost of ₹3 crore. The corpora-

tion said the works are expected to be completed by July 15. In addition, the civic body has also announced that it is preparing a detailed project report (DPR) for the second phase of the project, under which around 600 additional bell mouths across Chennai will be upgraded.

The city corporation currently maintains 488 bus route roads, covering 418.56 km, and

35,978 interior roads extending over 5,653.89 km. The project covers key intersections in all 15 zones of the city, particularly where corporation roads inter-

sect with national highways, state highways and corporation-maintained bus route roads.

According to an official release, improving the bell mouths in accordance with the traffic management guidelines will enable vehicles to negotiate turns more smoothly, improve traffic movement and reduce congestion at intersections. The civic body said the rede-

signed junctions will also help prevent encroachments and improve pedestrian safety by providing better and safer crossing spaces. Work under the first phase is currently under way at several major junctions, including EVR Periyar Salai intersections with Taylors Road, Flowers Road, New Avadi Road, Vasu Street, Alagappa Road, Dr Nair Road and Gengu Reddy Subway Road.

Gas leak: 60 victims take train to Assam

NINE days after the ammonia gas leak at St Peter & Paul Sea Foods Exports Private Limited in Tiruvallur on June 21 that claimed 16 lives, authorities on Monday sent the second batch of affected migrant workers to their native. All of them are from Assam.

Officials said more than 60 workers from Assam departed by train after travel arrangements were coordinated with the state government. Earlier, 62 migrant workers from Odisha had already returned home. With the second batch of migrant workers leaving on Monday, the government relief camp is left with 41 migrant workers from Jharkhand

awaiting travel arrangements. Three workers from Kerala and three from West Bengal continue to undergo treatment at a private hospital in Periyapalayam.

The officials from the Jharkhand Labour Department said delays in securing railway

reservations had slowed the repatriation process. Some workers, however, have chosen to remain in TN to care for their hospitalised relatives.

Meanwhile, CPI held demonstrations across TN, demanding justice for the victims.

Odisha worker found dead with his throat slit

A 21-year-old migrant worker from Odisha, who recently came to Chennai in search of job, was found murdered with his throat slit in his rented room at Thirutheri near Singaperumal Koil in Chengalpattu district in the early hours of Monday. The deceased has been identified as Mustaq. He arrived in Chennai by train about a month ago and spent several weeks looking for work before joining a private restaurant in Maraimalai Nagar as a server around 15 days ago. He

was staying in a shared accommodation for bachelors at Thirutheri. According to the police, Mustaq returned to his room after completing his shift and had dinner on Sunday night.

In the early hours of Monday, unidentified persons allegedly barged into the room and attacked him, slitting his throat. Neighbours rushed to the room after hearing his cries, but the attackers had fled before they arrived.

The Singaperumal Koil police sent his body to the Chengalpattu Government Hospital for a postmortem.

90 held in crackdown against narcotics

Chennai: The Greater Chennai Police intensified its anti-narcotics drive across all 12 police districts between June 21 and 27, leading to registration of 50 cases and arrest of 90. The police said the crackdown on narcotics and tobacco products, including gutka and mawa, will continue. ENS
