Curbs removed, retail outlets can sell fuel to bulk users again

CHENNAI: The Centre's decision to withdraw temporary restrictions on the sale and distribution of petrol and diesel on Monday through public sector fuel retail outlets will restore normal operations at petrol pumps and ease inconvenience for consumers in the state, the Tamil Nadu Petroleum Dealers Association (TNPDA) said.

In its latest notification, the Centre said a review of the petroleum supply situation showed fuel availability had stabilised across the country, making it unnecessary to continue the temporary directions issued earlier this month.

The June 12 notification directed oil marketing companies and retail fuel outlets to prevent institutional, industrial and commercial consumers from purchasing fuel from retail pumps. "The rollback of the June 12 order brings immense relief to retail outlet operators and ensures a restriction-free fuelling experience for the general public," the TNPDA said, and appreciated the decision to restore normal supplies. **ENS**

Take decisions according to law, no one will interfere: Vijay to IAS, IPS officers

GIVING a free hand to the collectors and police officers in discharging their official duties in accordance with the law, Chief Minister C Joseph Vijay on Monday said, "Whoever the offenders may be, and however influential they may be, prompt legal action must be taken impartially and without delay to ensure that they receive the punishment they deserve. At the same time, care must be taken to ensure that no innocent person is affected, even inadvertently."

Addressing the new government's first two-day annual conference of collectors and police officers at the Secretariat, Vijay said, "There will be no interference from any quarter in the discharge of officials' duties." Stating that the people had elected his government for its commitment to transparency, honesty, social justice and corruption-free governance, he urged the officials to make transparency the guiding principle of their administration.

Through his day-long discussions, the CM laid emphasis on the safety of women and children. "Their safety must be ensured 100%, and there should be no compromise on that. Special arrangements must invariably be made to safeguard women," he said and urged the officers to pay special attention to it. He further said a concerted drive must be undertaken to install CCTV cameras at all identified vulnerable locations, including areas unsafe for women, crime-prone locations, accident black spots, and places frequently visited by senior citizens.

Vijay made it clear that delays in registering FIRs in cases relating to crimes against women and under the Pocco Act must

not be tolerated under any circumstances. Schools and educational institutions must neither suppress complaints nor delay forwarding them to the authorities. Awareness campaigns should be conducted in all schools, he noted. Stating that special attention should be paid to student safety, the CM said shops near schools must be kept under constant surveillance and inspected periodically. Those involved in narcotics offences should be arrested immediately, produced before the courts without delay.

Pointing out that the narcotics menace cannot be tackled by enforcement alone, Vijay said, "Equal focus is needed on eliminating drug demand through de-addiction camps in every dis-

trict. As some tablets are also being abused, officials concerned must actively join anti-drug efforts."

He also stressed the need for timely delivery of government services, uninterrupted PDS supplies, effective crime prevention, firm action against caste-based offences, speedy resolution of land disputes, prevention of child marriages, illicit liquor and illegal mining, enhanced safety in chemical and fire-cracker units, measures to reduce road accidents, protection of migrant workers from other states, and courteous treatment of members of the public visiting police stations.

Incidents caused by crowds during temple festivals, political rallies and public events should be prevented and relevant departments should coordinate with the police well in advance and function in close coordination during all major events, he added.

The conference, which began with a general session for IAS and IPS officers, will conclude on Tuesday.

India-Peru FTA could unlock new doors for TN, says min Keerthana

INDUSTRIES Minister S Keerthana said the proposed India-Peru Free Trade Agreement (FTA) could open up new opportunities in mining, pharmaceuticals, renewable energy and advanced manufacturing while strengthening trade and investment between the two sides.

Speaking at Peru's 205th Independence Day in Chennai, Keerthana said Peru and Tamil Nadu are "natural partners", with the state's manufacturing strengths complementing Peru's resource base. She said Tamil Nadu has built a strong industrial ecosystem spanning automobiles, electric vehicles, electronics, aerospace and precision engineering, backed by a skilled workforce.

"As global supply chains are being reshaped around resili-

ence, clean energy and advanced manufacturing, Peru's resource strengths and Tamil Nadu's manufacturing capabilities can create significant opportunities for both economies," she said.

Peru's Ambassador to India, Javier Manuel Paulinich Velarde, said Chennai has been emerging as an important hub for trade, innovation and international collaboration. He said Peru saw significant potential to deepen engagement with the state across

trade, investment, tourism, education and culture. Honorary Consul of Peru in Chennai R Dinesh said bilateral trade had crossed a record \$10 billion, including about \$2 billion in Indian exports and \$8 billion in imports from Peru, more than doubling over the past two years, reflecting growing economic ties and the potential for deeper cooperation.

CHENNAI: Dayalu Ammal, mother of former Chief Minister MK Stalin and wife of late CM Kalaingar M Karunanidhi, was admitted to Apollo Hospital, Grems Road, on Monday, with complaints of respiratory problems. According to sources, Ammal's condition is currently stable. The 95-year-old suffered breathlessness on Monday night and was rushed to the hospital. Subsequently, Stalin and leader of the opposition Udhayanidhi Stalin rushed to the hospital and inquired about her health with the doctors. Dayalu Ammal has been residing at the house she had shared with Kalaingar in Gopalapuram. **ENS**

TN mulls charging more for fancy numbers

OWNING a fancy registration number for vehicles may become costlier, as the state transport department has released a draft notification to hike the fees for fancy numbers (advance registration number). The department has invited the public to send their objection and suggestions before July 3.

The draft amendment to the Tamil Nadu Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, notified on June 19, proposes to replace the existing flat-rate system with a value-based fee mechanism for fancy registration numbers. For two-wheelers and three-wheelers, including battery-

operated vehicles, valued less than ₹50,000, a charge of ₹2,000 has been fixed. For vehicles valued between ₹50,000 to ₹1 lakh, a charge of ₹6,000 has been fixed. Similarly, for vehicles valued between ₹1 lakh to ₹2 lakh, a charge of ₹10,000 has been fixed. For two-wheelers and three-wheelers valued between ₹2 lakh to ₹30 lakh, fancy number charges have been fixed between ₹20,000 and ₹1 lakh.

Further, as per the latest draft amendment, the government-reserved numbers will attract a pay-



ment of ₹80,000 to ₹8 lakh, depending upon the series. In a first, the department has fixed rates for securing fancy numbers for imported vehicles. For imported vehicles, whose value is up to ₹4 lakh, a fee of ₹20,000 will be fixed. For imported vehicles valued up to ₹10 lakh and ₹20 lakh, charges of ₹32,000 and ₹40,000 will be fixed. For vehicles valued up to ₹50 lakh and beyond, charges of ₹75,000 and ₹1.50 lakh will be fixed respectively, as per the draft.

74-year-old man arrested for sexually assaulting six-year-old visiting home

A 74-year-old man was arrested under the Pocco Act for allegedly sexually assaulting a six-year-old at Thirumangalam.

According to the police, the suspect, whose identity is not revealed, runs a pani-puri shop in JJ Nagar and has been living in the same neighborhood as that of

the girl's family. The police said the girl would frequently visit the man's house. On Sunday, the girl returned home and told her parents about the ordeal. Based on the complaint by her parents, the Thirumangalam All Women Police registered a case and arrested the man. After an inquiry, the man was sent to remand.
