1. This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.
2. This writ petition has been filed assailing order dated 19<sup>th</sup> April, 2025 (Annexure-1) passed by learned Presiding Officer, Labour Court, Bhubaneswar in ID Misc. Case No.4 of 2024, whereby an application filed by the Opposite Party No.3-Workman under Section 33-C (2) of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 has been allowed *ex-parte*.
