ORAL ORDER

3 17-08-2026 Heard Mr. Amar Nath Yadav, learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned counsel representing the State.

2. The present petition has been preferred for the following relief/s:

(i) for the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus in order to direct the concerned respondent authority specially the respondent no. 5 to remove the illegally installed/erected Mobile tower from the plot no. 999, which belongs to the petitioner.

(ii) for issuance of a writ in the



nature of mandamus for directing specially the respondent no. 5 for forbidding/restraining the illegally installing/erecting work of Mobile tower over the petitioner's plot of land which had been purchased by him (the petitioner) in the year 1955.

(iii) for issuance of an appropriate writ/writs, direction/directions, commanding the respondent authority to preclude himself from erecting the Mobile tower over the petitioner's plot of land and further directing him to remove the incomplete installed tower from his plot of land i.e. from plot no. 999.

3. After some argument, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he will be knocking the doors of the competent civil court for the redressal of the grievances.

4. Granting said liberty, CWJC No. 12418 of 2026 stands disposed of.
