BJP spokesperson Ban asks Raut to give Rs 40,000 crore to drought-hit farmers

Mumbai, Sep 22 (UNI) BJP Maharashtra chief spokesperson Navnath Ban on Tuesday alleged that the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government had collected Rs 90,000 crore during its two-and-a-half-year tenure during the COVID-19 period, and challenged Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut to announce that Rs 40,000 crore from the amount would be given to drought-affected farmers in Marathwada and Vidarbha.

Addressing a press conference at the BJP state office, Ban was responding to Raut's demand that expenditure on the Kumbh Mela be reduced and the funds be diverted to drought-hit farmers.

Ban said Prime Minister Narendra Modi's birthday was being observed through various service-oriented programmes across the country.

He alleged that Raut and the Shiv Sena (UBT) had raised objections to expenditure related to the

Kumbh Mela and other programmes, while not raising similar objections to expenditure associated with other religious events.

He also criticised former chief minister Uddhav Thackeray over the conduct of cabinet meetings, saying that cabinet meetings could not be compared with a cricket match and alleged that meetings were held online from home during the previous government.

Ban said the government led by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis would take concrete decisions for farmers. He said the government had announced a farm loan waiver without an impending election and that the first instalment had already been distributed.

"There are drought-like conditions in several parts of Marathwada, Vidarbha, Solapur and north Maharashtra. We are reaching out to farmers and extending support," Ban

said.

He also criticised NCP (SP) leader Sharad Pawar over irrigation policies, alleging that adequate measures had not been taken during his tenure as chief minister to address water-related issues.

On national security, Ban said India had adopted a policy of responding firmly to terrorist activities from Pakistan and asked Raut to examine the foreign policy pursued during previous Congress-led governments.

Ban also criticised Congress leader Rahul Gandhi and Raut, alleging that both frequently resorted to imitation and theatrics instead of raising substantive issues concerning farmers and students. Commenting on NCP (SP) MLA Rohit Pawar, Ban said Pawar should focus on his party rather than raising concerns about news portals, adding that the government was capable of dealing with such matters.

Pune Police crack down on illegal vehicle modifications for DJ and Dolby Systems

Pune, Sep 22 (UNI) The Pune Police have announced strict action against vehicle owners and organisers who illegally modify vehicles to install DJ and Dolby sound systems during Ganesh immersion processions and other upcoming festivals.

According to the police, vehicles are being structurally altered to accommodate large multi-speaker sound systems. In several cases, multiple layers of speakers, including top, mid and bass units, are mounted on vehicles, creating a wall-like structure. Such modifications involve unauthorised changes to the original design and structure of the vehicles.

The use of such illegally modified vehicles has now been prohibited. Vehicle owners, drivers and festival organisers have been instructed not to bring such vehicles onto roads or use them during processions.

Therefore, the Police Commissioner has directed that any modified vehicle found being used in a procession will be sealed on the spot. The order will remain in force until November 18.

Police officials said special attention will be given to vehicles carrying large sound systems during Ganesh immersion processions and other festive events. If a vehicle is found to have been illegally modified or used in violation of the order, it will be subject to immediate action, including sealing at the spot.

The police have also warned that the responsibility will not be limited to the vehicle owner or driver. Festival organisers found using or permitting such vehicles may also face strict legal action.

Moreover, the move is aimed at preventing unauthorised structural modifications to vehicles and ensuring that processions are conducted in accordance with the applicable rules and safety requirements.

'Rent a Garba Partner' Advt offer companions for Navratri in Mumbai

Mumbai, Sep 22 (UNI) Social media advertisements offering people the option to "Rent a Garba Partner" for the upcoming Navratri celebrations have drawn attention in Mumbai, with packages offering male and female companions for Garba events at rates of up to Rs 6,500. The advertisements, being circulated through Instagram reels and posts, offer different packages described as Silver, Gold and Platinum. The services listed include accompanying customers to Garba events, wearing matching outfits, teaching Garba steps, taking selfies and making reels. Some of the packages also advertise services such as creating a "fake backstory" for the companion and dropping the customer home after the event.

According to the advertisements cited in a complaint, the charges range from Rs 1,000 for a two-hour package to Rs 6,500 for an all-day service. The advertisements offer both male and female companions.

The promotions have been circulating ahead of the Navratri festival, when large numbers of people are expected to attend Garba and Dandiya events across Mumbai.

Mumbai Crime Branch examines CCTV in IIT-B student death case, professor removed as dean

Mumbai, Sep 22 (UNI) The Crime Branch of Mumbai Police is examining CCTV footage from the IIT Bombay campus as part of its investigation into the death of second-year B.Tech student Sahil Ravindra Wakode, whose parents have alleged caste-based harassment and mental torture.

Wakode, 20, a student of Energy Science and Engineering from Yavatmal, was found dead in his hostel room on September 18, shortly after an examination.

The Powai police had initially registered a case and later invoked provisions of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act following a complaint by his parents, Ravindra and Sonali Wakode. The investigation

was subsequently transferred to the Crime Branch after the family demanded a thorough probe. According to the latest update, investigators are scrutinising CCTV footage from the examination hall, campus and hostel to reconstruct Wakode's movements and establish the sequence of events after he left the examination. Police have clarified that the footage is being examined by the investigating team and has not been released publicly.

The FIR names IIT Bombay professor Suryanarayana Doola, who was the invigilator during the examination, besides other officials. The student's parents have alleged that their son faced caste-based harassment for nearly three months after entering his second year

and was subjected to mental harassment in connection with the examination.

The family had earlier refused to take custody of the body at Rajawadi Hospital and demanded action against those named in their complaint. Following assurances from senior police officers that the case would be investigated by the Crime Branch, the body was handed over to the family for the last rites.

Meanwhile, IIT Bombay has denied allegations of caste discrimination and maintained that caste-related information of students is not available to faculty members. The institute had also said that no disciplinary action had been initiated against Wakode following the examination incident. In a

further development, IIT Bombay suspended Prof Doola from his administrative post as Dean of Administrative Affairs amid continuing protests on the campus. The institute also apologised for its earlier communication concerning the circumstances surrounding Wakode's death.

The institute's Faculty Forum has separately expressed support for Prof Doola and said that he had acted according to institutional rules. The forum has also said that Wakode had not approached the institute's SC/ST cell with a complaint of caste discrimination.

The conflicting claims of the family, institute and sections of the student community are now being examined as part of the police investigation.

Woman killed by husband following family dispute in Dehugaon

Pune, Sep 22 (UNI) A woman was allegedly killed by her husband with a sharp weapon following a prolonged family dispute at Omkar housing society in Pune's Dehugaon town, police said.

The accused, identified as Akash Barskar, an IT company employee, was also injured after allegedly attacking himself and

jumping from the balcony of their second-floor flat.

The incident took place in the early hours of Sunday. Upon receiving the information about a man lying injured below the building, the Police rushed to the spot. Akash was found seriously injured, while his wife, Shubhangi Barskar, was found unconscious with severe injuries inside their residence. Both were taken to a hospital for treatment.

However, doctors declared Shubhangi dead, while Akash is undergoing treatment for injuries

sustained in the incident.

According to the preliminary police investigation, the couple had been involved in a family dispute for nearly a year. Police suspect that during an argument, Akash attacked Shubhangi on her neck with a sharp weapon, seriously injuring her. He allegedly then inflicted injuries on himself with a blade before jumping from the second-floor balcony.

Akash and Shubhangi had married in December 2023 and had been living in a rented house in

Dehugaon for the past few months. Police are investigating reports that the couple had disagreements over Akash's decision to purchase agricultural land in his native village, which was allegedly opposed by Shubhangi. Hence, the investigation has also brought to light questions regarding the information initially provided to police.

According to reports, Akash allegedly claimed that robbers had entered the house after the incident, prompting suspicion among investigators.
