**Item No. 2: Re-Appointment of Mrs. Rajlaxmi Iyar (DIN: 00107754) Non-Executive Director (Director Liable to Retire by Rotation).**

Mrs. Rajlaxmi Iyar (DIN: 00107754) joined the Board of the Company in March 2018 as a non-executive director. She is a member of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee of the Company.

Mrs. Rajlaxmi Iyar is an Arts graduate and has expertise in Business Administration and management. Pursuant to the provisions of section 152 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Articles of Association of the Company, Mrs. Rajlaxmi Iyar is due to retire by rotation at the meeting and has offered herself for reappointment.

Mr. Sankaran Venkata Subramanian, Managing Director, is interested in or concerned, financially or otherwise, in passing the proposed resolution set out in item no. 2.

Details of Mrs. Rajlaxmi Iyar are provided in the "Annexure I" to the Notice.

**Item No. 3: Regularisation of Directorship of Mr. Periasamy Mathialagan (DIN: 11766787), an Additional Non-Executive Non Independent Director, by appointing him as a Non-Executive Non-Independent Director of the Company.**

The Board of Directors of the Company ("Board"), based on the recommendation of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee and pursuant to the provisions of Section 161(1) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") read with the Articles of Association of the Company, has approved the appointment of Mr. Periasamy Mathialagan (DIN: 11766787) as an Additional Non-Executive Non-Independent Director of the Company with effect from June 13, 2026. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 161(1) of the Act, Mr. Periasamy Mathialagan hold office up to the date of this Meeting.

Mr. Periasamy Mathialagan is qualified to be appointed as a Director in terms of Section 164 of the Act and has given his consent to act as a Director. The Company has also received declarations from him, confirming that he is not debarred from holding the office of director by virtue of any order passed by the Securities and Exchange Board of India or any other such authority.

The Company has also received notice under Section 160 of the Act from a Member proposing the candidature of Mr. Periasamy Mathialagan for the office of a Non-Executive Non-Independent Director of the Company.

He has vast experience in management, legal, and financial advisory roles across international markets and his current association with Greenbatt Technologies Holding AG, where he is involved in global scaling strategies for battery manufacturing and energy storage systems.

He shall be paid Sitting fee for attending Board and Committee Meetings, if any of the Company, as may be decided by the Board.

Pursuant to Section 152 of the Companies Act, 2013, for the continuation of Mr. Periasamy Mathialagan as a Non-Executive Director, the consent of the Members would be required by way of an Ordinary Resolution. Having regard to his qualifications, knowledge and rich experience, his appointment on the Board of the Company as a Non- Executive Director will be in the best interest of the Company.

A brief profile of Mr. Periasamy Mathialagan as required under Regulations 36(3) of the Listing Regulations with the Stock Exchange is given in Annexure I to this Explanatory Statement.

Except Mr. Periasamy Mathialagan, being an appointee, none of the Directors and Key Managerial Personnel of the Company and their relatives is concerned or interested (financially or otherwise) in the resolution.

The Board of Directors therefore, recommend passing of the Special Resolution as set out in Item No. 3 of the accompanying Notice for the approval of the Members.

**Item No. 4: Re appointment of Mr. Sankaran Venkata Subramanian (DIN: 00107561) as Managing Director of the Company**

Mr. Sankaran Venkata Subramanian (DIN: 00107561) was appointed as Managing Director with effect from 01st April, 2021 for a term of five (5) years, and accordingly, he is holding office up to 31st March, 2026.

Mr. Sankaran Venkata Sankaran Subramanian will attain the age of 70 years, and therefore, in terms of the provisions of Section 196(3)(a) of the Companies Act, 2013, his re-appointment as Managing Director requires approval of the Members by passing a Special Resolution.

The Board of Directors, after considering his vast experience, knowledge of the Company's business operations and affairs, and his valuable contribution to the growth of the Company, is of the opinion that it would be in the best interest of the Company to continue to avail his services. Accordingly, the Board of Directors in their meeting held on 14th March, 2026 appointed him as Managing Director for a further period of five (5) years with effect from 01st April, 2026 subject to the approval of members in the ensuing AGM.

The main terms and conditions for the re-appointment of Mr. Sankaran Venkata Subramanian are as under:

1. The Managing Director shall exercise and perform such powers and duties as the Board of Directors of the Company (hereinafter called "The Board") shall, from time to time, determine and subject to any directions and restrictions, from time to time, given and imposed by the Board and subject to the restrictions contained hereinafter, he shall have the general control, management and superintendence of the business of the Company with the power to appoint and dismiss employees and to enter into contracts on behalf of the Company in the ordinary course of business and to do and perform all other acts and things, which in the ordinary course of business he may consider necessary or proper or in the interest of the Company.
2. Without prejudice to the generality of the powers vested in the Managing Director under the proceeding clause hereof, the Managing Director shall be entitled to exercise the following powers:
  - a) Together with other authorized officer(s) of the Company to operate on any banking or other account and to draw, make, accept, execute, endorse, discount, negotiate, retire, pay, satisfy and assign cheques, drafts, bills of exchange, promissory notes, hundies, interest and dividend warrants and other negotiable or transferable instruments or securities;
  - b) To engage employees and other servants of the Company as per the recommendation of concerned units;
  - c) To increase the remuneration or salary of any employee or servant of the Company;
  - d) Singly or together with other authorized officer(s) of the Company, to enter into contracts for the purchase of goods and hiring of services for the Company;
  - e) To institute, prosecute, defend, oppose, appear or appeal, to compromise, refer to arbitration, abandon subject to judgement, proceed to judgement and execution or become non-suited in any legal proceedings relating to customs or excise duties, tax on income, profits and capital and taxation generally or otherwise.
3. The Managing Director shall, throughout the said term, devote the whole of his time, attention and abilities to the business of the said Company and shall obey the orders, from time to time, of the Board and in all respects conform to and comply with the directions and regulations made by the Board, and shall faithfully serve the Company and use his utmost endeavor to promote the interest thereof.
4. The main terms and conditions for the re-appointment of Mr. Sankaran Venkata Subramanian are as under:
  - a) Period of Appointment: 5 years
  - b) Remuneration (Effective from 01st April, 2026): Rs.72000 per month
  - c) The terms and conditions of the said appointment may be altered and varied from time to time by the Board as it may, in its discretion deem fit so as not to exceed the limits specified in Schedule V of the Companies Act, 2013, or any

amendment made hereinafter in this regard.

- d) If at any time the Managing Director ceases to be a Director of the Company for any cause whatsoever, he shall cease to be the Managing Director.
- e) The Managing Director shall be entitled for leave benefits as per the rules of the Company i.e. 6 days Sick leave, 6 days Casual leave and 24 days paid leave.

### Minimum Remuneration:

In the absence of inadequacy of profits in any financial year Mr. Sankaran Venkata Subramanian, Managing Director may be paid remuneration by way of salary, perquisites and other allowance not exceeding the limit specified in Schedule V to the Act.

### 5. Other terms and Conditions:

- a) The Managing Director hereby agrees to follow the Code of Conduct adopted by the Company and any modification thereof.
  - b) No sitting fees will be paid to the Managing Director for attending the Meeting of Board of Directors or Committee thereof.
  - c) He shall be entitled to reimbursement of entertainment expenses actually and properly incurred by him, in the course of business of the Company and travelling, hotel and other expenses incurred by him in India and abroad, exclusively on the business of the Company, as per the rules of the Company or as approved by the Board of Directors.
  - d) He shall not engage himself, either directly or indirectly or be interested in any capacity whatsoever or render assistance during the term of this agreement with the Company to any Firm, Company or persons whether a manufacturer, dealer or trader in goods or products which are of the same or similar kind and nature as those of the Company.
  - e) The Company shall be entitled to terminate employment of the Managing Director, if he unable to perform his duties by reason of ill health, accident or disability for a period of 90 days, in any period of twelve consecutive calendar months.
  - f) The terms and conditions of appointment and/or agreement may be altered and varied from time to time by the Board of Directors of the Company as it may be permissible and if deem fit. However, such variation shall not provide for payment of remuneration in excess of the limits specified in the Schedule V of Companies act, 2013 or any amendments made thereto.
  - g) Any property of the Company and any information, trade secrets or other information relating to the business and affairs of the Company, including memorandum, notes, papers, records, reports, sketches, plans or other documents which the Managing Director may be privy to or be in possession of or are under the control of the Managing Director at the time of termination of his employment shall be delivered by the Managing Director to the Company or as it shall direct, and the Managing Director shall not have any copyright over any such document, which he hereby acknowledges to have vested in the Company or it assigns and binds himself not to retain any hard or soft copies of any of them.
6. The Managing Director shall not, during the continuance of his employment or any time thereafter, divulge or disclose to any person, Firm, Company, Body corporate or concern whatsoever or make any use whatever for his own or for whatever purpose of any confidential information or knowledge obtained by him during his employment of the business or affairs of the Company or of any trade secrets or secret processes of the Company and the Managing Director shall, during the continuance of his employment hereunder, also use his best endeavors to prevent any other person, Firm, Company, Body corporate or concern from doing so.
7. 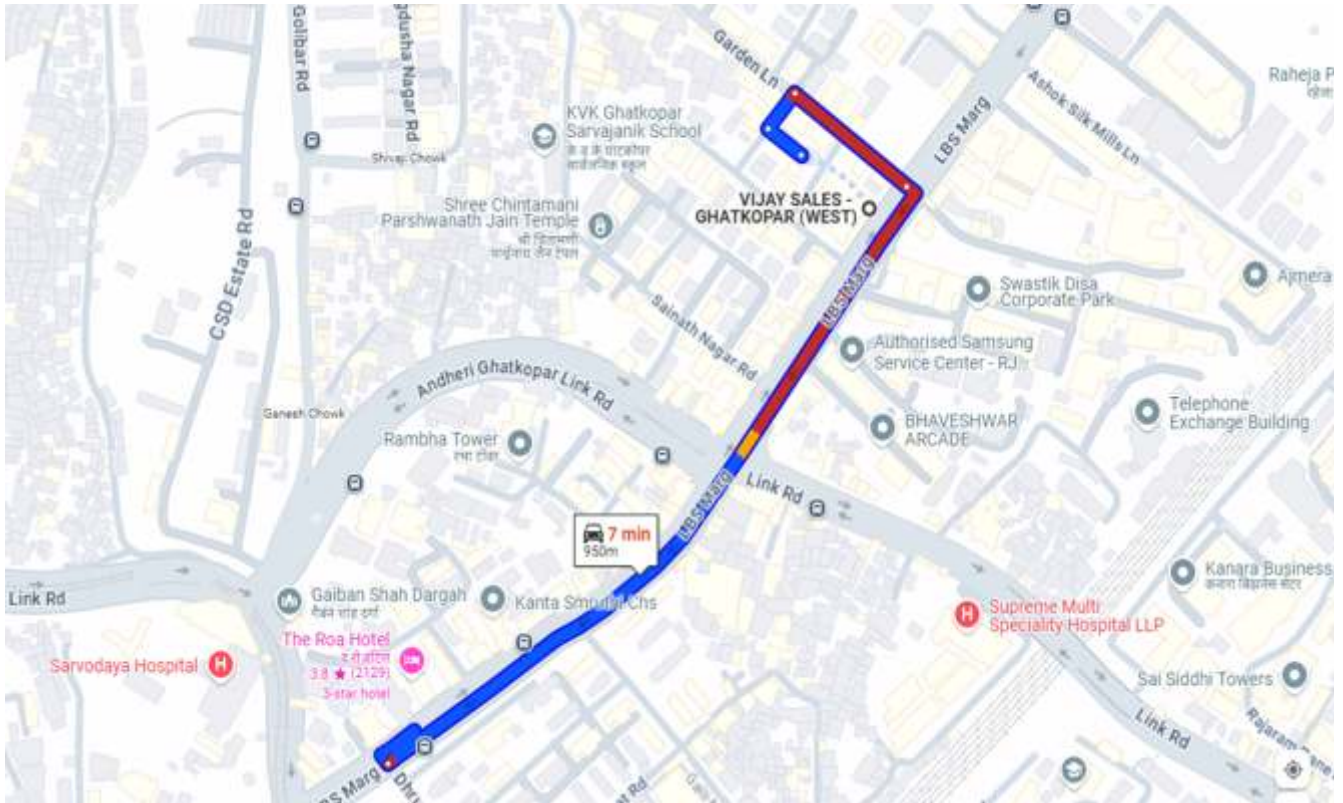

### MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

Your Directors' have pleasure in presenting the management discussion and analysis report of the year ended on 31st March, 2026.

#### 1. Overall & Business Review:

The financial year 2025-26 was a year of progress for Sterling Powergensys Limited, marked by improved operational performance and improved financial results. The Company continued to strengthen its presence in the renewable energy sector by focusing on the sale of solar systems, execution of solar power projects trading activities and is strategically exploring opportunities in emerging clean energy solutions, including Green Hydrogen projects, in line with India's energy transition initiatives.

The renewable energy sector in India continued to witness robust growth during the year, supported by favorable Government policies, increasing investments in clean energy infrastructure and growing adoption of sustainable energy solutions. These developments created a conducive business environment for the Company and enabled it to capitalize on emerging opportunities in the solar energy sector.

During the financial year under review, the Company recorded Revenue from Operations of ₹2,380.05 Lakhs as against ₹1,260.40 Lakhs in the previous year, registering a growth of approximately 88.83%. Total Income increased to ₹2,441.07 Lakhs from ₹1,390.02 Lakhs in FY 2024-25. The Company also reported a significant improvement in profitability, with Profit Before Tax increasing to ₹133.55 Lakhs and Profit After Tax increasing to ₹98.55 Lakhs, reflecting improved operational efficiency, better business volumes and prudent financial management.

The Company remains committed to providing quality products and services while strengthening customer relationships, improving operational efficiency and exploring new business opportunities in the renewable energy sector. Management continues to focus on sustainable growth through efficient execution, cost optimisation and value creation for all stakeholders.

Looking ahead, the management remains optimistic about the Company's future prospects. With India's continued emphasis on renewable energy, increasing demand for solar power solutions and supportive policy initiatives, the Company is well positioned to leverage the opportunities emerging in the sector and achieve sustainable long-term growth.

#### 2. Industry Structure & Development:

The global economy demonstrated resilience during the financial year 2025-26 despite continuing geopolitical tensions, supply chain disruptions and fluctuating commodity prices. Easing inflation across major economies, improved labour market conditions and gradual moderation in monetary tightening contributed to stable global economic growth. The transition towards sustainable development and decarbonisation continued to accelerate worldwide, resulting in increased investments in renewable energy, clean technologies and energy-efficient infrastructure. Governments across developed and emerging economies continued to prioritize energy security and climate commitments, creating favorable conditions for long-term growth in the renewable energy sector.

India continued to remain one of the fastest-growing major economies in the world during FY 2025-26, supported by strong domestic consumption, increased public infrastructure spending, robust manufacturing activity and sustained policy reforms. According to the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI), India's real Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is estimated to have grown by approximately 6.5% during FY 2025-26. Stable macroeconomic fundamentals, increasing private investments and continued emphasis on infrastructure development have further strengthened India's long-term growth outlook.

The Government of India continued to focus on renewable energy as a key pillar of sustainable economic development. Through various policy initiatives and budgetary support, the Government has accelerated investments in clean energy infrastructure, domestic manufacturing and grid modernisation. installed solar capacity, reflecting the rapid pace of expansion in the country's solar sector and reinforcing its commitment towards achieving 500 GW of non-fossil fuel-based installed electricity capacity by 2030.

Green Hydrogen is emerging as one of the key focus areas of India's energy transition strategy. Supported by the National Green Hydrogen Mission, the Government aims to position India as a global hub for the production, utilisation and export of Green Hydrogen. The growing emphasis on decarbonisation across industries is expected to create new opportunities for companies engaged in renewable energy and allied sectors. Sterling Powergensys Limited continues to evaluate opportunities in this emerging segment as part of its long-term business strategy.

The rapid growth of utility-scale solar projects, commercial and industrial captive installations and rooftop solar systems has significantly expanded the addressable market for companies operating in the renewable energy sector. Simultaneously, increasing investments in Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS), smart grid infrastructure, electric mobility and green hydrogen are creating new avenues for growth across the renewable energy value chain.

The domestic solar manufacturing ecosystem also continued to strengthen during the year. Government initiatives encouraging localisation of solar modules, cells and other critical components are expected to reduce import dependence, improve supply chain resilience and enhance India's competitiveness as a global renewable energy manufacturing hub. Increasing participation by private sector enterprises and financial institutions has further accelerated investments in renewable energy infrastructure across the country.

The renewable energy sector continues to benefit from increasing environmental awareness, rising corporate commitments towards sustainability, favourable financing conditions and technological advancements that have improved the efficiency and affordability of solar power solutions. The declining cost of solar technology, coupled with supportive regulatory policies and improved project economics, has made renewable energy one of the most attractive investment sectors in India.

For Sterling Powergensys Limited, these industry developments present significant opportunities for sustainable growth. The Company's core business of supplying solar systems, executing solar power projects and undertaking allied renewable energy activities is well aligned with the country's long-term energy transition objectives. The continued expansion of the renewable energy sector, increasing adoption of solar energy by industrial, commercial and residential consumers and supportive Government initiatives are expected to generate sustained demand for the Company's products and services.

The management remains confident that the favourable industry outlook, coupled with the Company's operational capabilities, customer-focused approach and commitment to quality, will enable Sterling Powergensys Limited to strengthen its market position and capitalise on the growing opportunities in India's renewable energy sector while delivering sustainable value to its stakeholders.

### 3. Opportunities & Threats:

**Opportunities** – The renewable energy sector in India continues to offer significant growth opportunities, driven by favourable Government policies, increasing environmental awareness and rising investments in clean energy infrastructure. The Government's continued focus on achieving 500 GW of non-fossil fuel-based installed electricity capacity by 2030, along with initiatives such as PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana, PM-KUSUM, and the National Green Hydrogen Mission, is expected to create sustained demand for solar energy solutions across residential, commercial and industrial sectors. The increasing adoption of solar power by industries and businesses to reduce energy costs, coupled with growing investments in infrastructure and sustainable development, presents significant opportunities for the Company. The expanding domestic manufacturing ecosystem and technological advancements in solar energy are also expected to support long-term growth. Sterling Powergensys Limited is well positioned to capitalise on these opportunities through its experience in solar systems, project execution and allied renewable energy activities. The Government's continued thrust on Green Hydrogen and other emerging clean energy technologies presents additional opportunities for the Company. Leveraging its experience in the renewable energy sector, the Company intends to explore these evolving opportunities in line with market developments and its long-term strategic objectives.

**Threats:** The renewable energy industry continues to be highly competitive, with increasing participation from established players as well as new entrants. Fluctuations in the prices of solar modules and other key raw materials, changes in Government policies, regulatory approvals, supply chain disruptions and intense pricing competition may impact the Company's operations and profitability. The business is also exposed to risks arising from changes in customer spending patterns, project execution timelines, availability of skilled manpower and evolving technological developments. However, the Company continuously monitors these risks and focuses on operational efficiency, prudent financial management, customer satisfaction and quality execution to minimise their impact and strengthen its competitive position in the market.

**4. Product wise performance:**

The Company is primarily engaged in the business of sale of solar systems, execution of solar power projects and allied renewable energy activities. During the financial year under review, the Company witnessed improvement in business performance. The Company also continued its trading activities, which contributed to its overall business performance.

The renewable energy sector continued to witness strong momentum during the year, providing opportunities for the Company to strengthen its market presence and expand its customer base. The management remains focused on delivering quality products and services while exploring business opportunities.

**5. Outlook:**

The outlook for the renewable energy sector in India remains highly encouraging, supported by the Government's continued focus on clean energy transition, increasing investments in renewable infrastructure and rising adoption of solar power across residential, commercial and industrial segments. With India's commitment to achieve 500 GW of non-fossil fuel-based installed electricity capacity by 2030, the solar energy sector is expected to witness sustained growth in the coming years.

In addition to the growing solar energy market, Green Hydrogen is expected to emerge as a key driver of India's clean energy transition. The Company's strategic focus on evaluating opportunities in this segment is expected to support its long-term growth objectives. While solar energy will continue to remain the Company's primary business focus, the management believes that Green Hydrogen and other emerging clean energy technologies offer significant potential for future business expansion.

Sterling Powergensys Limited is well positioned to benefit from these favourable industry trends. The Company will continue to focus on strengthening its presence in the solar energy sector by enhancing operational efficiency, expanding its customer base and delivering quality products and services. The management also intends to explore emerging opportunities in renewable energy and related businesses while maintaining financial discipline and prudent risk management.

The Company remains committed to creating sustainable value for its stakeholders through customer-centric solutions, technological advancement and continuous improvement in business processes. Backed by a positive industry outlook, supportive Government policies and increasing demand for renewable energy solutions, the management is confident of achieving sustainable growth and improving shareholder value in the years ahead.

**6. Risk and concern:**

Besides the supply chain dynamics for hydrogen and solar power equipments as was discussed in the previous report, the management has also identified certain issues like grid management with unpredictable environments, continuously evolving energy policy and regulations, Increased cyber security risk from expanded infrastructure as the major threats looming over the renewable energy sector however, with increased technological advancements in the distribution sector these threats can be easily overcome in near future. Even though the Company has no control over external factors which may adversely affect the Company's operation. These risk factors are continuously monitored by the management and necessary steps are taken to mitigate them.

**7. Internal Control System and their adequacy:**

The company involved in the renewable energy sector, has an internal control system that is commensurate with its size, scale, and complexity of operations. The company's internal control system is designed to ensure compliance with operating systems, accounting procedures, and policies. The Board of Directors actively monitors and evaluates the efficacy and adequacy of these internal controls, using reports from the internal audit function to identify areas for improvement and implement corrective actions. This approach helps strengthen the company's controls and maintain robust financial reporting practices.

**8. Financial Performance:**

During the year under review, the Company has recorded Total Income of ₹2,441.07 Lakhs, including Other Income, as against Total Income of ₹1,390.02 Lakhs in the previous financial year. The Company has generated a Profit after Tax of ₹98.55 Lakhs for the year ended March 31, 2026, as against a Profit after Tax of ₹18.89 Lakhs in the previous financial year.

**9. Material Development in Human Resources / Industrial Relations:**

Company recognizes the importance of motivated and empowered employees and has a clear employee value proposition focused on employee development, a satisfying work environment, performance appraisal, and appropriate empowerment. Further the Company believes motivated and empowered employees are the cornerstone of competitive advantage. The company has been focusing on building a robust team to support its strategic growth, including its pioneering green hydrogen project. As of recent years, Sterling Powergensys Ltd. has emphasized the importance of human resource

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### 1 Company overview

Sterling Powergensys Limited was incorporated in 22nd October, 1984. It is a BSE listed company and incorporated under the provision of Companies Act, 1956. The company is engaged in the business of manufacturing Industrial Boilers and Thermal Power Plants up to 10 MW and Solar Solutions, both in Solar Products and Solar EPC projects.

### 2 Significant accounting policies

#### 2.1 Basis of preparation

##### (i) Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards ('Ind AS') as per Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (as amended) notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the 'Act') read with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards Rules, 2015; and the other relevant provisions of the Act and Rules there under.

##### (ii) Functional and Presentation Currency

These financial statements are presented in Indian rupees, which is the functional currency of the Company. All financial information presented in Indian rupees has been rounded to the nearest lacs, except otherwise indicated.

##### (iii) Basis of measurement

These Financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise indicated.

##### (iv) Use of Estimates and Judgements

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with Ind AS requires management to use of certain critical accounting estimates, judgements and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known/ materialise. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis.

#### 2.2 Current versus non-current classification

The Company presents assets and liabilities in its Balance Sheet based on current versus non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when it is:

- a) Expected to be realized or intended to sold or consumed in normal operating cycle,
- b) Held primarily for the purpose of trading,
- c) Expected to be realized within twelve months after the reporting period, or
- d) Cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when:

- a) it is expected to be settled in normal operating cycle,
- b) it is held primarily for the purpose of trading,
- c) it is due to be settled within twelve months after the reporting period
- d) there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period.

The Company classifies all other liabilities as non-current. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are classified as non-current assets and liabilities.

#### 2.3 Segment reporting

The main business of the Company is to sale solar systems and all other activities of the Company revolve around the main business. As such there are no reportable segments, as per the IND AS 108 "Operating Segments - Solar systems and Trading in Industrial Goods" specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013.

### 2.4 Foreign Currency Transactions / Translations

In preparing the financial statements of the Company, transactions in currencies other than the Company's functional currency (i.e. foreign currencies) are recognised at the rates of exchange prevailing at the dates of the transactions. At the end of each reporting period, monetary items denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rates prevailing at that date. Non-monetary items carried at fair value that are denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rates prevailing at the date when the fair value was determined. Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rate as at the date of initial transactions.

Exchange differences on monetary items are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss in the period in which they arise.

### 2.5 Revenue

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured, regardless of when the payment is being made. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contractually defined terms of payment and excluding taxes or duties collected on behalf of the government.

The specific recognition criteria described below must also be met before revenue is recognised:

#### **Sale of goods**

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have passed to the buyer. Revenue from the sale of goods is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of returns and allowances, trade discounts and volume rebates.

#### **Income from Services**

Revenues resulting from services rendered by the Company are recognized over the period of the contract as and when services are rendered in accordance with the terms of the underlying contracts. The Company collects service tax / Goods and Service Tax (GST) on behalf of the government and, therefore, it is not an economic benefit flowing to the Company. Hence, it is excluded from revenue.

#### **Interest income**

Revenue is recognized using effective interest rate on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable. Interest income is included under the head "Other income" in the statement of profit & loss.

### 2.6 Income Tax

Income tax expense comprises current tax and deferred tax. It is recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss except to the extent that it relates items recognised directly in equity or in OCI.

#### **Current tax:**

Current tax comprises the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the year and any adjustment to the tax payable or receivable in respect of previous years. It is measured using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

Current tax assets and liabilities are offset only if, the Company:

- i) has a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts; and
- ii) intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

#### **Deferred tax:**

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the amounts used for taxation purposes (including those arising from adjustments such as unrealised profit on inventory etc.).

Deferred tax assets are recognised for unused tax losses, unused tax credits and deductible temporary differences to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which they can be used. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised; such reductions are reversed when the probability of future taxable profits improves.

Unrecognised deferred tax assets are reassessed at each reporting date and recognised to the extent that it has become probable that future taxable profits will be available against which they can be used. Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to be applied to temporary differences when they reverse, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

The measurement of deferred tax reflects the tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the Company expects, at the reporting date, to recover or settle the carrying amount of its assets and liabilities.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset only if:

- i) the Company has a legally enforceable right to set off current tax assets against current tax liabilities; and
- ii) the deferred tax assets and the deferred tax liabilities relate to income taxes levied by the same taxation authority on the same taxable entity.

Minimum Alternate Tax ('MAT') credit entitlement is generally recognised as a deferred tax asset if it is probable (more likely than not) that MAT credit can be used in future years to reduce the regular tax liability.

### 2.7 Impairment of non-financial assets

The carrying values of assets at each balance sheet date are reviewed for impairment if any indication of impairment exists. If the carrying amount of the assets exceed the estimated recoverable amount, an impairment is recognised for such excess amount. The impairment loss is recognised as an expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss, unless the asset is carried at revalued amount, in which case any impairment loss of the revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease to the extent a revaluation reserve is available for that asset.

The recoverable amount is the greater of the net selling price and their value in use. Value in use is arrived at by discounting the future cash flows to their present value based on an appropriate discount rate.

When there is indication that an impairment loss recognised for an asset (other than a revalued asset) in earlier accounting periods no longer exists or may have decreased, such reversal of impairment loss is recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss, to the extent the amount was previously charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss. In case of revalued assets, such reversal is not recognised.

### 2.8 Inventories

Raw materials, components, stores and spares - Lower of cost and net realizable value. However, materials and other items held for use in the production of inventories are not written down below cost if the finished products in which they will be incorporated are expected to be sold at or above cost. Cost is determined on a weighted average basis.

Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less estimated costs of completion and estimated costs necessary to make the sale. Excess and obsolete inventories are fully provided for based on the age and usage pattern of individual items in inventory. Inventory items not consumed in the trailing twelve months are considered obsolete. Management also identifies specific items that may be unusable or obsolete, which are written down regardless of age or usage pattern.

### 2.9 Financial instruments

#### A. Financial Assets

##### Classification

On initial recognition the Company classifies financial assets as subsequently measured at amortised cost, fair value through other comprehensive income or fair value through profit or loss on the basis of its business model for managing the financial assets and the contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial asset.

##### Initial recognition and measurement

All financial assets (not measured subsequently at fair value through profit or loss) are recognised initially at fair value plus transaction costs that are attributable to the acquisition of the financial asset. Purchases or sales of financial assets that require delivery of assets within a time frame established by regulation or convention in the market place (regular way trades) are recognised on the trade date, i.e., the date that the Company commits to purchase or sell the asset.

##### Financial assets at amortised cost

A 'financial asset' is measured at the amortised cost if both the following conditions are met:

- i) the asset is held within a business model whose objective is to hold assets for collecting contractual cash flows, and
- ii) contractual terms of the asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest (SPPI) on the principal amount outstanding.

After initial measurement, such financial assets are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate (EIR) method. Amortised cost is calculated by taking into account any discount or premium and fees or

costs that are an integral part of the EIR. The EIR amortisation is included in finance income in the Statement of Profit and Loss. The losses arising from impairment are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss. This category generally applies to trade and other receivables.

Financial assets included within the fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL) category are measured at fair value with all changes recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

### Derecognition

A financial asset (or, where applicable, a part of a financial asset ) is primarily derecognised (i.e. removed from the Company's financial statements) when:

- The rights to receive cash flows from the asset have expired, or
- The Company has transferred its rights to receive cash flows from the asset or has assumed an obligation to pay the received cash flows in full without material delay to a third party under a 'pass-through' arrangement; and either:
  - i) the Company has transferred substantially all the risks and rewards of the asset, or
  - ii) the Company has neither transferred nor retained substantially all the risks and rewards of the asset, but has transferred control of the asset.

When the Company has transferred its rights to receive cash flows from an asset or has entered into a pass-through arrangement, it evaluates if and to what extent it has retained the risks and rewards of ownership. When it has neither transferred nor retained substantially all of the risks and rewards of the asset, nor transferred control of the asset, the Company continues to recognise the transferred asset to the extent of the Company's continuing involvement. In that case, the Company also recognises an associated liability. The transferred asset and the associated liability are measured on a basis that reflects the rights and obligations that the Company has retained.

### Impairment of financial assets

In accordance with Ind AS 109, the Company applies Expected Credit Loss (ECL) model for measurement and recognition of impairment loss on the following financial assets and credit risk exposure:

- i) financial assets that are debt instruments, and are measured at amortised cost e.g., loans, debt securities deposits, and bank balance.
- ii) trade receivables.

The Company follows 'simplified approach' for recognition of impairment loss allowance on trade receivables which do not contain a significant financing component.

The application of simplified approach does not require the Company to track changes in credit risk. Rather, it recognises impairment loss allowance based on lifetime ECLs at each reporting date, right from its initial recognition.

## B. Financial Liabilities

### Classification

The Company classifies all financial liabilities as subsequently measured at amortised cost, except for financial liabilities measured at fair value through profit or loss. Such liabilities, including derivatives that are liabilities, shall be subsequently measured at fair value with changes in fair value being recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

### Initial recognition and measurement

Financial liabilities are classified, at initial recognition, as financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss, at amortised cost (loans and borrowings, and payables), or as derivatives designated as hedging instruments in an effective hedge, as appropriate.

All financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value and, in the case of loans and borrowings and payables, net of directly attributable transaction costs.

### Financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss

Financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss include financial liabilities held for trading and financial liabilities designated upon initial recognition as at fair value through profit or loss. Financial liabilities are classified as held for trading if they are incurred for the purpose of repurchasing in the near term. This category also includes derivative financial instruments entered into by the Company that are not designated as hedging instruments in hedge

relationships as defined by Ind AS 109. Separated embedded derivatives are also classified as held for trading unless they are designated as effective hedging instruments.

Gains or losses on liabilities held for trading are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss. Financial liabilities designated upon initial recognition at fair value through profit or loss are designated at the initial date of recognition, and only if the criteria in Ind AS 109 are satisfied. For liabilities designated as FVTPL, fair value gains/ losses attributable to changes in own credit risk are recognized in OCI. These gains/loss are not subsequently transferred to Statement of Profit and Loss. However, the Company may transfer the cumulative gain or loss within equity. All other changes in fair value of such liability are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

### Loans and borrowings

After initial recognition, interest-bearing loans and borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the EIR method. Gains and losses are recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss when the liabilities are derecognised.

Amortised cost is calculated by taking into account any discount or premium on acquisition and fees or costs that are an integral part of the EIR. The EIR amortisation is included as finance costs in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

This category generally applies to interest-bearing loans and borrowings.

### Derecognition

A financial liability is derecognised when the obligation under the liability is discharged or cancelled or expires. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as the derecognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability.

The difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

### Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the balance sheet if there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

### Derivative financial instruments

The Company holds derivative financial instruments such as foreign exchange forward and option contracts to mitigate the risk of changes in exchange rates on foreign currency exposures. The counterparty for these contracts is generally a bank.

Such derivative financial instruments are initially recognised at fair value on the date on which a derivative contract is entered into and are subsequently re-measured at fair value. Derivatives are carried as financial assets when the fair value is positive and as financial liabilities when the fair value is negative.

The purchase contracts that meet the definition of a derivative under Ind AS 109 are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

## 2.10 Property, Plant and Equipment

### Recognition and Measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment comprises:

- its purchase price, including import duties and non-refundable purchase taxes, after deducting trade discounts and rebates.
- any costs directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by Management.
- the initial estimate of the costs of dismantling and removing the item and restoring the site on which it is located, the obligation for which the Company incurs either when the item is acquired or as a consequence of having used the item during a particular period for purposes other than to produce Inventories during that period.
- income and expenses related to the incidental operations, not necessary to bring the item to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management, are recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss. If significant parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, then they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

The Company has elected to continue with the carrying value of all its property, plant and equipment as recognized in the financial statements as at the date of transition to Ind AS, measured as per the previous GAAP and use that as the deemed cost as at the transition date pursuant to the exemption under Ind AS 101.

Any gain or loss on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss.

Capital work-in-progress in respect of assets which are not ready for their intended use are carried at cost, comprising of direct costs, related incidental expenses and attributable interest.

Subsequent Expenditure:

Subsequent expenditure is capitalised only if it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the expenditure will flow to the Company.

Depreciation:

The Company is providing depreciation based on straight line method at rate based on useful life of assets as prescribed in the Companies Act, 2013.

Further, Schedule II allows Companies to use higher/lower useful lives and residual values if such useful lives and residual values can be technically supported and justification for difference is disclosed in the financial statements. The management believes that depreciation rates currently used fairly reflect its estimate of the useful lives and residual values of fixed assets.

Depreciation method, useful live and residual values are reviewed at each financial year end and adjusted if appropriate. Depreciation on additions (disposals) is provided on a pro-rata basis i.e. from (upto) the date on which asset is ready for use (disposed of).

### 2.11 Intangible assets

Recognition and measurement

Intangible assets are carried at cost less accumulated amortisation and impairment losses, if any. The cost of an intangible asset comprises of its purchase price, including any import duties and other taxes (other than those subsequently recoverable from the taxing authorities), and any directly attributable expenditure on making the asset ready for its intended use.

The Company has elected to continue with the carrying value of all its intangible assets as recognized in the standalone financial statements as at the date of transition to Ind AS, measured as per the previous GAAP and use that as the deemed cost as at the transition date pursuant to the exemption under Ind AS 101.

Subsequent Expenditure

Subsequent expenditure is capitalised only if it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the expenditure will flow to the Company.

Amortisation methods and periods

Research and development costs

Research costs are expensed as incurred. Development expenditures on an individual project are recognised as an intangible asset when the Company can demonstrate:

- The technical feasibility of completing the intangible asset so that the asset will be available for use or sale
- Its intention to complete and its ability and intention to use or sell the asset
- How the asset will generate future economic benefits
- The availability of resources to complete the asset
- The ability to measure reliably the expenditure during development

Following initial recognition of the development expenditure as an asset, the asset is carried at cost less any accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment losses. Amortisation of the asset begins when development is complete and the asset is available for use. It is amortised over the period of expected future sales from the related project, not exceeding ten years. Amortisation expense is recognised in the statement of profit and loss unless such expenditure forms part of carrying value of another asset.

During the period of development, the asset is tested for impairment annually.

### 2.12 Provisions and contingent liabilities

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. If effect of the time value of money is material, provisions are discounted using an appropriate discount rate that reflects, when appropriate, the risks specific to the liability. When discounting is used, the increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognised as a finance cost.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed in the Notes to the financial statements. Contingent liabilities are disclosed for:

- i) possible obligations which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of the Company or
- ii) present obligations arising from past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.

### 2.13 Employee Benefits

#### Short-term obligations

Short-term employee benefits are expensed as the related service is provided. A liability is recognised for the amount expected to be paid if the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation to pay this amount as a result of past service provided by the employee and the obligation can be estimated reliably.

#### Post-employment obligations

The Company operates the following post-employment schemes:

- (a) defined benefit plans such as gratuity; and
- (b) defined contribution plans such as provident fund.

#### Defined Benefit Plans

The Company's net obligation in respect of defined benefit plans is calculated separately for each plan by estimating the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in the current and prior periods, discounting that amount and deducting the fair value of any plan assets.

Remeasurement of the net defined benefit liability, which comprise actuarial gains and losses and the return on plan assets (excluding interest) and the effect of the asset ceiling (if any, excluding interest), are recognised immediately in other comprehensive income (OCI). Net interest expense (income) on the net defined liability (assets) is computed by applying the discount rate, used to measure the net defined liability (asset). Net interest expense and other expenses related to defined benefit plans are recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss. When the benefits of a plan are changed or when a plan is curtailed, the resulting change in benefit that relates to past service or the gain or loss on curtailment is recognised immediately in Statement of Profit and Loss. The Company recognises gains and losses on the settlement of a defined benefit plan when the settlement occurs.

#### Defined contribution plan

Obligations for contributions to defined contribution plans are expensed as the related service is provided and the Company will have no legal or constructive obligation to pay further amounts. Prepaid contributions are recognised as an asset to the extent that a cash refund or a reduction in future payments is available.

#### Termination benefits

Termination benefits are recognised as an expense when the Company is demonstrably committed, without realistic possibility of withdrawal, to a formal detailed plan to either terminate employment before the normal retirement date, or to provide termination benefits as a result of an offer made to encourage voluntary redundancy. Termination benefits for voluntary redundancies are recognised as an expense if the Company has made an offer encouraging voluntary redundancy, it is probable that the offer will be accepted, and the number of acceptances can be estimated reliably.

#### Other long-term employee benefit obligations

The Company's current policies permit certain categories of its employees to accumulate and carry forward a portion of their unutilised compensated absences and utilise them in future periods or receive cash in lieu thereof in accordance with the terms of such policies.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Company measures the expected cost of accumulating compensated absences as the additional amount that the Company incurs as a result of the unused entitlement that has accumulated at the balance sheet date. Such measurement is based on actuarial valuation as at the balance sheet date carried out by a qualified actuary.

### 2.14 Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. The weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year is adjusted for the events for bonus issue, bonus element in a rights issue to existing shareholders, share split and reverse share split (consolidation of shares).

Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax as adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges to expense or income (net of any attributable taxes) relating to the dilutive potential equity shares, by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share and the weighted average number of equity shares which could have been issued on conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

### 2.15 Operating cycle

Based on the nature of products / activities of the Company and the normal time between acquisition of assets and their realization in cash or cash equivalents, the Company has determined its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of classification of its assets and liabilities as current and non-current.

### 2.16 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, bank balances and any deposits with original maturities of three months or less (that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and cash equivalents and subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value). However, for the purpose of the statement of cash flows, in addition to above items, any bank overdrafts / cash credits that are integral part of the Company's cash management, are also included as a component of cash and cash equivalents.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### 37 FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The Company has exposure to the following risks arising from financial instruments:

- Credit risk;
- Market risk; and
- Liquidity risk

The Company's Board of Directors has overall responsibility for the establishment and oversight of the Company's risk management framework. The Board of Directors along with the top management are responsible for developing and monitoring the Company's risk management policies.

The Company's risk management policies are established to identify and analyse the risks faced by the Company, to set appropriate risk limits and controls and to monitor risks and adherence to limits. Risk management policies and systems are monitored & reviewed periodically to reflect changes in market conditions and the Company's activities. The Company, through its training, standards and procedures, aims to maintain a disciplined and constructive control environment in which all employees understand their roles and obligations. The key risks and mitigating actions are placed before management of the Company who then evaluates and takes the necessary corrective action.

#### [A] Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk of financial loss to the Company if a customer or counterparty to a financial instruments fails to meet its contractual obligations, and arises principally from the Company's receivables from customers, cash and cash equivalents, deposits with banks and other financial instruments measured at amortised cost.

The carrying amounts of financial assets represents maximum credit risk exposure. Credit risk is managed through credit approvals, establishing credit limits and continuously monitoring the creditworthiness of customers to which the Company grants credit terms in the normal course of business. The Company establishes an allowance for doubtful debts and impairment that represents its estimate of incurred losses in respect of trade and other receivables and deposits.

However, the credit risk arising on cash and cash equivalents and bank deposits is limited as the Company invest in deposits with banks and financial institution with credit ratings and strong repayment capacity.

#### Trade receivables

The Company's exposure to credit risk is influenced mainly by the individual characteristics of each customer. The demographics of the customer, including the default risk of the industry and country in which the customer operates, also has an influence on credit risk assessment. Credit risk is managed through credit approvals, establishing credit limits and continuously monitoring the creditworthiness of customers to which the Company grants credit terms in the normal course of business.

#### Expected credit loss assessment

The Company allocates each exposure to a credit risk grade based on a variety of data that is determined to be predictive of the risk of loss (e.g. timeliness of payments, available press information etc.) and applying experienced credit judgement.

Exposures to customers outstanding at the end of each reporting period are reviewed by the Company to determine incurred and expected credit losses. Historical trends of impairment of trade receivables do not reflect any significant credit losses. Given that the macroeconomic indicators affecting customers of the Company have not undergone any substantial change, the Company expects the historical trend of minimal credit losses to continue.

#### Cash and cash equivalent

As at the year end, the Company held cash and cash equivalents of Rs. 1,07,703/- (31.03.2024 - Rs. 50,28,409/-). The cash and cash equivalents are held with banks with good credit rating.

#### Other bank balances

Other bank balances are held with banks with good credit rating.

#### Investments

The Company limits its exposure to credit risk by generally investing in fixed deposits of counterparties that have a good credit rating. The Company does not expect any losses from non-performance by these counter-parties.

#### Other financial assets

Other financial assets are neither past due nor impaired.

#### [B] Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Company will encounter difficulty in meeting the obligations associated with its financial liabilities that are settled by delivering cash or another financial asset. The Company's approach to managing liquidity is to ensure, as far as possible, that it will have sufficient liquidity to meet its liabilities when they are due, under both normal and stressed conditions, without incurring unacceptable losses or risking damage to the Company's reputation.

The Company regularly monitors the rolling forecasts to ensure it has sufficient cash on an on-going basis to meet operational needs. The Company has obtained fund and non-fund based working capital lines from various banks. Any short term surplus cash generated, over and above the amount required for working capital management and other operational requirements, is retained as cash and cash equivalents (to the extent required) and any excess is invested in interest bearing term deposits with appropriate maturities to optimise the cash returns on investments while ensuring sufficient liquidity to meet its liabilities.

#### [C] Market risk

Market risk is the risk that changes in market prices – such as foreign exchange rates and equity prices – will affect the Company's income or the value of its holdings of financial instruments. The Company is exposed to market risk primarily related to foreign exchange rate risk. Thus, our exposure to market risk is a function of revenue generating and operating activities in foreign currency. The objective of market risk management is to avoid excessive exposure in our foreign currency revenues and costs.

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### (i) Interest rate risk

The Company's main interest rate risk arises from long-term borrowings with variable rates, which expose the Company to cash flow interest rate risk. During the year ended March 31, 2026 and March 31, 2025 the Company's borrowings at variable rate were mainly denominated in Indian rupees.

### (B) FAIR VALUE HEIRARCHY

Fair value is the amount for which an asset could be exchanged, or a liability settled between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction. Level 3: If one or more of the significant inputs is not based on the observable market data, the instrument is included in Level 3 hierarchy.

### (C) VALUATION TECHNIQUES

- the use of quoted market prices for mutual funds
- the use of quoted market prices for equity instruments

### 38 CAPITAL MANAGEMENT
