### Opinion

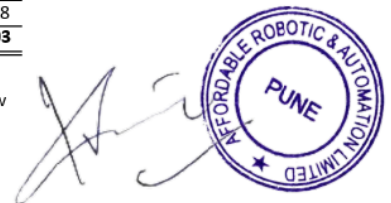

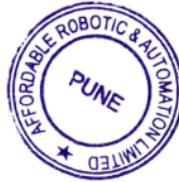

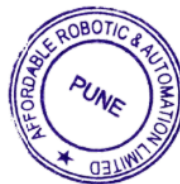
