Opinion

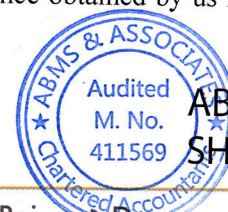
We have audited the standalone financial result of Uniinfo Telecom Services Limited ("the company") for the year ended March 31, 2026, the standalone statement of assets and liabilities and standalone statement of cash flows as at and for the year ended on that date which are included in the accompanying 'Standalone Statement of Financial Results for the quarter and year ended March 31', 2026', together with notes thereon, attached herewith (hereinafter referred to as the "Standalone Financial Result") being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of SEBI (Listing obligation and Disclosure Requirement) Regulations, 2015 as amended (the "Listing Regulation")

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, these standalone financial results:

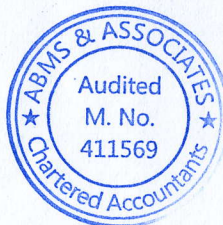
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Notes:

1. The above Audited Standalone Financial Results of the Company for the Quarter and year ended on March 31, 2026 have been taken on records by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting held on May 30, 2026. The information presented above is extracted from the audited standalone financial results in terms of Regulation 33 of the Securities Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosures Requirements) Regulations, 2015.
2. These financial results are prepared in compliance with Indian Accounting Standards ("IND-AS") as notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") [Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015) as amended and regulation 33 of SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.
3. The quarterly financial results for the period ended March 31, 2026 are the derived figures between the audited figures in respect of the year ended March 31, 2026 and the published year-to-date figures up to December 31, 2025, being the date of the end of the third quarter of the current financial year, which were subjected to limited review as required under Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulation, 2015
4. The Company has only one reportable business segment i.e. Installation, Commissioning, Testing Activities in respect of Telecom & EVs based on guiding principles given in Ind AS 108 "Operating Segments" notified pursuant to Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015. Accordingly, the disclosure requirements as per Ind AS 108 are not applicable.
5. Figures for the previous periods / year have been rearranged / re-grouped, wherever considered necessary to correspond with the figures of the current period / year. All figures of financials have been rounded off to the nearest Lakhs rupees.
- 5 On November 21, 2025, the Government of India notified four Labour Codes - the Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020 and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 - consolidating 29 existing labour laws. The Ministry of Labour & Employment published draft Central Rules and FAQs to enable assessment of the financial Impact due to changes in the regulations. In accordance with Ind AS 19 - Employee benefits, changes to employee benefit plans arising from legislative amendments are treated as plan amendments, requiring immediate recognition of past service cost in the Statement of Profit and Loss. This approach is consistent with the guidance issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. The Company has assessed the Incremental Impact of these changes on the basis the best Information available, consistent with the guidance provided by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and has worked out as Rs. 51.79 Lakh financial Impact. The same treated as "Exceptional item" under statement of financial result. The Company continues to monitor the finalisation of Central/ State Rules and clarifications from the Government on other aspects of the Labour Code and would take appropriate steps as required.

2. These financial results are prepared in compliance with Indian Accounting Standards ("IND-AS") as notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") [Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015) as amended and regulation 33 of SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015
3. The above Statement includes the results of Foreign Wholly-Owned Subsidiaries:
 - (a) UniInfo Telecom Services (Private) Limited – Sri-Lanka
 - (b) Uniinfo Technologies QFZ LLC – Qatar
4. The Company has only one reportable business segment i.e. Installation, Commissioning, Testing Activities in respect of Telecom &, EVs based on guiding principles given in Ind AS 108 "Operating Segments" notified pursuant to Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015. Accordingly, the disclosure requirements as per Ind AS 108 are not applicable.
5. Figures for the previous periods / year have been rearranged / re-grouped, wherever considered necessary to correspond with the figures of the current period / year. All figures of financials have been rounded off to the nearest Lakhs rupees.
6. On November 21, 2025, the Government of India notified four Labour Codes - the Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020 and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 - consolidating 29 existing labour laws. The Ministry of Labour & Employment published draft Central Rules and FAQs to enable assessment of the financial Impact due to changes in the regulations. In accordance with Ind AS 19 - Employee benefits, changes to employee benefit plans arising from legislative amendments are treated as plan amendments, requiring immediate recognition of past service cost in the Statement of Profit and Loss. This approach is consistent with the guidance issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. The Company has assessed the Incremental Impact of these changes on the basis the best Information available, consistent with the guidance provided by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and has worked out as Rs. 51.79 Lakh financial Impact. The same treated as "Exceptional item" under statement of financial result. The Company continues to monitor the finalisation of Central/ State Rules and clarifications from the Government on other aspects of the Labour Code and would take appropriate steps as required.
7. For the year and quarter ended 31ST March 2026, there is no material difference between the standalone and consolidated financial results of the Company. The wholly-owned subsidiaries of the Company did not undertake any significant business operations during the period under review and accordingly did not have any material impact on the consolidated financial results.



Pursuant to the Group's internal restructuring initiatives, management is undertaking the necessary actions in relation to certain inactive subsidiaries in accordance with applicable legal and regulatory requirements. Such actions do not have any material impact on the consolidated financial results for the period under review.
