O R D E R

1. Delay condoned.
2. During the pendency of these Special Leave Petitions, the parties have arrived at an amicable settlement. As per the Agreement, the petitioner - Sahyadri Shikshan Sanstha shall pay an amount of Rs. 1,30,00,000/- (Rupees One Crore Thirty Lakhs) to Respondent No. 3 in six equal installments within a period of six

months from today in full and final settlement of the disputes.

3. Mr. Uday B Dube, learned senior counsel submits that his clients will make an application for grant of relief under Section 89 of the Income Tax Act, 1961. If such an application is made, the authorities may consider and dispose it of in accordance with law.

4. With these clarifications, the Special Leave Petitions stand disposed of.
