This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts giving rise to present IA (re-filing) are that the Appellant e-filed the Memo of Appeal on 28.04.2026. The Office after scrutiny of the Memo of Appeal on 02.05.2026, intimated the defects to the Appellant on the same day. The Appellant re-filed the Appeal on 18.06.2026. It is stated in the IA that delay in re-filing is owing to voluminous nature of the Appeal, which required detailed restructuring and recompilation of records, re-pagination, cross-referencing of annexures and curing deficiencies pertaining to documents. Getting the clear copies of some documents also took time. The Appellant is based in a different State and handover, and co-ordination of the documents caused some inadvertent delay. Some additional delay occurred due to intervening summer vacation. Hence, there is delay of 40 days in re-filing the Memo of Appeal, so the same may be condoned.

Heard learned Counsel appearing for the Appellant and perused the averments made in the IA as well as Office report.

The Appellant was required to re-file the Memo of Appeal within seven days from the date of intimation of the defects. However, the Appellant re-filed the Memo of Appeal with a delay of 40 days, hence, the case may be placed before the Hon'ble Bench with defect for appropriate orders.
