UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1. Heard Ms. Vanshaja Shukla, learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and Mr. Shailesh Madiyal, learned senior counsel appearing for the respondent(s).

2. The present Special Leave Petition arises out of the

interlocutory application seeking temporary injunction in a suit for defamation. The Trial Court by its order dated 04.04.2024 granted an order of injunction, which order came to be affirmed by the High Court by the order impugned before us.

3. Having considered the matter in detail, we are of the opinion that instead of interfering with the interim order pending disposal of the Suit, a direction to the Trial Court to take up and dispose of the Suit expeditiously will enure to the benefit of both the parties

4. In view of the above, we dispose of the present Special Leave Petition with a direction that the Original Suit No. 2885 of 2023 pending before the XV Addl. City Civil & Sessions Judge, Bengaluru be taken up and disposed of as expeditiously as possible preferably within a period of six months from today.

5. All question of law and facts are kept open for both the parties to raise and contest before the Trial Court. We also make it clear that the observations made by the High Court or even the Trial Court will have no bearing in determination of the suit.

6. With these directions, the Special Leave Petition stands disposed of.

7. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
