1. Affidavit of service filed in Court today is taken on record.

2. The writ petitioner alleges inaction on the part of the respondent CESC Authorities in effecting electricity supply in favour of the petitioner.

3. Learned Advocate for the respondent CESC Authorities submits that the CESC Authorities are ready and willing to effect electricity supply in favour of the petitioner. However, they could not effect supply since resistance was offered by the private respondent.

4. The private respondent is represented by Mr. Singh.

5. Learned Advocate appearing for the private respondent submits that the petitioner is already enjoying electricity supply.

6. Such fact is refuted by the petitioner.

7. Since the petitioner is otherwise entitled to electricity supply as has been submitted by the CESC Authorities, an objection to such supply by the private respondent cannot be entertained.

8. Accordingly, the CESC Authorities are directed to effect electricity supply in favour of the petitioner with a period of two weeks from the petitioner complying with all necessary formalities, if any.

9. In case, any resistance is offered by the private respondent, the CESC Authorities will be entitled to approach the Officer-in-Charge, Dumdum Police Station for police assistance. If the Officer-in-Charge, Dumdum Police Station is approached by the CESC Authorities, the said Officer-in-Charge would afford adequate police assistance to the CESC Authorities to enable the CESC Authorities to effect electricity supply in favour of the petitioner. Costs of such police assistance would be borne by the petitioner.

10. Effecting electricity supply in favour of the petitioner would not create any special equity or right in favour of the petitioner.

11. WPA 22046 of 2026 stands disposed of with the above observations. No costs.
