The relevant statement pursuant to the provisions of Section 102 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') read with Section 110 of the Act and Rule 22 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 ('Rules'), each as amended, setting out the material facts relating to the aforesaid Resolutions and the reasons thereof is annexed hereto and forms part of this Notice.
2. In compliance with General Circular No. 09/2024 dated September 19, 2024, issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) and Circular issued by SEBI vide Circular No. SEBI/HO/CFD/CFDPoD-2/P/CIR/2024/133 dated October 3, 2024 ("SEBI Circular"), other applicable circulars and notifications issued (including any statutory modifications or reenactment thereof) for the time being in force and as amended from time to time and the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("Act"), SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ("SEBI Listing Regulations"), the 13th Annual General Meeting ("AGM") of the Company is being held through VC/OAVM without the physical presence of Members at a common venue. 3. This AGM is being held through VC / OAVM pursuant to MCA Circulars, physical attendance of the Members has been dispensed with. **Accordingly, the facility for appointment of proxies by the Members will not be available for the AGM and hence the Proxy Form, Attendance Slip and Route Map are not annexed to this Notice.** Members have to attend and participate in the ensuing AGM through VC/OAVM. However, the Body Corporates are entitled to appoint Authorised representatives to attend the AGM through VC/OAVM and participate there at and cast their votes through e-voting.
4. Members of the Company under the category of 'Institutional Investors' are encouraged to attend and vote at the AGM through VC. - Structure, composition, and role clarity of the Board and Committees;

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

1. Economic Overview

The financial year 2025-26 was marked by steady economic activity along with changes in input costs, consumer buying patterns and market conditions. During the year, demand for products relating to agriculture, animal nutrition, Ayurveda, feminine hygiene, personal care, Books & Stationery and household requirements remained reasonably encouraging.

The increasing awareness among consumers and farmers about health, wellness, sustainable agriculture, hygiene and the use of natural products continued to create opportunities for businesses operating in these areas. At the same time, competition, price sensitivity and fluctuations in input and transportation costs remained areas requiring close attention.

- **Organic Fertilizers:** The market for organic fertilizers continued to develop as farmers became more conscious of soil health and the long-term impact of excessive use of chemical inputs. Awareness relating to sustainable farming practices and organic cultivation also helped in creating demand for organic agricultural products. The Company continued its efforts to make such products available through its distribution network.
- **Animal Food Supplements / Feed:** The poultry, dairy and aquaculture sectors continued to require quality feed supplements and nutritional products. Farmers and commercial operators are increasingly paying attention to animal health, productivity and disease prevention, creating demand for probiotics, protein supplements, mineral mixtures, enzymes and other nutritional supplements. However, customers continued to remain price conscious and input costs remained an important factor affecting the business.
- **Ayurvedic Medicines & Herbal Cosmetics / Personal Care:** There was continued interest in Ayurvedic and herbal products during the year. Consumers are increasingly looking at natural and herbal alternatives for healthcare, personal care and wellness requirements. The availability of such products through online platforms and modern retail channels has also made them more accessible to a wider customer base.
- **Sanitary / Feminine Hygiene Products:** Growing awareness relating to menstrual health and hygiene, supported by government and non-government initiatives, continued to expand the addressable market for sanitary pads and related hygiene products, particularly across semi-urban and rural markets.
- **Books and Stationery:** Demand for books and stationery products, including writing instruments, guides, bags, T-shirts, notebooks and other related items, remained steady during the year. The increasing reach of online retail channels and continued consumer demand for reading, writing and related products supported the overall market.
- **Homecare Products:** The Company also sees opportunities in herbal and eco-friendly homecare products. Consumers are gradually becoming more conscious about the ingredients used in household products and are showing interest in products perceived to be safer and environmentally friendly.

2. Industry Structure and Developments:

Agriculture (Organic Fertilizers & Animal Feed Supplements):

The agricultural input market remains closely linked with farming activity, weather conditions and the purchasing capacity of farmers. During the year, the interest in products relating to soil improvement and sustainable agriculture remained positive.

The animal nutrition market also continued to develop with greater emphasis on livestock health and productivity. The increasing scale of poultry, dairy and aquaculture operations provides opportunities for suppliers and distributors of specialised feed supplements.

Health & Beauty (Ayurvedic Medicines & Herbal Cosmetics):

The Ayurvedic and herbal products industry continues to receive attention from consumers looking for traditional and natural wellness solutions. Increased awareness, availability through e-commerce platforms and wider acceptance of herbal products have helped the industry reach customers beyond traditional markets.

Herbal cosmetics and personal care products also continued to find acceptance, particularly among consumers looking for natural ingredients and products suitable for regular use.

Hygiene (Sanitary Pad):

The feminine hygiene products industry continues to benefit from rising awareness and improving accessibility across retail and digital channels. The segment remains price sensitive, particularly in rural and semi-urban markets, and continues to require consistent quality and affordability.

Books and Stationery:

The books segment continues to be supported by steady demand for a diverse range of book titles, catering to general reading and various consumer preferences. Online retail channels are increasingly supplementing traditional methods of book distribution and sales.

Homecare Products:

The homecare market remains competitive, but there is a growing segment of customers looking for herbal, plant-based and environmentally conscious products. The Company believes that this segment provides scope for introducing suitable products over a period of time.

3. Opportunities and Threats:

The Company's business operates in markets where there is scope for growth as well as considerable competition. The major opportunities and challenges during the year were as follows:

Opportunities:

- Expanding rural penetration through direct selling and digital platforms
- Government subsidies and schemes promoting organic farming and menstrual hygiene awareness
- Increasing export potential for Ayurvedic and herbal products
- Rising consumer preference for chemical-free and eco-safe homecare products

- Growing demand for affordable, quality sanitary and hygiene products in semi-urban and rural markets
- Steady institutional and retail demand for books and Other material

Threats:

- Intense competition from organized and unorganized players
- Price sensitivity in rural markets
- Seasonal dependence of agriculture on monsoon patterns
- Regulatory changes affecting labeling and export compliance

4. Business Performance — FY 2025-26

During FY 2025-26, the Company continued to focus on its existing business activities while working towards strengthening its distribution network and improving market reach across all its product categories. Efforts were also made to improve the product mix and identify opportunities in the areas of agriculture, animal nutrition, Ayurveda, herbal products, sanitary and hygiene products, books, personal care and homecare.

The Company continued to give importance to product availability, customer relationships and expansion of its distribution channels. The management also remained focused on controlling operating costs and improving the overall efficiency of the business.

- Total revenue for FY 2025-26 stood at Rs. 15,520.40 (in lakhs), as compared to Rs. 15,512.95 (in lakhs) in FY 2024-25.
- Net profit after tax (PAT) stood at Rs. 105.39 (in lakhs) as compared to Rs. 331.79 (in lakhs) in FY 2024-25.

5. Segmental Review:

In accordance with the requirement of Segment Reporting under Ind AS 108 - 'Operating Segments', the Company has identified Animal Food Products, Ayurvedic Product, Sanitary Pad, Agriculture Product, Books and Other as its reportable segments, with the remaining items being included under the Unallocable segment.

A. Agriculture Product (Organic Fertilizers – Trading)

The Company continued its trading activities in organic fertilizers during the year. Demand was influenced by farming cycles, awareness regarding soil health and the availability of agricultural inputs.

The segment continues to have good potential, although the business remains seasonal and is affected by monsoon conditions and the purchasing capacity of farmers.

During the year, the Company continued to work on improving product availability, supplier coordination and quality checks. Efforts were also made to rationalise products wherever necessary and improve the efficiency of the distribution network.

B. Animal Food Products (Trading & Distribution)

The animal food supplement business continued to receive demand from poultry, dairy and aquaculture customers. Increased attention towards animal health, nutrition and productivity remains a positive factor for the segment.

The business, however, continues to face pressure from fluctuations in feed-related commodity prices and transportation costs.

C. Ayurvedic Product (Ayurvedic Medicines & Herbal Therapeutics – Trading/Distribution)

The Company's Ayurvedic and herbal product business continued to benefit from increasing consumer awareness regarding traditional and natural healthcare products.

The segment requires continuous attention to product quality, regulatory requirements, documentation and compliance. The Company therefore continued to work with suitable suppliers and manufacturing partners and maintained focus on quality and regulatory matters.

The Company also sees scope for increasing sales through online channels and by developing products having wider consumer acceptance.

D. Sanitary Pad (Trading & Distribution)

The Company continued its trading and distribution activities in the sanitary pad / feminine hygiene category during the year. Demand continued to be supported by increasing awareness of menstrual hygiene, particularly in rural and semi-urban markets.

The segment remains price sensitive and competitive, with continued focus required on product quality, affordability and expansion of retail and institutional reach.

E. Books and Stationery (Trading & Distribution)

The Company continued its trading activities relating to books, bags, T-shirts, writing Instruments and other stationary items during the year, catering to demand from retail customers, students and institutional buyers.

The segment continues to be influenced by academic cycles and the increasing shift of book sales towards online retail channels, which the Company continues to leverage for wider reach.

F. Other (including Herbal Cosmetics, Food and Nutraceutical, Hygienic and Personal Care Products, Household Chemicals)

The Company continued its activities in herbal cosmetics, personal care, nutraceutical, hygienic and household product categories, which along with other residual product lines are reported under the 'Other' segment.

Demand for natural and herbal products, particularly in personal care, remains encouraging. At the same time, the segment is highly competitive and requires regular investment in product development, packaging, promotion and market development.

6. Risk Management

Key risks identified and mitigation measures:

- **Raw material & commodity price risk:** Long-term supplier contracts, dynamic pricing clauses, and pass-through mechanisms.
- **Regulatory & compliance risk (AYUSH/pharma, cosmetic and hygiene product claims):** Strengthened regulatory team, compliance audits, and product registration pipelines.
- **Quality & reputation risk:** Enhanced QC labs, third-party testing and supplier onboarding standards.
- **Concentration risk:** Diversification across suppliers, customers, segments and geographies; focus on expanding retail and digital channels to reduce single-account dependency.
- **Climate & supply chain risk:** Contingency sourcing, warehousing strategy, and route optimisation.

7. Sustainability, ESG & Corporate Social Responsibility

The Company recognises the importance of responsible business practices and continues to consider environmental and social aspects in its business activities.

The Company remains focused on sourcing products and raw materials responsibly and promoting products relating to organic agriculture, herbal wellness, menstrual hygiene and natural alternatives wherever commercially appropriate.

Efforts are also made to minimise unnecessary wastage and encourage responsible handling of packaging and other materials.

From a social perspective, the Company's activities in the agriculture, hygiene and wellness segments provide an opportunity to create awareness regarding soil health, sustainable farming, animal nutrition, menstrual hygiene and traditional wellness practices.

The Company also continues to maintain appropriate governance and compliance practices in its dealings with suppliers, customers and other stakeholders.

8. Outlook & Strategy for FY 2026-27

The management remains cautiously positive about the medium- to long-term prospects of the Company's business.

Demand for organic agricultural inputs, animal nutrition products, Ayurvedic medicines, herbal products, sanitary and hygiene products, books and natural personal care products is expected to remain supported by changing consumer and customer preferences.

During FY 2026-27, the Company proposes to focus on the following areas:

- Strengthening its distribution and dealer network.
- Improving market penetration in rural and semi-urban areas.
- Expanding the range of products having regular market demand across all reportable segments.
- Increasing use of digital and e-commerce channels.
- Developing B2B and institutional business opportunities, including for the Books and Sanitary Pad segments.

9. Internal Controls / Corporate Governance

Management continues to maintain robust internal control systems. There were periodic internal audits during the year; no material weaknesses affecting financial reporting were identified.

The Company continues to comply with the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, SEBI LODR Regulations, Ind AS 108 – Operating Segments, and other statutory requirements applicable to it. Necessary disclosures relating to related-party transactions and segment reporting are made as required under the applicable laws and regulations.

10. Key Financial Ratios

In accordance with the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosures Requirements) Regulations 2018 (Amendment) Regulations, 2018, the Company is required to give details of significant changes (change of 25% or more as compared to the immediately previous financial year) in Key sector specific financial ratios. In this regard, the Company has significant changes in key sector specific financial ratios is described in the Financial Statement of this Annual Report.

(c) Terms of reference and Powers of the committee inter alia, includes the following:

Terms of Reference and role of the NRC cover the matters specified in SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015 and Section 178 of the Companies Act, 2013 as amended from time to time, which, inter alia, includes the following:

- Formulation of the criteria for determining qualifications, positive attributes and independence of a director and recommend to the board of directors a policy relating to the remuneration of the directors, key managerial personnel and other employees.

 1. Qualification, expertise and experience of the Directors in their respective fields;
 2. Personal, Professional or business standing;
 3. Diversity of the Board.
- e. Board of Directors take into consideration the performance evaluation of the Directors and their engagement level.

2) Criteria for Selection of KMP / Senior Management:

- a. NRC ensures that the candidate possesses the required qualifications, experience, skills & expertise to effectively discharge their duties and responsibilities.
- b. NRC considers the practice and encourages professionalism and transparent working environment.
- c. NRC considers to build teams and carry the team members along for achieving the goals / objectives and corporate mission.

3) Remuneration:

A. Remuneration to Executive Directors and KMP:

- i) The Board, on the recommendation of the NRC, shall review and approve the remuneration payable to the Executive Directors of the Company within the overall limits approved by the shareholders.
- ii) The Board, on the recommendation of the NRC, shall also review and approve the remuneration payable to the KMP of the Company.
- iii) The remuneration structure to the Executive Directors and KMP shall include the following components:
 - Basic Pay
 - Perquisites and Allowances

- Stock Options
- Commission (Applicable in case of Executive Directors)
- Retrial benefits

B. Remuneration to Non-Executive Directors:

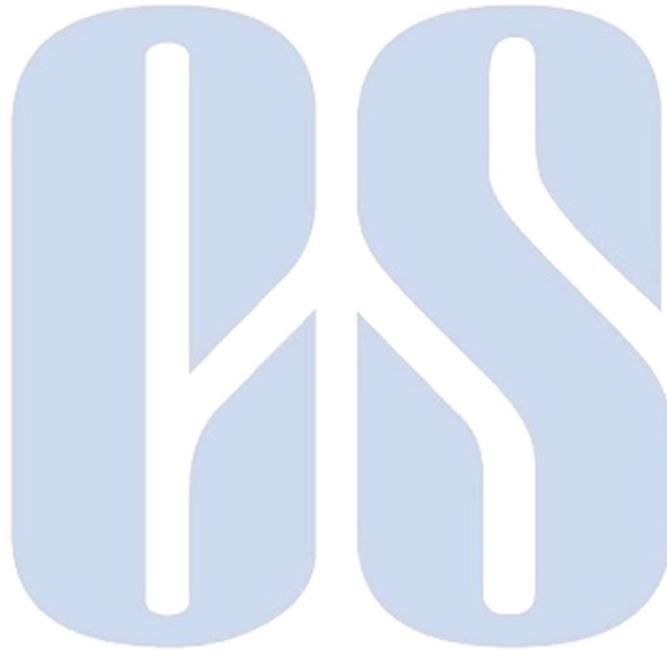

I. Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of **ADD-SHOP E-RETAIL LIMITED** ("the Company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at 31st March, 2026, the statement of profit and loss for the year end and the statement of cash flows for the year ended on that date, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2026 and its profit and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

- Further Company has booked Distribution Commission, Incentive & Bonus amount to Rs.23,22,86,684.19. Due to large number of transaction with distributors we are unable to verify one to one transaction as company maintain accounts on total-basis, hence they book expenses on total basis rather than party-wise and same was followed for deduction on Tax at source which unable to check one to one transaction.
- The Company has been served by Interim order cum show cause notice Under Sections 11(1), 11(4), 11(4A), 11B (1) and 11B (2) of the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992 read with Rule 4 (1) of the SEBI (Procedure for Holding Inquiry and Imposing Penalties) Rules, 1995.

This constitutes a non-compliance with the requirements prescribed under the aforesaid Rules.

a Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended, and other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The Company follows the accrual method of accounting and historical cost convention, except for certain financial instruments and assets measured at fair value as required by relevant Ind AS.

b Use of estimates

g Inventories

Raw materials are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined on a weighted average basis. Purchased goods-in-transit are carried at cost. Work-in-progress is carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Stores and spare parts are carried at lower of cost and net realisable value. Finished goods produced or purchased by the Company are carried at lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes direct material and labour cost and a proportion of manufacturing overheads.

h Provisions, Contingent liabilities and Contingent assets

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which reliable estimate can be made. Provisions (excluding retirement benefits and compensated absences) are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates. Contingent liabilities are not recognised in the financial statements.
