ORDER

1. The instant application has been filed seeking transfer of C.P. (IB) No. 231/2024 from NCLT, Bengaluru Bench to NCLT, New Delhi Bench.
2. Ld. Counsel for the Applicant submits that the Respondent i.e. Miles Education Private Limited had filed C.P. (IB) No. 231/2024 under Section 7 of Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016 ("IBC") seeking initiation of Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process ("CIRP") against the Applicant.
3. During the pendency of the petition under Section 7 of IBC, CP-81 of 2025 under Section 241-242 of Companies Act, 2013 alleging Oppression and Mis-management was preferred by the Respondent before the NCLT, New Delhi.
4. He also submits that on 07.11.2024, the Regional Director had approved the shifting of the Registered Office of the Applicant

from Bengaluru to New Delhi. He further submits that on 05.02.2026, NCLT, Bengaluru had observed that the parties may take appropriate steps for placing the matter before a Single Bench to avoid divergent views.

5. Ld. Counsel for the Respondent while referring to the reply filed by them submits that these two proceedings are independent and therefore, no case for transfer has been made out in the instant application.
6. Heard.
7. It is manifest that the C.P. (IB) No. 231/2024 had been preferred before the NCLT, Bengaluru, however, the same is pending adjudication and has not yet been admitted. The registered office of the Applicant has also been shifted to New Delhi. In the meanwhile, CP-81 of 2025 under Section 241-242 was filed by the Respondent before NCLT, New Delhi.
8. In the aforementioned facts and circumstances, I am of the considered view that it would be appropriate if C.P. (IB) No. 231/2024 pending before NCLT, Bengaluru be transferred to Court-III, NCLT, New Delhi which is hearing the petition for oppression and mis-management between the same parties.
9. Accordingly, **TA(IBC)-20/2026 stands allowed. C.P. (IB) No. 231/2024 stands transferred from NCLT, Bengaluru to Court-III, NCLT, New Delhi.**
