Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of quarterly and year to date standalone financial results of Maharashtra Seamless Limited (the "Company") for the quarter ended March 31, 2026, and for the year ended March 31, 2026 ("Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 and Regulation 52 read with regulation 63 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Statement:

- i. is presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 and Regulation 52 read with Regulation 63 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- ii. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act) read relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the standalone net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company for the quarter ended March 31, 2026, and for the year ended March 31, 2026.

Basis for Opinion

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

The above financial results were reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at its meeting held on 22nd May, 2026.
- The Board of Directors has recommended a dividend of Rs. 10/- per share (200%) for the financial year ended 31st March 2026 on equity shares of Rs. 5/- each.
- Figures for the quarter ended 31st March 2026 are the balancing & recast figures between Audited figures of financial year ended 31st March 2026 & published figures upto third quarter of the financial year.
- The Government of India has consolidated existing labour legislations into a united framework comprising four Labour code viz Code on wages 2019, Code on Social Security 2020, Industrial Relation Code, and Occupational Safety, Health and Working Condition Code 2020 (collectively referred to as the new Labour Codes). These Codes have been made effective from 21st November 2025.

The company has carried out an assessment of the impact of past service cost in gratuity and leave arising primarily from the revision in the definition which amounts to Rs. 3.04 crores as per actuarial valuation report has been recognised as exceptional items in the quarter ended 31st March 2026
- The Board of Directors at its meeting has approved a proposal to shift the Registered Office of the Company from state of Maharashtra to Haryana subject to the approval of the shareholders and/or other regulatory authorities, as may be applicable.
- The Board of Directors has approved scheme of arrangement for demerger of two business undertakings into two separate companies. The said scheme shall be filed with stock exchanges in due course.
- Figures for the previous periods have been re-grouped / rearranged / recast to make them comparable with the figures of the current period.
