Having regard to the fact that the duty demand raised pursuant to the order in original dated 20.12.2002 is Rs.7,54,943/- with interest, we are of the considered view that as per the CBEC [now named as Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Custom (CBIC)] Circular dated 02.11.2023 the monetary value for prosecuting the appeals has been fixed at Rs.2 crores, this appeal would not survive for consideration.

Hence, on the ground of monetary limit, this appeal stands dismissed.
