This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts giving rise to present IA (re-filing) are that the Appellant e-filed the Memo of Appeal on 19.06.2026. The Office after scrutiny of the Memo of Appeal on 08.07.2026, intimated the defects to the Appellant on the same day. The Appellant re-filed the Appeal on 08.09.2026. It is stated in the IA that though the defects were cured but the Registry raised defects multiple times. The delay of 55 days has occurred on account of compliances with procedural requirements and curing the defects pointed out by the Registry and not due to any negligence or intention to delay the proceedings, so the same may be condoned.

None appeared on behalf of the Appellant. Perused the averments made in the IA as well as Office report.

The Appellant was required to re-file the Memo of Appeal within seven days from the date of intimation of the defects. However, the Appellant re-filed the Memo of Appeal with a delay of 55 days, hence, the case be placed before the Hon'ble Bench with defect for appropriate orders.
