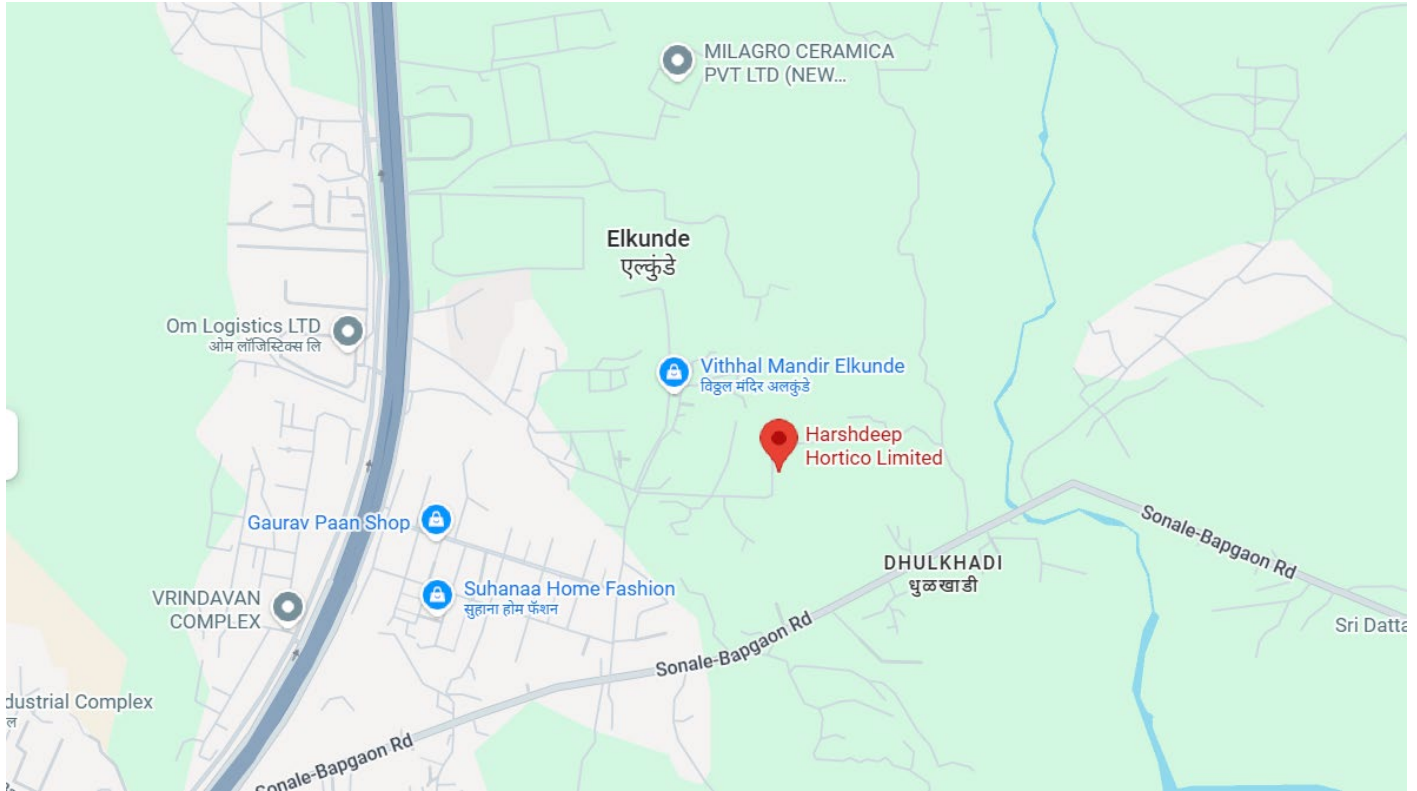
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**ROUTE MAP TO THE VENUE OF THE 04th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING ON THURSDAY,

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION & ANALYSIS REPORT

1. INTRODUCTION:

Our Company was originally incorporated as a Limited Company under the name “Harshdeep Hortico Limited” on December 30, 2022 under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 with the Registrar of Companies, Mumbai, Maharashtra bearing CIN U26994MH2022PLC396421. Later, on April 03, 2023, our Company took over the business of proprietorship concern of the promoter Hitesh Chunilal Shah, namely M/s Harshdeep Agro Products along with the assets and liabilities of the proprietorship concern as going concern.

We are primarily engaged in the business of designing, developing, manufacturing, and supplying of various types of pots and planters like: plastic Indoor Planters, Outdoor Planters, Illuminated Planters, Decorative Planters, Roto Moulded Planters, Fiber Reinforced Plastic (FRP) Planters, Eco series Planters etc. along with related accessories like Garden Hose Pipe & Water Can. Apart from this recently we have also entered into the field of Roto Moulded Outdoor Furniture.

Further we have also started the business of manufacturing, processing, buy, sell, distribute, import, export of various types of shade nets like Agro Shade Net, Green Net, Plastic Net, Agriculture net, Construction Safety Net, Anti Hail Net, Sun Shade Net, Green Shade Net, Nursery Shade Net.

2. INDUSTRY STRUCTURE:

Market Overview:

The global market for gardening products, planters, outdoor furniture and agricultural shade nets continues to witness steady growth, supported by increasing urbanisation, rising interest in home and terrace gardening, expansion of outdoor living spaces, changing consumer preferences towards aesthetically appealing and functional products, and the growing adoption of protected cultivation practices.

The industry is also benefiting from increasing awareness of sustainability, resource efficiency and climate-resilient agricultural practices. The growing use of lightweight, durable and recyclable materials such as plastics, polymers and fibre-reinforced materials is supporting product innovation across planters, outdoor furniture and allied gardening products.

The agricultural shade-net segment is gaining further importance as farmers and horticultural growers increasingly adopt protected cultivation and crop-protection solutions to mitigate the impact of excessive sunlight, heat, wind, hail and other climatic conditions. The expansion of horticulture, floriculture, nurseries and high-value crops is expected to provide additional opportunities for the shade-net industry.

Key Industry Trends

The key trends influencing the industry include:

- **Urbanisation and growth of urban gardening:** Increasing urban populations, limited availability of traditional garden spaces and growing interest in balcony, terrace and indoor gardening are supporting demand for planters and related gardening products.
- **Growth in outdoor living and recreational spaces:** Rising consumer expenditure on residential balconies, terraces, gardens and outdoor recreational areas is contributing to demand for outdoor furniture and decorative products.



- **Preference for durable and lightweight materials:** Plastic, polymer-based, roto-moulded and fibre-reinforced products are increasingly preferred due to their durability, relatively low maintenance requirements, design flexibility and suitability for outdoor applications.
- **Sustainability and circular-economy initiatives:** Consumers and businesses are increasingly seeking products manufactured using recyclable, reusable and resource-efficient materials. Manufacturers are consequently focusing on material optimisation, product longevity and environmentally responsible manufacturing processes.
- **Expansion of protected cultivation:** Increasing adoption of shade nets and other protective agricultural solutions is being driven by the need to improve crop quality, manage temperature and solar radiation, conserve resources and reduce exposure to adverse weather conditions.
- **Climate variability and crop protection:** Rising weather variability and instances of excessive heat, solar radiation, hail and strong winds are encouraging growers to adopt protective netting and other climate-resilient agricultural solutions.
- **E-commerce and digital distribution:** The expansion of e-commerce platforms, digital marketing and direct-to-consumer channels is enabling manufacturers and distributors of gardening, outdoor and agricultural products to reach a wider customer base.
- **Product innovation and customisation:** Increasing demand for products in different sizes, shapes, colours, designs and functional specifications is encouraging manufacturers to expand product portfolios and develop application-specific solutions.

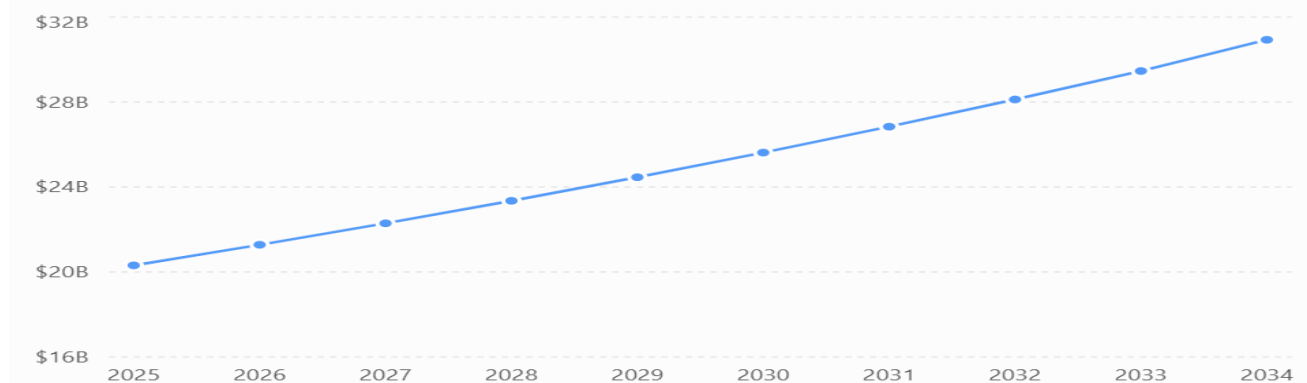

Regional Outlook

The **Asia-Pacific region** is expected to remain an important growth market for gardening products, outdoor furniture and agricultural shade nets, supported by rapid urbanisation, expanding agricultural and horticultural activities, infrastructure development and rising consumer spending.

India represents a significant opportunity due to its large agricultural and horticultural base, expanding urban population, increasing adoption of terrace and balcony gardening, development of nurseries and landscaping activities, and growing awareness of protected cultivation. Government initiatives aimed at improving horticultural productivity, promoting protected cultivation and supporting modern agricultural practices are expected to provide further impetus to the market.

6. Increasing requirement for agricultural solutions capable of mitigating climatic risks;

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **Harshdeep Hortico Limited** ('the Company'), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2026, the statement of Profit and Loss and the statement of Cash Flow for the year ended on that date and notes to financial statements, including a summary of material accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as the "Financial Statements")

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ('The Act') in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the State of Affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2026, its profit and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis of Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Key Audit Matters

Inventory Valuation

Inventories amounting to ₹3,821.12 lakhs constitute a significant portion of the Company's total assets. The Company's inventories comprise raw materials, packaging materials, tools and consumables and finished goods. Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

The valuation of inventories involves Raw Material, Packaging Material, Tools and Consumables, and Finished Goods are valued at lower of Cost or net realizable value. Given the significance of the inventory balance and the judgement involved in its valuation, we considered the valuation of inventories to be a key audit matter.

Auditor's Response

Our audit procedures included, amongst others, the following:

We obtained an understanding of the Company's process and controls relating to the procurement, production, storage and valuation of inventories and evaluated the relevant controls.

We tested, on a sample basis, the cost of inventories with reference to underlying purchase invoices,

production records and other relevant supporting documents.

We evaluated the basis adopted by the management for valuation of work-in-progress and finished goods and tested the underlying calculations on a sample basis.

We assessed the determination of net realisable value of inventories by comparing the carrying amounts with the estimated selling prices and, where applicable, subsequent sales transactions.

We performed analytical procedures over inventory balances and inventory movements and considered whether there were any indicators of slow-moving, obsolete or damaged inventories requiring adjustment.

We evaluated the adequacy and appropriateness of the disclosures relating to inventories in the financial statements.

Information Other than the Financial Statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Management Discussion and Analysis, Board's Report including Annexures to Board's Report, Business Responsibility Report, Corporate Governance and Shareholder's Information, but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report the same to those charged with governance.

Responsibility of Management for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in Section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation and presentation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

Materiality is the magnitude of misstatements in the Financial Results that, individually or in aggregate, makes it probable that the economic decisions of a reasonably knowledgeable user of the Financial Results may be influenced. We consider quantitative materiality and qualitative factors in

(i) planning the scope of our audit work and in evaluating the results of our work; and (ii) to evaluate the effect of any identified misstatements in the Financial Statements.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

Notes forming part of financial statements

Note 1 Corporate Information

The Company was originally incorporated as a Limited Company under the name "Harshdeep Hortico Limited" on December 30, 2022 under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 with the Registrar of Companies, Mumbai, Maharashtra bearing CIN U26994MH2022PLC396421. Later, on April 03, 2023, our Company took over the business of proprietorship concern of the promoter Hitesh Chunilal Shah, namely M/s Harshdeep Agro Products along with the assets and liabilities of the proprietorship concern as going concern.

Note 2 Material Accounting Policies**A. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements**

The Balance Sheet and Profit & Loss account as on March 31, 2026 and the annexure thereto have been extracted by the management on the basis of going concern.

The Financial Statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, in as much as the management neither intends to liquidate the company nor to cease operations. Accordingly, assets, liabilities, income and expenses are recorded on a Going Concern basis. Based on the nature of products and services, and the time between the acquisition of assets and realization in cash or cash equivalents, the company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purposes of current and non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

B. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements required the management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported balance of assets and liabilities, revenues and expenses and disclosures relating to contingent liabilities. The Management believes that the estimates used in the preparation of financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ from these estimates. Any revision of accounting estimates is recognized prospectively in the current and future periods.

C. Property, Plant and Equipment

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Cost includes purchase price and all other attributable cost to bring the assets to its working condition for the intended use. Fixed assets have been recorded in the books of the Company at WDV as per Income tax Act, 1961. Subsequent expenditures related to an item of tangible asset are added to its book value only if they increase the future benefits from the existing asset beyond its previously assessed standard of performance.

D. Depreciation

Depreciation on tangible assets is provided on written down value method over the useful life of assets as prescribed under Part C of Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013. Depreciation for assets purchased/sold during a period is proportionately charged. Intangible assets are amortised over their respective individual estimated useful lives on written down value method, commencing from the date the asset is available to the company for its use.

E. Borrowing Cost

Borrowing cost includes interest and amortization of ancillary costs incurred in connection with the arrangement of borrowings. Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of an asset that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use or sale are capitalized as part of the cost of the respective asset. All other borrowing costs are expensed in the period they occur.

F. Inventories

i) Raw Material, Packaging Material, Tools and Consumables, and Finished Goods are valued at lower of Cost or net realizable value.

ii) Work in Progress at various level is valued at lower of cost or net realizable value. The Management estimates the work in progress according to stage of completion. Cost of inventories comprises of cost of purchase, cost of conversion and other costs including manufacturing overheads incurred in bringing them to their respective present location and condition.

G. Revenue Recognition

- i) Revenue is recognized to the extent that is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.
- ii) Revenue from sale of goods is recognized when the significant risk and rewards are transferred as per the terms of sale. Revenues are recorded at invoice value.
- iii) Income in respect of interest, insurance claims, export benefits, subsidy etc. is recognized to the extent the company is reasonably certain of its ultimate realization.

H. Employee Benefit

Defined-contribution plans:

- i) The company does not carry forward the balance of earned leave balance of employees, balance earned leave is paid to the employees according to the policy of company.
- ii) Company's contribution to Provident Fund and other Funds for the year is accounted on accrual basis and charged to the Statement of Profit & Loss for the year.

I. Contingent Liabilities and Provisions

Provisions are recognized only when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and when a reliable estimate of the amount of obligation can be made.

Contingent Liability is disclosed for

- a) Possible obligation which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of the Company or
- b) Present obligations arising from the past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.
- c) Contingent Assets are not recognized in the financial statements since this may result in the recognition of income that may never be realized.

A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources. Where there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

J. Foreign Currency Transactions

Functional and presentation currency:

The standalone financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees ('₹') which is also the functional and presentation currency of the Company.

Transactions and balances:

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the functional currency, by applying the exchange rate between the functional currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

Foreign currency monetary items outstanding at the balance sheet date are converted to functional currency using the closing rate. Non-monetary items denominated in a foreign currency which are carried at historical cost are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transactions.

Exchange differences arising on settlement of monetary items or restatement as at reporting date, at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded, are recognized in the statement of profit and loss in the year in which they arise.

K. Cash Flow

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method, whereby profit before tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non-cash nature, any deferrals or accruals of past or future operating cash receipts or payments and item of income or expenses associated with investing or financing cash flows. Cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated, accordingly.
