1. An Explanatory Statement pursuant to Section 102 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the “Act”) in respect of the special businesses specified under **Item No. 3 to 7** is annexed hereto.
2. The Ministry of Corporate Affairs (“MCA”) vide its General Circular Nos. 14/2020 dated April 08, 2020, 17/2020 dated April 13, 2020, 20/2020 dated May 5, 2020 and subsequent circulars issued in this regard, the latest being 03/2025 dated September 22, 2025 (the “MCA Circulars”) and the circulars issued by Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) from time to time in this regard (“SEBI Circulars”), have permitted to conduct the AGM through VC or OAVM and the requirement of physical attendance of the Members at a common venue has been dispensed with and it has also granted relaxation in respect of sending physical copies of the annual report to shareholders. In view of the aforementioned MCA Circulars and SEBI Circulars and in compliance with applicable provisions of the Act, the AGM of the Company is being held through VC/OAVM and as such the route map is not annexed to this notice. The deemed venue of the AGM shall be the registered office of the Company.
3. Since this AGM is being held through VC/ OAVM pursuant to the MCA Circulars, physical attendance of members has been dispensed with, accordingly, the route map, the facility to appoint proxy to attend and cast vote for the members is not available for this AGM and hence the Proxy Form and Attendance Slip are not Annexed hereto. However, the Body Corporates are entitled to appoint authorized representatives to attend the AGM through VC/ OAVM and participate thereat and cast their votes through e-Voting.
4. Corporate Members intending to send their authorised representatives to attend and vote at the Meeting pursuant to Section 113 of the Act are requested to send a certified copy of the board resolution authorizing their representative to attend the AGM through VC / OAVM on its behalf and to vote through remote e-voting. The said Resolution/Authorization shall be sent to the Scrutinizer at its email piyushrjethva@gmail.com with a copy marked to evoting@nsdl.com.
5. The Members can join the AGM in the VC/ OAVM mode 15 minutes before and after the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notice. The facility of participation at the AGM through VC/ OAVM will be made available for 1000 members on first come first served basis. However, this number does not include the large Shareholders i.e. Shareholders holding 2% or more shareholding, Promoters, Institutional Investors, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, the Chairpersons of the Audit Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee and Stakeholders Relationship Committee, Auditors etc. who are allowed to attend the AGM without restriction on account of first come first served basis.
6. Details as required in Regulation 36(3) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirement) Regulations, 2015 (the “Listing Regulations”) in respect of the Directors seeking re-appointment at the AGM and the Secretarial Standard - 2 on General Meetings (“SS-2”) issued by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India are annexed hereto.

The Members had previously approved the material related party transactions proposed to be entered into with JCL and JPL for the existing approved period. The Company now proposes to continue/renew the existing arrangements and enter into further transactions, as may be required, with JCL and JPL for a further period commencing from the conclusion of this Annual General Meeting and ending on the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company.

MATERIAL RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS WITH JIGAR CABLES LIMITED ("JCL")

JCL is a Related Party of the Company within the meaning of Regulation 2(1)(zc) of the SEBI Listing Regulations. The Company proposes to continue and/or enter into certain Related Party Transactions with JCL for a further period as mentioned above, as may be required, to achieve operational efficiencies, optimum utilisation of manufacturing capacities, supply-chain continuity and business synergies.

The proposed transactions primarily relate to sale, purchase or supply of raw materials, components, finished goods and other products, availing or rendering of manufacturing, job work, technical, commercial, administrative, logistics and other business support services, leasing arrangements and other operational transactions undertaken in the ordinary course of business. These transactions are intended to support the Company's operational requirements, timely execution of orders, uninterrupted supply of products, efficient utilisation of resources and coordination between the entities.

The Company also proposes to continue granting non-exclusive rights to JCL to use the Company's brand / trademark / trade name in connection with the manufacture and sale of products under the Company's brand name. The ownership, supervision and overall control of the brand shall continue to vest exclusively with the Company, and JCL shall use the brand in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the Company and subject to applicable quality control, compliance and reporting requirements.

In consideration of the grant of such brand usage rights and the marketing, promotional and brand-building support provided by the Company, JCL shall pay commission / royalty to the Company at the rate of 2% (Two Percent) of the basic sales made under the said brand name. The proposed arrangement is intended to facilitate efficient utilisation of the Company's brand and manufacturing capabilities of JCL while supporting the Company's business growth and market presence.

The aggregate value of all transactions proposed to be entered into with JCL during the aforesaid period shall not exceed Rs. 200 Crores (Rupees Two Hundred Crores only).

MATERIAL RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS WITH JIGAR POLYMERS LIMITED ("JPL")

JPL is also a Related Party of the Company within the meaning of Regulation 2(1)(zc) of the SEBI Listing Regulations. The Company proposes to continue and/or enter into certain Related Party Transactions with JPL for operational convenience, business efficiency and optimum utilisation of resources.

The proposed transactions with JPL include sale, purchase or supply of goods and materials, availing or rendering of manufacturing, job work, technical and other business support services, leasing arrangements and such other operational transactions as may be required from time to time in connection with the business activities of the Company and JPL.

The transactions are proposed to be undertaken in the ordinary course of business and on an arm's length basis, having regard to prevailing market conditions, business requirements, commercial considerations and applicable industry practices. The transactions are expected to facilitate operational flexibility, efficient procurement and execution capabilities and better coordination between the entities.

The aggregate value of transactions proposed to be entered into with JPL during the aforesaid period shall not exceed Rs. 25 Crores (Rupees Twenty-Five Crores only).

The aggregate value of the proposed transactions with JCL and JPL is expected to exceed the applicable materiality threshold prescribed under Regulation 23 of the SEBI Listing Regulations and, accordingly, the approval of the Members is being sought by way of **Ordinary Resolutions**.

The proposed continuation/renewal of the transactions with JCL and JPL has been reviewed and recommended by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on August 12, 2026, subject to approval of the Members at the ensuing Annual General Meeting.

The Company considers the continuation/renewal of these arrangements to be beneficial for its business operations and growth. The terms and conditions of the proposed transactions are considered to be fair, reasonable and in the best interests of the Company and shall be undertaken in the ordinary course of business and on an arm's length basis.

The information required to be disclosed pursuant to the applicable provisions of the SEBI Listing Regulations read with the SEBI Circulars and the **Industry Standards Forum ("ISF")** Standards in relation to the proposed Material Related Party Transactions is provided in the **Annexure** forming part of this Notice.

The certain Promoters / Promoter Groups of the Company are related to the Promoters and/or Promoter Groups or Directors of JCL and JPL and, accordingly, may be deemed to be concerned or interested in the proposed resolutions to the extent of their relationship and/or interest in the respective Related Parties. Except as stated above and to the extent of their shareholding, directorship or other interest, if any, in the respective Related Parties, none of the other Directors, Key Managerial Personnel of the Company and their relatives is concerned or interested, financially or otherwise, in the proposed resolutions.

In terms of Regulation 23 of the SEBI Listing Regulations, all related parties of the Company shall abstain from voting on the resolutions set out at Item Nos. 4 and 5 of the Notice, irrespective of whether they are concerned or interested in the respective transactions.

The Board of Directors recommends the passing of the resolution set out at Item No. 4 & 5 of the Notice as an **Ordinary Resolutions**.

Item nos. 6 & 7

The Members of the Company at the 17th Annual General Meeting held on September 06, 2024, had approved the appointment of Smt. Viralben Chetankumar Dave (DIN: 10719954) and Shri Satish Kalkani (DIN: 10719585) as Independent Directors of the Company for a term of five (5) consecutive years commencing from September 06, 2024, up to September 05, 2029, not liable to retire by rotation.

The said appointments were approved by the Members with the requisite majority and the votes cast in favour by the public shareholders were also more than the votes cast against the respective resolutions. However, subsequently it was observed that although the appointments were approved by the Members, the resolutions approving such appointments were inadvertently classified/disclosed as Ordinary Resolutions instead of Special Resolutions as required under Regulation 25(2A) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ("SEBI Listing Regulations"). In terms of Regulation 25(2A) of the SEBI Listing Regulations, appointment of an Independent Director of a listed entity is required to be approved by the Members by way of a Special Resolution.

Accordingly, by way of abundant caution and for the purpose of compliance regularisation, ratification and confirmation, approval of the Members is being sought again by way of Special Resolutions for ratification and confirmation of the appointments of Smt. Viralben Chetankumar Dave and Shri Satish Kalkani as Independent Directors of the Company with effect from the original date of appointment itself. It is further clarified that except for the requirement of approval by way of Special Resolution pursuant to Regulation 25(2A) of the SEBI Listing Regulations, all other terms and conditions relating to the appointments of Smt. Viralben Chetankumar Dave and Shri Satish Kalkani as Independent Directors of the Company, including their profiles, declarations, disclosures and other compliances as required under the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the SEBI Listing Regulations, remain unchanged and continue to be valid and effective.

The Board of Directors recommends the **Special Resolutions** set out at Item Nos. 6 and 7 of the Notice for approval of the Members.

Except Smt. Viralben Chetankumar Dave and Shri Satish Kalkani respectively and/or their relatives, none of the Directors, Key Managerial Personnel of the Company and/or their relatives are concerned or interested, financially or otherwise, in the respective resolutions.

Dear Shareholders,

The Directors take pleasure in presenting the 19th Annual Report along with the Audited Financial Statements for the year ended March 31, 2026.

1. FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Your Directors are pleased to report that during the financial year 2025-26, the Company recorded Total Income of Rs. 26,086.91 Lakhs, as compared to Rs. 23,964.90 Lakhs in the previous financial year, registering a growth of approximately 8.85%. Revenue from Operations stood at Rs. 26,010.08 Lakhs, as against Rs. 23,943.38 Lakhs, representing a growth of approximately 8.63%.

The Company recorded a Profit Before Tax (PBT) of Rs. 742.27 Lakhs, as against Rs. 1,371.35 Lakhs in the previous year, representing a decrease of approximately 45.88%. After tax expenses of Rs. 177.74 Lakhs, the Profit After Tax (PAT) stood at Rs. 558.81 Lakhs, compared to Rs. 972.15 Lakhs in the previous year, representing a decrease of approximately 42.52%.

The decline in profitability was primarily attributable to the increase in the overall cost base and operating and other expenses during the year under review. Accordingly, while the Company achieved healthy growth in revenue and total income, its profitability was impacted by higher costs, resulting in a decline in PBT and PAT as compared to the previous financial year. The Directors remain focused on improving operational efficiencies, prudent cost management and strengthening the Company's overall financial performance in the ensuing year.

2. RESERVE

During the year under review, there was no amount transferred to any of the reserves by the company. You may refer notes to the financial statements of the company.

3. CHANGE IN THE NATURE OF BUSINESS

There is no change in the nature of the business of the Company during the financial year.

No material changes and commitments affecting the financial position of the Company occurred between the end of financial year to which this financial statement relates and the date of this Report.

5. CAPITAL STRUCTURE

As on March 31, 2026, the Authorised Share Capital of the Company stood at Rs. 30,00,00,000/- (Rupees Thirty Crores Only) divided into 15,00,00,000 (Fifteen Crores) Equity Shares of face value of Rs. 2/- (Rupees Two Only) each. The Issued, Subscribed and Paid-up Share Capital of the Company stood at Rs. 24,59,15,908/- (Rupees Twenty-Four Crores Fifty-Nine Lakhs Fifteen Thousand Nine Hundred Eight Only) divided into 12,29,57,954 (Twelve Crores Twenty-Nine Lakhs Fifty-Seven Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-Four) Equity Shares of face value of Rs. 2/- (Rupees Two Only) each. During the financial year 2025-26, there was no

change in the Authorised Share Capital or the Issued, Subscribed and Paid-up Share Capital of the Company.

Further, the Company's short-term bank facilities have been assigned a rating of IND A3 as against the previous rating of IVR A3 for its short-term bank facilities by India Rating & Research. The upgraded credit ratings reflect the Company's strengthened credit profile, prudent financial management, improved liquidity position, operational efficiencies and consistent business performance. The revision in ratings also signifies enhanced confidence of the rating agency in the Company's ability to meet its financial obligations and sustain stable financial performance going forward.

8. DIVIDEND

Your Directors feel that it is prudent to plough back profit for future growth of the company, hence do not recommend any dividends for the year ended on March 31, 2026.

M/s. Bhavin Associates, Chartered Accountants (Firm Registration No. 101383W), were re-appointed as the Statutory Auditors of the Company for a second term of five consecutive years, to hold office from the conclusion of the 15th Annual General Meeting ("AGM") until the conclusion of the 20th AGM of the Company to be held in the year 2027.

The Company has received confirmation from M/s. Bhavin Associates, Chartered Accountants that their continued appointment is in compliance with the provisions of Section 139 and Section 141 of the Act, and that they are not disqualified from continuing as the Statutory Auditors of the Company. They have further confirmed that they hold a valid Peer Review Certificate issued by the Peer Review Board of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("ICAI"), as required under the applicable provisions of the SEBI Listing Regulations.

The Statutory Auditors have audited the Standalone Financial Statements of the Company for the Financial Year ended March 31, 2026. The Auditors' Report forms part of the Annual Report.

The Auditors' Report for the Financial Year 2025-26 does not contain any qualification, reservation, adverse remark, disclaimer, or emphasis of matter. The Notes to the Financial Statements referred to in the Auditors' Report are self-explanatory and therefore do not call for any further comments by the Board of Directors pursuant to Section 134(3)(f) of the Act.

Further, during the year under review, the Statutory Auditors have not reported any fraud under Section 143(12) of the Act committed against the Company by its officers or employees to the Audit Committee or the Board of Directors.

(B) SECRETARIAL AUDITORS

Pursuant to Regulation 24A of the SEBI Listing Regulations, the Members of the Company at the previous 18th Annual General Meeting approved the appointment of M/s. Jain Preeti & Company, Practicing Company Secretaries (Firm's Unique Identification No. S2015DE320300), New Delhi, Peer Reviewed Firm of Practicing Company Secretaries, as the Secretarial Auditors of the Company for a term of five (5) consecutive financial years commencing from April 01, 2025 and ending on March 31, 2030. The firm has confirmed that they satisfy the eligibility criteria and are not disqualified from holding the office of Secretarial Auditor under the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, the SEBI Listing Regulations and other applicable laws.

Secretarial Audit Report

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 204 of the Act read with the Companies (Appointment and Remuneration of Managerial Personnel) Rules, 2014 and Regulation 24A of the SEBI Listing Regulations, the Secretarial Audit of the Company for the Financial Year ended March 31, 2026, was conducted by M/s. Jain Preeti & Company, Practicing Company Secretaries. The Company extended all necessary assistance, information and facilities to the Secretarial Auditors for conducting the audit. The Secretarial Auditors have submitted their Report for the financial year ended March 31, 2026, in the prescribed Form MR-3 of the Act and is annexed to this report as "**Annexure-1**".

Some observations made by the Secretarial Auditor in the Report for FY 2025-26, along with the Management's responses, are as under:

1. *Certain statutory forms were filed by the Company beyond the prescribed due dates, with additional applicable Fees.*

Management Response: The Company has noted the observation and has strengthened its compliance mechanism to ensure timely filings.

2. *The Board Meeting Dated 17.04.25 and Audit Committee Meeting held on 17.04.25 and 30.07.25 not mentioned in the Quarterly Corporate Governance Report filed with Stock Exchange.*

Management Response: The omission was inadvertent. The Company has strengthened its review process to ensure complete and accurate disclosures.

3. *The proficiency self-assessment test for an Independent Director as per Section 149 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 6(4) of the Companies (Appointment and Qualification of Directors) Rules, 2014 is yet to be passed by all Independent Directors.*

Management Response: The Company has advised the Independent Directors to complete the prescribed proficiency self-assessment test at the earliest.

(C) INTERNAL AUDITOR

Report on Corporate Governance for the year 2025-26...

1. Corporate Governance Philosophy:

At Ultracab (India) Limited ("Ultracab" or the "Company"), corporate governance is embedded in every aspect of our operations and decision-making processes. Our governance framework is founded on the core principles of transparency, professionalism, responsibility, fairness, and accountability, which guide our interactions with shareholders, employees, customers, suppliers, regulators, and the communities in which we operate.

The Company remains committed to complying with all applicable laws, regulations, and statutory requirements while fostering a culture of ethical business conduct and responsible corporate citizenship. We recognize that effective governance extends beyond mere regulatory compliance and encompasses the adoption of best practices that promote sustainable value creation for all stakeholders.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Report

1. ECONOMIC OVERVIEW AND OUTLOOK

The financial year 2025-26 was characterized by a dynamic global economic environment influenced by geopolitical developments, evolving trade patterns, fluctuations in commodity prices and inflationary pressures across several regions. Despite these challenges, the Indian economy remained one of the fastest-growing major economies, supported by robust domestic consumption, continued infrastructure investments, manufacturing growth and government-led development initiatives.

The Indian wires and cables industry continues to benefit from structural growth drivers such as expansion of power transmission and distribution networks, increasing investments in



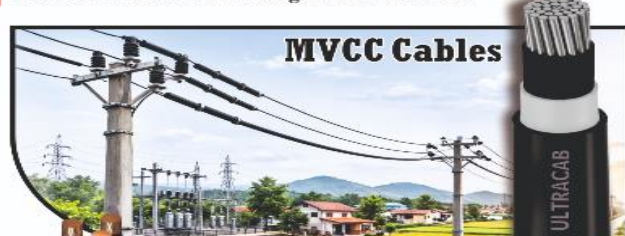

- **Renewable Energy Expansion**

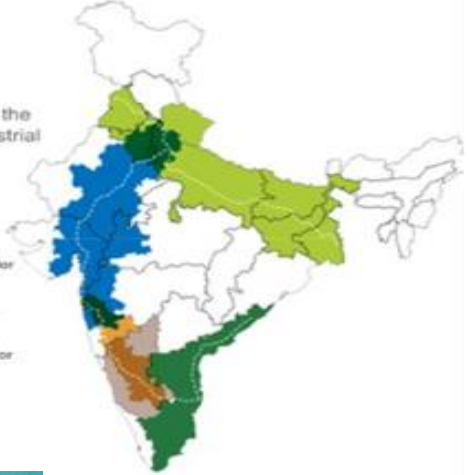

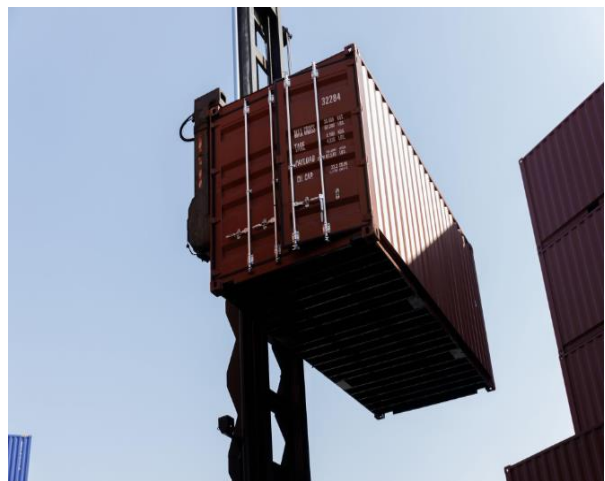

4. THREATS

- **Volatility in Raw Material Prices**

The wire and cables industry is significantly dependent on key raw materials such as copper, aluminium and polymers. Fluctuations in commodity prices and supply chain disruptions may impact on input costs and profitability.

- **Intense Industry Competition**

The industry remains highly competitive with the presence of large, organized players, regional manufacturers and unorganized sector participants. Competitive pricing pressures may affect margins and market share.

- **Global Economic and Geopolitical Uncertainties**

Geopolitical tensions, trade restrictions, currency fluctuations and global economic slowdowns may impact export demand, supply chains and overall business sentiment.

- **Regulatory and Compliance Changes**

Changes in government policies, environmental regulations, quality standards and compliance requirements may result in additional operational and compliance costs.

- **Project Execution and Demand Cyclical**

Demand from infrastructure, industrial and real estate sectors is influenced by economic conditions, project execution timelines and investment cycles. Delays in major projects may affect short-term demand growth.

- **Foreign Exchange Risk**

As the Company continues to expand its export operations, fluctuations in foreign exchange rates may impact export realizations and profitability.

5. FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

FY 2025–26 marks another year of sustained business expansion for the Company, with revenue from operations increasing to Rs. 26,010.08 lakh from Rs. 23,943.38 lakh in the previous financial year, reflecting continued demand momentum, stronger market penetration, and scalable operational execution.

Key Financial Highlights:

- **Revenue from Operations:** Revenue from operations for FY 2025-26 stood at **Rs. 26,010.08 Lakhs**, as against Rs. 23,943.38 Lakhs in FY 2024-25, registering a growth of **8.64%** over the previous year.
- **EBITDA:** Earnings before interest, depreciation, tax, and amortization (EBITDA) for FY 2025-26 were Rs. 1,174.28 Lakhs, as compared to Rs. 1,944.25 Lakhs in FY 2024-25, reflecting a **decrease of 39.61%** over the previous year.
- **Profit Before Tax (PBT):** Profit before tax for FY 2025-26 stood at **Rs. 742.27 Lakhs**, as against Rs. 1,371.35 Lakhs in FY 2024-25, reflecting a **decline of 45.88%** over the previous year.
- **Net Profit Margin (PAT):** Profit after tax (PAT) for FY 2025-26 stood at **Rs. 558.81 Lakhs**, as compared to Rs. 972.15 Lakhs in FY 2024-25, registering a decline of **42.53%** over the previous year.

The moderation in profitability during the year was primarily attributable to margin pressures arising from elevated raw material prices, higher operating expenses, and increased cost structures associated with capacity expansion and business scaling initiatives. These factors are largely cyclical and investment-linked in nature, aligned with the Company's ongoing growth phase.

Importantly, Despite the short-term impact on margins, the Company has continued to strengthen its operational foundation through expanded capacities, improved product mix positioning, and enhanced execution capabilities. The temporary impact on margins reflects the

natural dynamics of scaling operations, while the underlying business fundamentals remain robust.

6. RISK & CONCERNS

The Company operates in a dynamic business environment and is exposed to various internal and external risks that may impact its operations and financial performance. Key risks include volatility in raw material prices, changing market demand, competitive intensity, regulatory developments, supply chain disruptions, working capital requirements, technology advancements, and operational risks associated with capacity expansion and business growth.

The prices of key raw materials such as copper, aluminium, and polymers remain subject to fluctuations in domestic and international markets, which may impact margins. Further, demand for the Company's products is closely linked to infrastructure development, industrial investments, power sector growth, and overall economic activity. The Company also faces competition from both organized and unorganized players within the industry.

To address these risks, the Company has established a robust risk management framework encompassing risk identification, assessment, mitigation, monitoring, and periodic review. Through prudent financial management, diversified sourcing strategies, strong customer relationships, continuous technology upgradation, and effective internal controls, the Company seeks to mitigate risks and strengthen its ability to achieve sustainable growth and long-term value creation.

7. INTERNAL CONTROL SYSTEMS

The Company's internal control systems are commensurate with the nature of its business and the size and complexities of its operations. These systems are designed to ensure that all assets of the Company are safeguarded and protected against any loss and that all transactions are properly authorized, recorded and reported. The Company has an adequate system of internal control in place, which assures of:

- Authorization, recording, analyzing and reporting of transactions.
- Recording and adequate safeguarding of assets.
- Upkeep of accounting records and trustworthiness of financial information.
- Corporate policies for financial reporting, accounting, information security, investment appraisal and corporate governance.
- Audit Committee of the Board which monitors and reviews all risks and control issues and financial matters.
- Computerized and integrated financial and accounting functions, information feedback system of process parameters and backtracking from finished products to raw material stage.
- Routine evaluation of all financial operating and information technology system.
- Laying down risk assessment and minimization procedures and regular review of the same.

8. HUMAN RESOURCES AND EMPLOYEE WELL-BEING

At Ultracab, we believe that our employees are the driving force behind the Company's growth and success. The Company remains committed to fostering a performance-driven, inclusive, and collaborative work culture that encourages innovation, continuous learning, and professional development. Our human resource practices are focused on attracting, developing, and retaining talent while creating opportunities for employees to enhance their skills and contribute meaningfully to the Company's objectives.

The Company continues to invest in employee training and development initiatives aimed at strengthening technical competencies, operational excellence, leadership capabilities, and workplace effectiveness. A culture of meritocracy, teamwork, and accountability is promoted across the organization to support sustainable growth and long-term value creation.

As on March 31, 2026, the Company had 146 permanent employees on its rolls.

The health, safety, and well-being of employees remain a key priority. The Company maintains appropriate safety standards, operational controls, and workplace practices to provide a safe and healthy working environment. The Company also strives to maintain harmonious industrial relations and is pleased to report that relations with employees remained cordial throughout the year.

Accounting Policy

1. Corporate information

Ultracab (India) Limited (the 'Company') is a public limited company domiciled in India. Its shares are listed on the Bombay Stock Exchange ('BSE'). The Company is mainly engaged in the business of manufacturing and exporting of electric wires and cables.

2. Summary of basis of compliance, basis of preparation and presentation, critical accounting estimates, assumptions and judgements and significant accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements of the company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under companies (Indian accounting standards) Rules, 2015 (as amended from time to time) and presentation requirements of Division II of Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013, (Ind AS compliant Schedule III), as applicable to the company.

2.2 Basis of preparation and presentation

The Company follows the mercantile system of accounting and recognises income and expenditure on an accrual basis except in case of significant uncertainties.

The Standalone Financial Statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for goods and services. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III to the Act.

2.3 Critical accounting estimates, assumptions and judgements

The preparation of the Standalone Financial Statements requires management to make estimates, assumptions and judgments that affect the reported balances of assets and liabilities and disclosures as at the date of the Standalone Financial Statements and the reported amounts of income and expense for the periods presented.

The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates considering different assumptions and conditions.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and future periods are affected.

The estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying values of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below.

2.3.1 Deferred income tax assets and liabilities Significant management judgment is required to determine the amount of deferred tax assets that can be recognised, based upon the likely timing and the level of future taxable profits

The amount of total deferred tax assets could change if management estimates of projected future taxable income or if tax regulations undergo a change.

2.3.2 Useful lives of property, plant and equipment ('PPE') and intangible assets

Management reviews the estimated useful lives and residual value of PPE and Intangibles at the end of each reporting period. Factors such as changes in the

expected level of usage, technological developments and product lifecycle, could significantly impact the economic useful lives and the residual values of these assets. Consequently, the future depreciation charge could be revised and may have an impact on the profit of the future years.

2.3.3 Employee benefit obligations

Employee benefit obligations are determined using actuarial valuations. An actuarial valuation involves making various assumptions that may differ from actual developments. These include the estimation of the appropriate discount rate, future salary increases and mortality rates. Due to the complexities involved in the valuation and its long-term nature, the employee benefit obligation is highly sensitive to changes in these assumptions. All assumptions are reviewed at each reporting date.

2.3.4 Provisions and contingencies

From time to time, the Company is subject to legal proceedings, the ultimate outcome of each being subject to uncertainties inherent in litigation. A provision for litigation is made when it is considered probable that a payment will be made and the amount can be reasonably estimated. Significant judgement is required when evaluating the provision including, the probability of an unfavourable outcome and the ability to make a reasonable estimate of the amount of potential loss. Litigation provisions are reviewed at each accounting period and revisions made for the changes in facts and circumstances. Contingent liabilities are disclosed in the notes forming part of the Standalone Financial Statements. Contingent assets are not disclosed in the Standalone Financial Statements unless an inflow of economic benefits is probable.

2.4 Foreign currency translation

The functional currency of the Company (i.e. the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates) is the Indian Rupee in (Rs.). The financial statements have been rounded off to the nearest Rs. Lakh.

On initial recognition, all foreign currency transactions are recorded at exchange rates prevailing on the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities, denominated in a foreign currency, are translated at the exchange rate prevailing on the balance sheet date and the resultant exchange gains or losses are recognised in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss.

2.5 Property, plant and equipment

An item of property, plant and equipment ('PPE') is recognised as an asset if it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and its cost can be measured reliably. These recognition principles are applied to the costs incurred initially to acquire an item of PPE, to the pre-operative and trial run costs incurred (net of sales), if any and also to the costs incurred subsequently to add to, replace part of, or service it and subsequently carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any.

The cost of PPE includes interest on borrowings directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset. A qualifying asset is an asset that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to be made ready for its intended use or sale. Borrowing costs and other directly attributable cost are added to the cost of those assets until such time as the assets are substantially ready for their intended use, which generally coincides with the commissioning date of those assets.

Machinery spares that meet the definition of PPE are capitalised and depreciated over the useful life of the principal item of an asset.

"All other repair and maintenance costs, including regular servicing, are recognised in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss as incurred. When a replacement occurs, the carrying value of the replaced part is de-recognised. Where an item of property, plant and equipment comprises major components having different useful lives, these components are accounted for as separate items."

PPE acquired and put to use for projects are capitalised and depreciation thereon is included in the project cost till the project is ready for commissioning.

Depreciation methods, estimated useful lives and residual value

Depreciation on PPE (except leasehold improvements) is calculated using the written-down value method to allocate their cost, over their estimated useful lives. Freehold land is not depreciated.

Schedule II to the Act prescribes the useful lives for various class of assets. For certain class of assets, based on technical evaluation and assessment, Management believes that the useful lives adopted by it reflect the periods over which these assets are expected to be used. Accordingly for those assets, the useful lives estimated by the management are different from those prescribed in the Schedule. Management's estimates of the useful lives for various class of PPE are as given below:

Assets	Useful life
Buildings	30-60 Years
Plant and Equipment	5-25 Years
Furniture and Fixtures	10 Years
Vehicles	8 Years
Office Equipment	3 Years

Useful lives of assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period. Losses arising from the retirement of, and gains or losses arising from disposal/adjustments of PPE are recognised in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss.

2.6 Intangible assets

Intangible assets comprise software licenses, product registration fees and rights to use railway wagon.

Intangible assets are measured on initial recognition at cost and subsequently are carried at cost less accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment losses, if any.

The intangible assets with a finite useful life are amortised using Written Down Value Method over their estimated useful lives. The management's estimates of the useful lives for various class of Intangibles are as given below:

Assets	Useful life
Trademark	Indefinite

The estimated useful life is reviewed annually by the management.

Gains or losses arising from the retirement or disposal of an intangible asset are determined as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and recognised as income or expense in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss.

2.7 Capital work-in-progress ('CWIP') and intangible assets under development

Projects under commissioning and other CWIP/ intangible assets under development are carried at cost, comprising direct cost, related incidental expenses and attributable borrowing cost

Subsequent expenditures relating to property, plant and equipment are capitalised only when it is probable that future economic benefit associated with these will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably.

Advances given to acquire property, plant and equipment are recorded as non-current assets and subsequently transferred to CWIP on acquisition of related assets.

Investment property

Investment properties are land and buildings that are held for long term lease rental yields and/ or for capital appreciation. Investment properties are initially recognised at cost including transaction costs. Subsequently investment properties comprising buildings are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any.

Depreciation on buildings is provided over the estimated useful lives as specified in note 2.5 above. The estimated useful lives and depreciation method of investment properties are reviewed, and adjusted on prospective basis as appropriate, at each reporting date. The effects of any revision are included in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss when the changes arise.

An investment property is de-recognised when either the investment property has been disposed of or do not meet the criteria of investment property i.e. when the investment property is permanently withdrawn from use and no future economic benefit is expected from its disposal. The difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset is recognised in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss in the period of de-recognition.

2.8 Research and development expenses

Research expenses are charged to the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss as expenses in the year in which they are incurred. Development costs are capitalised as an intangible asset under development when the following criteria are met:

- the project is clearly defined, and the costs are separately identified and reliably measured;
- the technical feasibility of the project is demonstrated;
- the ability to use or sell the products created during the project is demonstrated;
- the intention to complete the project exists and use or sale of output manufactured during the project;
"a potential market for the products created during the project exists or their usefulness, in case of internal use, is demonstrated, such that the project will generate probable future economic benefits; and"
- adequate resources are available to complete the project.
- These development costs are amortised over the estimated useful life of the projects or the products they are incorporated within. The amortisation of capitalised development costs begins as soon as the related product is released to production.

2.9 Non-current assets held for sale and discontinued operations

Non-current assets (including disposal groups) are classified as held for sale if their carrying amount will be recovered principally through a sale transaction rather than through continuing use and a sale is considered highly probable.

Non-current assets classified as held for sale are measured at lower of their carrying amount and fair value less cost to sell

Non-current assets classified as held for sale are not depreciated or amortised from the date when they are classified as held for sale.

A discontinued operation is a component of the entity that has been disposed off or is classified as held for sale and: represents a separate major line of business or geographical area of operations and; is part of a single co-ordinated plan to dispose of such a line of business or area of operations. The results of discontinued operations are presented separately in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss.

2.10 Financial instruments

2.11.1 Investments and other financial assets:

- **Classification**

The Company classifies its financial assets in the following measurement categories:

- those to be measured subsequently at fair value (either through OCI, or through profit or loss), and
- those measured at amortised cost.
- The classification is done depending upon the Company's business model for managing the financial assets and the contractual terms of the cash flows. For assets measured at fair value, gains and losses will be recorded in profit or loss

- **Debt instruments**

Measurement

A financial asset or financial liability is initially measured at fair value plus, for an item not at fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL), transaction costs that are directly attributable to its acquisition or issue. Transaction costs of financial assets carried at fair value through profit or loss are expensed in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss.

Subsequent measurement of debt instruments depends on the Company's business model for managing the asset and the cash flow characteristics of the asset. There are three measurement categories into which the Company classifies its debt instruments:

Amortised cost

Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows, where those cash flows represent solely payments of principal and interest, are measured at amortised cost. A gain or loss on a debt investment (unhedged) that is subsequently measured at amortised cost is recognised in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss when the asset is derecognised or impaired. Interest income from these financial assets is included in other income using the effective interest rate ('EIR') method.

Fair value through Other Comprehensive Income ('FVTOCI')

Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows and for selling the financial assets, where the assets' cash flows represent solely payments of principal and interest, are measured at FVTOCI. Movements in the carrying amount are recorded through OCI, except for the recognition of impairment gains or losses, interest revenue and foreign exchange gains or losses which are recognised in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss. When the financial asset is derecognised, the cumulative gain or loss previously recognised in OCI is reclassified from equity to the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss. Interest income from these financial assets is included in other income using the EIR method

Fair value through profit or loss ('FVTPL')

Assets that do not meet the criteria for amortised cost or FVTOCI are measured at FVTPL. A gain or loss on a debt investment (including current investments) that is subsequently measured at FVTPL (unhedged) is recognised net in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss in the period in which it arises. Interest income from these financial assets is included in other income.

- **Equity instruments**

The Company subsequently measures all equity investments at fair value, except investment in subsidiaries and joint ventures which are measured at cost. Where the Company's management has elected to present fair value gains and losses on equity investments in OCI, there is no subsequent reclassification of fair value gains and losses to the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss. When the financial asset is derecognised, the cumulative gain or loss previously recognised in OCI is reclassified to equity. Dividends from such investments are recognised in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss within other income when the Company's right to receive payments is established. Impairment losses (and reversal of impairment losses) on equity investments measured at FVTOCI are not reported separately from other changes in fair value.

- **Cash and cash equivalents**

The Company considers all highly liquid investments, which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash, that are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value with a maturity within three months or less from the date of purchase, to be cash equivalents. Cash and cash equivalents consist of balances with banks which are unrestricted for withdrawal and usage.

- **Trade Receivables**

Trade receivables that do not contain a significant financing component are measured at transaction price.

- **Impairment of financial assets**

The Company assesses on a forward-looking basis the expected credit losses associated with its assets carried at amortised cost. The impairment methodology applied depends on whether there has been a significant increase in credit risk and if so, assess the need to provide for the same in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

- **Derecognition of financial assets**

A financial asset is derecognised only when the Company

- has transferred the rights to receive cash flows from the financial asset; or
- retains the contractual rights to receive the cash flows of the financial asset, but assumes a contractual obligation to pay the cash flows to one or more recipients.

Where the Company transfers an asset, it evaluates whether it has transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset. Where the Company has transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership, the financial asset is derecognised. Where the Company has not transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset, the financial asset is not derecognised. Where the Company has neither transferred a financial asset nor retained substantially all risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset, the financial asset is derecognised if the Company has not retained control of the financial asset. Where the Company retains control of the financial asset, the asset is continued to be recognised to the extent of continuing involvement in the financial asset.

- **Effective interest method**

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial instrument and of allocating interest income or expense over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts future cash receipts or payments through the expected life of the financial instrument, or where appropriate, a shorter period.

2.11.2 Debt and equity instruments

Debt and equity instruments are classified as either financial liabilities or as equity in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement.

An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of an entity after deducting all of its liabilities. Equity instruments issued by the Company are recorded at the proceeds received, net of direct issue costs.

2.11.3 Financial liabilities

- **Classification as debt or Equity**

Debt and equity instruments issued by the Company are classified as either financial liabilities or as equity in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangements and the definition of a financial liability and an equity instrument. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of an entity after deducting all of its liabilities.

- **Initial recognition and measurement**

All financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value and, in the case of loans and borrowings and payables, net of directly attributable transaction costs. The Company's financial liabilities include borrowings, trade payables and other financial liabilities.

- **Subsequent measurement**

The measurement of financial liabilities depends on their classification, as described below:

a) Trade and other payable

These amounts represent obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. These payable are classified as 'current liabilities' if payments are due within one year or less otherwise they are presented as 'non-current liabilities'. Trade payables are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

b) Derecognition

Liability is removed from the balance sheet when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expired. The difference between the carrying amount of a financial liability that has been extinguished or transferred to another party and the consideration paid, including any non-cash assets transferred or liabilities assumed, is recognised in profit or loss as other gains/ (losses).

When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as the derecognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability. The difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in the statement of profit or loss.

2.11.4 Fair value of financial instruments

In determining the fair value of its financial instruments, the Company uses a variety of methods and assumptions that are based on market conditions and risks existing at each reporting date. The methods used to determine fair value include discounted cash flow analysis, available quoted market prices and dealer quotes. All methods of assessing fair value result in general approximation of value.

2.11 Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value after providing for obsolescence and other losses, where considered necessary on an item-by-item basis. Cost includes all charges in bringing the goods to their present location and condition, including other levies, transit insurance and receiving charges. Work-in-progress and finished goods include appropriate proportion of overheads and, where applicable, taxes and duties. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

2.12 Revenue recognition

2.13.1 Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised upon transfer of control of promised goods to customers in an amount that reflects the consideration which the Company expects to receive in exchange for those goods.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point in time when control is transferred to the customer which is usually on dispatch / delivery of goods, based on contracts with the customers.

Revenue towards satisfaction of performance obligation is measured based on the transaction price, which is the consideration, adjusted for volume discounts, price concessions, incentives, and returns, if any, as specified in the contracts with the customers. Revenue excludes taxes collected from customers on behalf of the government. Accruals for discounts/incentives and returns are estimated (using the most likely method) based on accumulated experience and underlying

schemes and agreements with customers. Due to the short nature of credit period given to customers, there is no financing component in the contract.

2.13.2 Interest income

For all debt instruments measured either at amortised cost or at FVTPL, interest income is recorded using the EIR method.

2.13.3 Dividend income

Dividend income is accounted for when Company's right to receive the income is established.

2.13.4 Insurance claims

Insurance claims are accounted for on the basis of claims admitted and to the extent that there is no uncertainty in receiving the claims

2.13 Leases

The Company assesses whether a contract contains a lease, at inception of a contract. A contract is, or contains, a lease if the contract conveys the right to control the use of an identified asset for a defined period of time in exchange for consideration. To assess whether a contract conveys the right to control the use of an identified asset, the Company assesses whether: (i) the contract involves the use of an identified asset (ii) the Company has substantially all of the economic benefits from use of the asset through the period of the lease and (iii) the Company has the right to direct the use of the asset.

As a lessee, The Company recognises a right-of-use asset and a lease liability at the lease commencement date. The right-of-use asset is initially measured at cost, which comprises the initial amount of the lease liability adjusted for any lease payments made at or before the commencement date, plus any initial direct costs incurred and an estimate of costs to dismantle and remove the underlying asset or to restore the underlying asset or the site on which it is located, less any lease incentives received.

The right-of-use asset is subsequently depreciated using the straight-line method from the commencement date to the earlier of the end of the useful life of the right-of-use asset or the end of the lease term. The estimated useful lives of right-of-use assets are determined on the same basis as those of property and equipment. In addition, the right-of-use asset is periodically reduced by impairment losses, if any, and adjusted for certain remeasurements of the lease liability

The lease liability is initially measured at the present value of the lease payments that are not paid at the commencement date, discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease or, if that rate cannot be readily determined, the Company's incremental borrowing rate. For leases with reasonably similar characteristics, the Company, on a lease by lease basis, may adopt either the incremental borrowing rate specific to the lease or the incremental borrowing rate for the portfolio as a whole.

Lease payments included in the measurement of the lease liability comprise the fixed payments, including in-substance fixed payments and lease payments in an optional renewal period if the Company is reasonably certain to exercise an extension option;

The lease liability is measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

The Company has elected not to recognise right-of-use assets and lease liabilities for short-term leases that have a lease term of 12 months or less and leases of low-value assets. The Company recognises the lease payments associated with these leases as an expense on a straight line basis over the lease term. The Company applied a single discount rate to a portfolio of leases of similar assets in similar economic environment with a similar end date

2.14 Employee benefits plans

2.15.1 Defined Contribution Plan

The company's contribution to provident fund is considered as a defined contribution scheme and are charged as expense based on the amount of contribution required to be made and when the services are rendered by the employees.

2.15.2 Defined Benefit Plan

The company operates a defined benefit plan for its employees, viz., gratuity liability. The costs of providing benefits under this plan are determined on the basis of actuarial valuation at each year-end. Actuarial valuation is carried out for the plan using the projected unit credit method. Remeasurements comprising of actuarial gains and losses, the effect of changes to the return on plan assets (excluding net interest) is reflected immediately in the balance sheet with a charge or credit recognised in OCI in the period in which they occur. Remeasurements recognised in OCI are reflected immediately in retained earnings and is not reclassified to in the statement of profit and loss. Net interest is calculated by applying the discount rate to the net defined benefit liability or asset.

2.15.3 Short-term employee benefits

Accumulated leave, which is expected to be utilized within the next 12 months, is treated as short-term employee benefit. The company measures the expected cost of such absences as the additional amount that it expects to pay as a result of the unused entitlement that has accumulated at the reporting date.

2.15.4 Long-term employee benefits

Compensated absences which are not expected to occur within twelve months after the end of the period in which the employee renders the related service are recognised as a liability at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows expected to be made by the Company in respect of services.

2.15 Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs are interest and ancillary costs incurred in connection with the arrangement of borrowings. General and specific borrowing costs attributable to acquisition and construction of qualifying assets is added to the cost of the assets upto the date the asset is ready for its intended use. Capitalisation of borrowing costs is suspended and charged to the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss during extended periods when active development activity on the qualifying assets is interrupted. All other borrowing costs are recognised in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss in the period in which they are incurred.

2.16 Government grants

Government grants and subsidies are recognised when there is reasonable assurance that the Company will comply with the conditions attached to them and the grants and subsidies will be received. Government grants whose primary condition is that the Company should purchase, construct or otherwise acquire noncurrent assets are recognised as deferred revenue in the Standalone Balance Sheet and transferred to the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss on systematic and rational basis over the useful lives of the related asset.

2.17 Income tax

Tax expense for the year comprises current and deferred tax. The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from net profit as reported in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss because it excludes items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and it further excludes items that are never taxable or deductible. The Company's liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

Current tax assets and current tax liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to realise the asset or to settle the liability on a net basis.

Deferred tax is the tax expected to be payable or recoverable on differences between the carrying values of assets and liabilities in the Standalone Financial Statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable profit and is accounted for using the Standalone Balance Sheet liability method. Deferred tax liabilities are generally recognised for all taxable temporary differences arising between the tax base of assets and liabilities and their carrying amount, except when the deferred income tax arises from the initial recognition of an asset or liability in a transaction that is not a business combination and affects neither accounting nor taxable profit or loss at the time of the transaction. In contrast, deferred tax assets are only recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary differences can be utilised.

The carrying value of deferred tax assets is reviewed at the end of each reporting period and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profits will be available to allow all or part of the asset to be recovered.

Deferred tax is calculated at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period when the liability is settled or the asset is realised based on the tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the end of the reporting period. The measurement of deferred tax liabilities and assets reflects the tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the Company expects, at the end of the reporting period, to cover or settle the carrying value of its assets and liabilities

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset to the extent that they relate to taxes levied by the same tax authority and there are legally enforceable rights to set off current tax assets and current tax liabilities within that jurisdiction.

Current and deferred tax are recognised as an expense or income in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss, except when they relate to items credited or debited either in Other Comprehensive Income or directly in equity, in which case the tax is also recognised in OCI or directly in equity.

2.18 Provisions and contingencies

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate of the amount can be made. Provisions are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. When a provision is measured using the cash flows estimated to settle the present obligation, its carrying amount is the present value of those cash flows (when the effect of the time value of the money is material). The increase in the provisions due to passage of time is recognised as interest expense.

Provisions are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate. If it is no longer probable that the outflow of resources would be required to settle the obligation, the provision is reversed.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed when there is a possible obligation arising from past events, the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the Company or a present obligation that arises from past events where it is either not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle or a reliable estimate of the amount cannot be made.

Contingent assets are not disclosed in the Standalone Financial Statements unless an inflow of economic benefits is probable.
