- 1 As required under Proviso 2 to Regulation 33(3)(d) of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, the statutory auditors have expressed an unmodified opinion on the standalone financial results.
- 2 The above results were reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at the respective meetings held on May 19, 2026.
- 3 The Board of Directors has recommended a final dividend of Rs.4.45/- per share (89%). This together with an interim dividend of Rs.6.70/- per share (134%) paid during the month of February 2026 aggregates to a total dividend of Rs.11.15/- per share (223%) for the financial year 2025-26.
- 4 On November 21, 2025, the Government of India notified four new Labour Codes. The incremental impact of these changes, based on actuarial valuation and the management's best estimate, has been recognised in the standalone financial results of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2026 and is not material.
