Ld. Counsel for the Appellant has placed the order passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 29.04.2026 in Civil Appeal No. 13158 – 13159 of 2025 under which the order admitting Section 7 application has been set aside. The consequence of the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court is that CIRP is no longer proceedings as on date.
