This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts giving rise to present IA (re-filing) are that the Appellant e-filed the Memo of Appeal on 24.04.2026. The Office after scrutiny of the Memo of Appeal on 29.04.2026, intimated the defects to the Appellant on the same day. The Appellant re-filed the Appeal on 28.07.2026. It is stated in the IA that delay of 79 days occurred as the defects required consultation with the Appellants, obtaining fresh instructions, incorporating necessary corrections in the pleadings and compilation, preparing corrected sets of papers and ensuring complete procedural compliance with the requirements of the Registry. The Appeal could not be filed immediately as the Applicant/ Advocate is based out of Mumbai and was required to obtain obtaining necessary instructions and approvals from the Appellant, which took some time. Further there were Court vacations. Hence, the delay so the same may be condoned.

Heard Ld. Counsel appearing on behalf of the Appellant and perused the averments made in the IA as well as Office report.

The Appellant was required to re-file the Memo of Appeal within seven days from the date of intimation of the defects. However, the Appellant re-filed the Memo of Appeal with a delay of 83 days, hence, the case be placed before the Hon'ble Bench with defect for appropriate orders.
