1. This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.
2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner and learned counsel appearing for the Opp. Parties.
3. Petitioner has filed the present writ petition inter alia with the following prayer:-

“It is therefore prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to admit this writ application, issue Notice to the Opposite parties, and after hearing the concerned parties, issue a writ in the nature of mandamus directing to the Opp. Parties to release the pension and pensionary benefits and un-utilized leave salary to the Petitioner within a stipulated period.

And/or this Hon'ble Court may pass any other appropriate order as it deems fit and proper;

And for this act of kindness, as in duty bound, the petitioner shall ever pray”.



4. However, taking into account the claim raised in the present Writ Petition, liberty is granted to the Petitioner to make a fresh representation before Opp. Party No.1 by enclosing all the relevant documents and citations in support of his claim, if any, within a period of three (3) weeks hence.

5. It is observed that if such representation is filed within the aforesaid time period, Opp. Party No. 1 shall do well to take a lawful decision on the same within a period of three (3) months from the date of receipt of such representation. The order so passed by Opp. Party No. 1 be communicated to the Petitioner.

6. Since it is contended that similar issue has already been decided by this Court in its judgment dtd.13.03.2026 in W.P.(C) No.31060 of 2025 & batch, Petitioner is also permitted to provide a copy of the judgment along with his representation and the same be taken into consideration while considering the claim.

7. With the aforesaid observation and direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of.
