O R D E R

1. The petitioner, who is the complainant of the case, has approached this Court by way of this Special Leave

Petition seeking liberty to assail the order dated 29.05.2026 passed by the Telangana High Court whereby, the respondent no.2-accused has been granted anticipatory bail in an FIR No.2983/2025 filed by the petitioner for offences punishable under Sections 69 and 351(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

2. Ms. Arora, the learned senior counsel after addressing the Court at great length submits that the petitioner may be permitted to move the High Court for imposition of suitable conditions in the bail order. It is submitted that there is every probability that the respondent no.2 may flee abroad and hence, a direction is necessary that he should deposit the passport during the pendency of the trial.

3. In view of the submissions noted above, while affirming the order of the High Court to the extent, anticipatory bail has been granted to the respondent no.2, the petitioner is granted liberty to move an application seeking suitable amendments in the conditions of bail. Such an application upon being moved, would be considered on its own merits without being influenced by the observations made in this order.

4. In view of the aforesaid, the Special Leave Petition is dismissed.
