This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts giving rise to present IA (re-filing) are that the Appellant e-filed the Memo of Appeal on 27.12.2025. The Office after scrutiny of the Memo of Appeal on 08.01.2026, intimated the defects to the Appellant on the same day. The Appellant re-filed the Appeal on 10.07.2026. It is stated in the IA that the Applicant presented the Appeal for re-filing on 20.06.2026 with a delay of 177 days after curing the defects. The Applicant submits that the delay was caused due to the time required in arranging complete documents necessary for curing the defects, as the relevant records and documents pertaining to the matter were not readily accessible and also much time was consumed in obtaining instructions by the Counsel for Appellant. That the delay in re-filing the present Appeal is neither intentional nor deliberate but has occurred due to the aforesaid bona fide circumstances beyond the control of the Applicant. That it is in the interest of justice the delay in re-filing the Appeal be condoned and the Appeal be heard on merits.

Heard Ld. Counsel for Applicant and perused the averments made in the IA as well as Office report.

The Appellant was required to re-file the Memo of Appeal within seven days from the date of intimation of the defects. However, the Appellant re-filed the Memo of Appeal with a delay of 176 days, hence, the case may be placed before the Hon'ble Bench with defect for appropriate orders.
