This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts giving rise to present IA (re-filing) are that the Appellant e-filed the Memo of Appeal on 17.04.2026. The Office after scrutiny of the Memo of Appeal on 23.04.2026, intimated the defects to the Appellant on the same day. The Appellant re-filed the Appeal on 29.06.2026. It is stated in the IA that for removing the defects documents required rectification, recompilation and re-arrangement for proper adjudication of the Appeal. Further time was consumed in obtaining and placing on record complete and legible copies of the relevant documents. Certain pleadings, affidavits and accompanying applications were required to be executed by the authorised signatory of the Appellant, who is situated outside Delhi. The process of transmitting documents, obtaining instructions, securing signatures and ensuring compliance with procedural requirements inevitably consumed additional time. Hence, there is delay of 60 days in re-filing the Memo of Appeal, so the same may be condoned.

Heard learned Counsel appearing for the Appellant and perused the averments made in the IA as well as Office report.

The Appellant was required to re-file the Memo of Appeal within seven days from the date of intimation of the defects. However, the Appellant re-filed the Memo of Appeal with a delay of 60 days, hence, the case may be placed before the Hon'ble Bench with defect for appropriate orders.
