The relevant information required pursuant to Regulations 36(3) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ("SEBI Listing Regulations") and Secretarial Standard on General Meetings issued by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India, in respect of Directors seeking appointment/re-appointment at this Annual General Meeting ("AGM") is attached herewith.
2. In compliance with the aforesaid MCA Circulars and SEBI Circulars, Notice of the Annual General Meeting along with the Annual Report 2025-26 is being sent only through electronic mode to those Members whose email addresses are registered with the Company/Depositories. Members may note that the Notice and Annual Report 2025-26 will also be available on the Company's website <https://www.priyagroup.biz/> and website of BSE Ltd. (BSE).
3. In continuation with the MCA General Circulars No. 20/2020 dated May 5, 2020, SEBI Circular Nos. SEBI/ HO/CFD/ CMD2/CIR/P/2021/11 dated Jan 15, 2021 and in accordance with the General Circular No. 09/2024 and 03/2025 issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) read with relevant circulars issued by the SEBI, from time to time (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Circulars"), the financial statements (including Board's Report, Auditor's Report or other documents required to be attached therewith) for the financial year ended March 31, 2026 pursuant to Section 136 of the Act and Notice calling the AGM pursuant to Section 101 of the Act read with the Rules framed thereunder, such statements including the Notice of AGM are being sent only in electronic mode to those Members whose e-mail addresses are registered with the Company / RTA/ the Depository Participant(s). A letter containing the web link, along with the exact path to access the complete details of the Annual Report, is being sent to shareholders who have not registered their email address with the Company's RTA or DP. The physical copies of such statements and Notice of AGM will be dispatched only to those shareholders who request for the same.

Members who are desirous of obtaining hard copy of the Annual Report should send a request to the Company's e-mail id viz., cs@priyagroup.com clearly mentioning their Folio number / DP ID and Client ID. 4. A Member entitled to attend and vote at the meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy to attend and vote instead of himself/herself. Such proxy need not be a member of the company.
5. The duly completed and signed instrument appointing proxy as per the format included in the Annual Report should be returned to the Registered Office of the Company not less than forty-eight (48) hours before the time for holding the Annual General Meeting.
6. A person can act as a proxy on behalf of members not exceeding fifty (50) and holding in the aggregate not more than 10% of the total share capital of the Company carrying voting rights. A member holding more than 10% of the total share capital of the Company carrying voting rights may appoint a single person as proxy and such person shall not act as a proxy for any other person or member.
7. Corporate members intending to send their authorised representatives to attend the Annual General Meeting are requested to send to the Company, a certified copy of the Board Resolution authorising their representative to attend and vote on their behalf at the Annual General Meeting.

8. As per Regulation 40 of the Listing Regulations, as amended, securities of listed Companies can be transferred only in dematerialized form with effect from April 1, 2019, except in case of request received for transmission or transposition of securities. In view of this and to eliminate all risks associated with physical shares and for ease of portfolio management, members holding shares in physical form are requested to consider converting their holdings to dematerialized form. All communications in respect of share transfers, dematerialization and change in the address of the members may be communicated to the RTA.
9. The register of members and the share transfer books of the Company will remain closed from **24th September, 2026 to 30th September, 2026** (both days inclusive).
10. In case you are holding the Company's shares in dematerialized form, please contact your depository participant and give suitable instructions to update your bank details in your demat account and to notify any changes with respect to their addresses email id, ECS mandate. In case you are holding Company's share in physical form, please inform Company's Share Transfer Agent viz. M/s. Bigshare Services Pvt. 11. M/s. Bigshare Services Pvt. Ltd., the Share Transfer Agent (STA) of the Company. All communications in respect of share transfers and change in the address of the members may be communicated to them.
12. Members holding shares in the same name under different Ledger Folios are requested to apply for consolidation of such Folios and send the relevant share certificates to the Share Transfer Agent/ Company.
13. In case of joint holders attending the Annual General Meeting, only such a joint holder who is senior by the order in which the name stands in the register of members will be entitled to vote.
14. Members, Proxies and Authorized Representatives are requested to bring the duly completed Attendance Slip enclosed herewith to attend the Annual General Meeting.
15. Details of Directors retiring by rotation at the ensuing Meeting are provided in the "Annexure" to the Notice.
16. Unclaimed dividend for the year 2018-19 are held in separate Bank account and shareholders who have not received the dividend are advised to write to the Company with complete their bank details.
17. Members who hold shares in physical form can nominate a person in respect of all the shares held by them singly or jointly. Members who hold shares in single name are advised, in their own interest to avail of the nomination facility. Members holding shares in dematerialized form may contact their respective depository participant(s) for recording nomination in respect of their shares.
18. Members may avail dematerialisation facility by opening Demat Accounts with the Depository Participants of either National Securities Depository Limited or Central Depository Services (India) Limited and get the equity share certificates held by them dematerialised. The ISIN No. of the Company is **INE686C01014**.
19. Members desirous of getting any information in respect of accounts of the Company and proposed resolutions, are requested to send their queries in writing to the Company at its registered office at least 7 days before the date of the meeting, so that the required information can be made available at the meeting.
20. Pursuant to Sections 124 and 125 of the Act read with the Investor Education and Protection Fund Authority (Accounting, Audit, Transfer and Refund) Rules, 2016 ("IEPF Rules"), dividends that are unpaid or unclaimed for a period of 7 consecutive years from the date of their transfer are required to be transferred by the Company to the IEPF, administered by the Central Government. Further, according to the said IEPF Rules, shares in respect of which dividends remain unclaimed by the shareholders for 7 consecutive years or more shall also be transferred to the demat account of the IEPF Authority. The Company requests all the members to encash/ claim their respective dividends within the prescribed period.

22. The Shareholders are requested to register their email id with the Company or with the Registrar and Transfer Agent (RTA).
23. The register of Directors and Key Managerial Personnel and their shareholding maintained under section 170 of the Companies Act, 2013, the Register of Contracts or Arrangements in which the Directors are interested under section 189 of the Companies Act, 2013, will be available for inspection at the Annual General Meeting.
24. Retirement of Directors by rotation: Mr. Aditya Bhuwania, Director of the Company, retire by rotation at the ensuing Annual General Meeting and, being eligible, offer himself for re-appointment.

25. VOTING THROUGH ELECTRONIC MEANS:

- I. In compliance with provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013, Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 as amended by the Companies (Management and Administration) Amendment Rules, 2015 and Regulation 44 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements), Regulations, 2015, the Company is pleased to provide members facility to exercise their right to vote on resolutions proposed to be considered at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) by electronic means and the business may be transacted through e-Voting Services. The facility of casting the votes by the members using an electronic voting system from

a place other than venue of the AGM ("remote e-voting") will be provided by National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL). The Members desiring to vote through electronic mode may refer to the detailed procedure on e-voting given hereinafter.

- II. The Company has engaged the services of National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL) as the Agency to provide remote e-Voting facility.
- III. M/s. SPRS and Co. LLP, Company Secretaries has been appointed as the Scrutinizer for providing facility to the members of the Company to scrutinize the voting and remote e-voting process in a fair and transparent manner.
- IV. The facility for voting through polling paper shall be made available at the AGM and the members attending the meeting who have not cast their vote by remote e-voting shall be able to exercise their right at the meeting through polling paper.
- V. The members who have cast their vote by remote e-voting prior to the AGM may also attend the AGM but shall not be entitled to cast their vote again.
- VI. The remote e-voting period commences on 27th September, 2026 (9:00 am) and ends on 29th September, 2026 (5:00 pm). During this period, members of the Company, holding shares either in physical form or in dematerialized form, as on the cut-off date of 24th September, 2026, may cast their vote by remote e-voting. The remote e-voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting thereafter. Once the vote on a resolution is cast by the member, the member shall not be allowed to change it subsequently.
- VII. The voting rights of members shall be in proportion to their shares of the paid up equity share capital of the Company as on the cut-off date. A person, whose name is recorded in the register of members or in the register of beneficial owners maintained by the depositories as on the cut-off date only shall be entitled to avail the facility of remote e-voting as well as voting at the AGM through polling paper.
- VIII. The Scrutinizer shall after the conclusion of voting at the general meeting, will first count the votes cast at the meeting and thereafter unblock the votes cast through remote e-voting in the presence of at least two witnesses not in the employment of the Company and shall make, not later than three days of the conclusion of the AGM, a consolidated scrutinizer's report of the total votes cast in favour or against, if any, to the Chairman or a person authorized by him in writing, who shall countersign the same and declare the result of the voting forthwith.
- IX. The Results declared alongwith the report of the Scrutinizer shall be placed on the website of the Company at <https://www.priyagroup.biz/> immediately after the declaration of result by the Chairman or a person authorized by him in writing. The results will also be communicated to BSE Limited, where the shares of the Company are listed.

THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR MEMBERS FOR REMOTE E-VOTING ARE AS UNDER: -

The remote e-voting period begins on Sunday, 27th September, 2026 at 9:00 A.M. and ends on Tuesday, 29th September, 2026 at 5:00 P.M. The remote e-voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting thereafter. The Members, whose names appear in the Register of Members/ Beneficial Owners as on the record date (cut-off date) i.e. Thursday 24th September 2026, may cast their vote electronically. The voting right of shareholders shall be in proportion to their share in the paid-up equity share capital of the Company as on the cut-off date, being 24th September 2026.

How do I vote electronically using NSDL e-Voting system?

The way to vote electronically on NSDL e-Voting system consists of "Two Steps" which are mentioned below:

Step 1: Access to NSDL e-Voting system

A) Login method for e-Voting for Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode

7. After entering your password, tick on Agree to "Terms and Conditions" by selecting on the check box.
8. Now, you will have to click on "Login" button.
9. After you click on the "Login" button, Home page of e-Voting will open.

Step 2: Cast your vote electronically on NSDL e-Voting system.

How to cast your vote electronically on NSDL e-Voting system?

1. After successful login at Step 1, you will be able to see all the companies "EVEN" in which you are holding shares and whose voting cycle is in active status.
2. Select "EVEN" of company for which you wish to cast your vote during the remote e-Voting period.
3. Now you are ready for e-Voting as the Voting page opens.
4. Cast your vote by selecting appropriate options i.e. assent or dissent, verify/modify the number of shares for which you wish to cast your vote and click on "Submit" and also "Confirm" when prompted.
5. Upon confirmation, the message "Vote cast successfully" will be displayed.
6. You can also take the printout of the votes cast by you by clicking on the print option on the confirmation page.
7. Once you confirm your vote on the resolution, you will not be allowed to modify your vote.

General Guidelines for shareholders

1. This gain represents the notional profit arising from the auction of office premises conducted by the bank. Although the company incurred an operational loss during the year, the inclusion of this notional profit under Exceptional Items has resulted in the presentation of an overall profit in the financial statements.

There is no business operation during the financial year.

The Company has a Non-Executive Chairman and the Company has optimum combination of Executive and Non-Executive Directors. The Board comprises of two Independent Directors.

VIII. STATEMENT ON DECLARATION GIVEN BY INDEPENDENT DIRECTORS UNDER SUB-SECTION (6) OF SECTION 149:

Independent Directors are non-executive directors as defined under Regulation 16(1)(b) of the SEBI Listing Regulations read with Section 149(6) of the Act along with rules framed thereunder. The Independent Directors have confirmed that they are not aware of any circumstance or situation which exists or may be reasonably anticipated that could impair or impact their ability to discharge their duties. Based on the declarations received from the Independent Directors, the Board of Directors has confirmed that they meet the criteria of independence as mentioned under Regulation 16(1)(b) of the SEBI Listing Regulations and that they are independent of the management. In terms of Section 150 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 6 of the Companies (Appointment and Qualification of Directors) Rules, 2014, Independent Directors of the Company have confirmed that they have registered themselves with the databank maintained by The Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs, ("IICA"). The Independent Directors are also required to undertake online proficiency self-assessment test conducted by the IICA within a period of 2 (two) years from the date of inclusion of their names in the data bank, unless they meet the criteria specified for exemption.

The Independent Directors of your Company are exempt from the requirement to undertake online proficiency self-assessment test.

During the year under review, none of the Independent Director of the Company had resigned before the expiry of their respective tenure(s).

During the period under review, Mr. Sushil Sakpal appointed as Independent Director of the Company w.e.f. 13th August, 2025.

AUDIT:

1) STATUTORY AUDIT:

In terms of Section 139 of the Companies Act, 2013, M/s. JM & Associates., Chartered Accountants Mumbai (Firm Registration No. 011270N) had been re-appointed as the Statutory Auditors of the Company for the period of five years from the conclusion of 38th Annual General Meeting till the conclusion of 43rd Annual General Meeting.

The Auditors' Report to the Shareholders for the year under review has some contain below Qualification remark:

Remark No.1:

We draw your attention to note no. 33 of Financial Statements regarding the Company's account being declared as Non-Performing Asset (NPA) and received a notice under Section 13(4) of Securitization and Reconstruction of Financial assets and Enforcement of Security Interest Act, 2002 ('the Act') for symbolic attachment of properties. The company has incurred an overall operational loss; however, due to the recognition of notional profit, the company has reported an overall profit in the current quarter. The Company has accumulated losses which exceed its net worth at the balance sheet date resulting in negative net worth and due to blockage of bank accounts, revenue from operation during the current year is nil. During the FY 2020- 21, the Company has also closed all its branches except Mumbai branch, had written off/ sold fixed assets located at such branches and has also laid off maximum employees across all branches since the business operations are nil. Further, the Company has also received summons from Debts Recovery Tribunal (DRT) Mumbai applied by all the three lender banks.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors has taken note of the observations made by the Statutory Auditors with respect to Note No. 33 of the Financial Statements regarding the Company's loan accounts having been classified as Non-Performing Assets (NPA) and the receipt of notice under Section 13(4) of the Securitisation and Reconstruction of Financial Assets and Enforcement of Security Interest Act, 2002 ("SARFAESI Act") in respect of symbolic attachment of the properties of the Company.

The Board further acknowledges that the Company continues to face severe financial and operational constraints. Although the Company has incurred an operational loss during the current quarter/year, the Financial Statements reflect an overall profit primarily on account of recognition of certain notional/non-operating income. The said profit does not represent any corresponding improvement in the Company's operating cash flows or business operations.

The accumulated losses of the Company have exceeded its net worth as at the balance sheet date, resulting in a negative net worth. Further, due to restrictions/blockage of the Company's bank accounts and the prevailing financial constraints, the Company has not generated any revenue from operations during the current financial year.

The Board further states that, in view of the continued non-availability of business operations, the Company had, during FY 2020-21, closed all its branches except the Mumbai branch, disposed of/written off the fixed assets pertaining to such branches and rationalised its workforce by laying off a substantial number of employees.

The Board has also taken note of the summons/notices received from the Debts Recovery Tribunal (DRT), Mumbai, in proceedings initiated by all three lending banks in respect of the outstanding dues of the Company.

The Board is conscious of the financial difficulties being faced by the Company and is continuing to evaluate and pursue appropriate measures for resolution of the outstanding liabilities and restoration of the financial position of the

Company, subject to the availability of resources and the outcome of the proceedings with the concerned lenders and authorities.

The Board has noted the above observations and disclosures and confirms that the same have been appropriately considered and disclosed in the Financial Statements.

Remark No.2:

As informed by the Management, properties situated in Mumbai, Kolkata, and Chennai were auctioned by the Bank following non-payment of dues, despite issuance of demand notices. The possession of these properties had been voluntarily handed over to the Bank. However, as of 31st March 2026, information regarding the auction proceeds through banks remains unavailable. Accordingly, the accounting adjustment between the outstanding borrowings and the value of assets sold were accounted in current year. However, properties belonging to Brent Properties Investment Pvt. Ltd. and Cheshire Properties Investment Pvt. Ltd., which were invoked under corporate guarantees, auctioned by Indian Bank for Rs.4.56 crore each. These transactions were identified through the respective Form 26AS statement of F.Y. 2024-25. Furthermore, in the year, Company's properties invoked under collateral securities, were auctioned by Indian Bank for Rs. 9.03 crore, which company became aware of the transactions through the respective Form 26AS statements. In the financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2026, as it arises from non-recurring transactions relating to the disposal of property assets by bank.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors, based on the information and explanations provided by the Management, notes that certain properties of the Company situated at Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai were auctioned by the Bank pursuant to non-payment of outstanding dues, despite issuance of demand notices. The possession of the said properties had been voluntarily handed over to the Bank.

The Board further notes that, as at 31st March, 2026, the Company had not received complete information from the Bank regarding the auction proceeds and the consequential adjustment thereof against the outstanding borrowings. Accordingly, based on the information available and the accounting principles applicable to such transactions, the necessary accounting adjustment between the outstanding borrowings and the value of the assets disposed of has been recognized in the financial statements for the year under review.

The Board also notes that the properties belonging to Brent Properties Investment Private Limited and Cheshire Properties Investment Private Limited., which had been invoked pursuant to corporate guarantees, were auctioned by Indian Bank for Rs. 4.56 crore each. The Company became aware of these transactions through the respective Form 26AS statements for the Financial Year 2024-25.

Further, during the year under review, certain properties of the Company, which had been invoked under collateral securities, were auctioned by Indian Bank for an aggregate consideration of Rs. 9.03 crore. The Company became aware of these transactions through the respective Form 26AS statements.

The Board confirms that the aforesaid transactions are non-recurring in nature and relate to the disposal/realisation of property assets by the Bank pursuant to enforcement of security interests. The consequential accounting impact arising from such transactions has been appropriately considered and recognized in the financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2026, based on the information available with the Company.

Remark No.3:

For the year ended 31st March 2026, the company incurred a loss of ₹90.25 lakhs for the quarter and profit of ₹434.50 for the year ended 31st March 2026. The company reported an overall profit primarily due to the recognition of Exceptional Items amounting to a notional gain of Rs. 803.39 lakhs. This gain represents the notional profit arising from the auction of office premises conducted by the bank. Although the company incurred an operational loss during the year, the inclusion of this notional profit under Exceptional Items has resulted in the presentation of an overall profit in the financial statements. The Company has not made any provision for tax on account of the auction of the property by the bank as part of the collateral security. The management has relied on Income Tax judgments wherein it was held that capital gains tax is not applicable in cases where the capital asset is appropriated towards the security/ guarantee provided, and the consideration is not received by the property owner. Consequently, the precise impact on the company's profitability and net worth cannot be reliably assessed at this stage.

Comment of Board of Directors:

For the year ended 31st March, 2026, the Company incurred a loss of ₹90.25 lakhs during the quarter ended 31st March, 2026. However, for the financial year ended 31st March, 2026, the Company has reported a profit of ₹ 434.50 lakhs.

The profit reported for the financial year is primarily attributable to the recognition of an Exceptional Item amounting to ₹803.39 lakhs, representing a notional gain arising pursuant to the auction of the Company's office premises conducted by the bank in enforcement of the collateral security provided to the bank. The said gain is non-operational and does not represent cash inflow or profit generated from the Company's business operations.

The Company continued to incur operational losses during the year. Accordingly, excluding the aforesaid exceptional and notional gain, the Company's financial performance continues to reflect an operational loss.

Further, the Company has not made any provision for tax in respect of the aforesaid gain arising from the auction of the property by the bank. The Management has relied upon certain judicial precedents under the Income-tax Act, wherein it has been held that capital gains tax may not arise in circumstances where a capital asset is appropriated towards discharge of a security/guarantee obligation and the consideration is not received by the owner of the property.

In view of the nature of the transaction and the prevailing legal position, the Management is of the view that no provision for tax is presently required in respect of the aforesaid transaction. However, the ultimate tax implications, if any, are subject to the final determination by the tax authorities and applicable judicial interpretation.

Consequently, the precise impact of the aforesaid transaction on the Company's profitability, tax liability and net worth cannot be reliably determined at this stage.

Remark No.4:

Bank of Maharashtra, Indian Bank and Union Bank of India have declared the company, promoters, directors and corporate guarantors as wilful defaulters, the management of the company has represented against the same.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors notes that Bank of Maharashtra, Indian Bank and Union Bank of India have declared the Company, its Promoters, Directors and Corporate Guarantors as "Wilful Defaulters" in accordance with the applicable regulatory framework. The Management of the Company has represented against the said declarations/classification and has taken appropriate steps before the concerned authorities/banks for reconsideration of the matter.

The Board further notes that the matter is under representation/review, and the Company is pursuing the same in accordance with the applicable laws and regulatory requirements.

Remark No.5:

During the previous financial year, the Company has deposited Rs.175 lacs in "non-lien account" with Indian Bank as a onetime settlement out of proposed amount of Rs. 22.81 crores including realization from auction of the above-mentioned properties.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors informed that, during the previous financial year, the Company deposited an amount of Rs. 175 lakhs in a "Non-Lien Account" maintained with Indian Bank, as part of the proposed One-Time Settlement ("OTS") of the Company's outstanding dues amounting to approximately Rs. 22.81 crores, which is proposed to be settled, inter alia, through the realization proceeds from the auction of the aforesaid properties.

The Board further stated that the amount deposited represents part payment towards the proposed settlement and that the Company is taking necessary steps for completion of the OTS process with the Bank, subject to the terms and conditions as may be finally agreed upon with the Bank.

Remark No.6:

Considering such factors and based on the evidence obtained during the audit, we have reassessed the Company's assessment of going concern. The audit evidence supports management's use of the going concern basis of accounting in the financial statements, and therefore, we find it appropriate. The financial statements reflect a reasonable and fair assessment in line with the available documentation.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board took note of the Auditor's assessment regarding the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. The Board considered the relevant circumstances, management's assessment, and the supporting documentation and evidence available in this regard.

After due consideration and deliberation, the Board concurred with management's assessment that the **going concern basis of accounting is appropriate** for the preparation of the financial statements. The Board further noted that, based on the information and evidence available, the financial statements present a reasonable and fair assessment of the Company's financial position and affairs.

The Board accordingly noted the Auditor's observations and confirmed that the financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis in accordance with the applicable accounting principles and available supporting evidence.

Remark No.7:

The Company had made aggregate provision of Rs. 3,953.81 lakhs for doubtful debtors (expected credit loss) as of March 31, 2026 relating to export sales. The Management has not approached RBI & FEMA for approval of writing off the said amount from books of accounts. In the absence of any information regarding penal consequences, we are unable to comment on the impact of the same on the profit or loss / net worth of the Company.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors has taken note of the observation made by the Statutory Auditors regarding the aggregate provision of Rs. 3,953.81 lakhs made towards doubtful debtors (Expected Credit Loss) as at 31st March, 2026, relating to export sales, and the matter concerning the requirement for obtaining necessary approval, if applicable, under the provisions of RBI and FEMA for writing off the said amount from the books of account.

The Management is in the process of reviewing the matter and evaluating the applicable regulatory requirements and the necessary course of action in consultation with its professional advisors. The Company shall take appropriate steps, including making necessary applications/representations to the concerned regulatory authorities, wherever required, in accordance with the applicable provisions of RBI and FEMA.

The Board is of the view that the provision for doubtful debts has been recognised in the books of account based on the Management's assessment of recoverability of the outstanding export receivables and in accordance with the applicable accounting principles. The Company will continue to take reasonable steps for recovery of the outstanding amounts and will comply with the applicable regulatory requirements in this regard.

Remark No.8:

During FY 22-23, there was a casual vacancy for Chief Financial Officer w.e.f. 1st December 2022. The Company is in process of appointing new Chief Financial Officer but couldn't appoint the same within the prescribed time limits of six months from the date of resignation and we are unable to comment on the impact of the penal consequences on the profit or loss / net worth of the Company.

Comment of Board of Directors:

During the Financial Year 2022-23, a casual vacancy arose in the office of the Chief Financial Officer ("CFO") of the Company with effect from 1st December, 2022. The Company initiated the process for appointment of a new CFO; however, the vacancy could not be filled within the prescribed period of six months from the date of such vacancy.

The Board of Directors acknowledges the non-compliance with the applicable statutory requirement and is taking necessary steps to appoint a suitable CFO at the earliest. The Board is presently unable to quantify or comment upon the impact, if any, of the penal consequences arising from such non-compliance on the profit or loss and/or net worth of the Company.

Remark No.9:

We draw attention to the financial statements, which disclose that VXL Instruments Limited (CIRP commencement date: 26.11.2024) and VXL Software Solutions Pvt. Ltd. (CIRP commencement date: 26.02.2025), both related parties, have initiated the Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016. This development may potentially affect the Company's financial position and its future transactions with these entities.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board has taken note of the matter highlighted by the Statutory Auditors regarding the commencement of the Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process ("CIRP") under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016 in respect of VXL Instruments Limited, with CIRP commencement date of 26th November, 2024, and VXL Software Solutions Private Limited, with CIRP commencement date of 26th February, 2025, both being related parties of the Company.

The Board is closely monitoring the developments in the CIRP proceedings and their potential impact on the Company's financial position and future transactions with the aforesaid entities. Based on the information and circumstances presently available, the Company is assessing the implications, if any, arising from the said proceedings. The Company will continue to comply with the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, and other applicable laws and regulations in relation to transactions with related parties.

Remark No.10:

The Company has recognized and provided notional interest aggregating to ₹357.05 lakhs during the year ended March 31, 2026, on accounts classified as Non-Performing Assets (NPA). The cumulative outstanding interest payable on such accounts amounts to ₹2,763.82 lakhs as of 31st March 2026.

However, the Company has not provided relevant bank statements pertaining to these NPA accounts, nor has it obtained confirmations from the respective banks regarding the applicable rate of interest, including penal interest, and the computation thereof.

In the absence of sufficient and appropriate audit evidence, we are unable to determine the accuracy and completeness of the interest provision recognized during the year as well as the correctness of the outstanding interest liability as of March 31, 2026.

Given the materiality and pervasive nature of the matter described above, the financial statements may be materially misstated in respect of finance costs and borrowings.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors has taken note of the observation made by the Statutory Auditors regarding the provision of notional interest amounting to ₹357.05 lakhs recognized during the year ended 31st March, 2026, and the cumulative outstanding interest liability of ₹2,763.82 lakhs as at 31st March, 2026, in respect of accounts classified as Non-Performing Assets (NPA).

The Board acknowledges that, due to certain constraints in obtaining the requisite bank statements and confirmations from the respective banks, the Company could not provide sufficient supporting documentation to the Statutory Auditors in respect of the applicable interest rates, including penal interest, and the computation thereof.

The Company has recognized the aforesaid interest provision based on the information and records available with the Company and the terms of the respective borrowing arrangements, wherever available. The Company is in the process of obtaining the requisite bank statements and confirmations from the concerned banks and shall reconcile the interest calculations and outstanding liabilities upon receipt of the same.

The Board further confirms that necessary adjustments, if any, arising from such reconciliation and confirmation from the respective banks shall be duly accounted for in the books of account in accordance with the applicable accounting standards.

The Board is of the view that the Company is taking appropriate steps to obtain the necessary supporting documents and resolve the matter at the earliest.

2) **INTERNAL AUDIT:**

The Board of Directors based on the recommendation of the Audit Committee has appointed M/s. Anand Mohril & Co., Cost Accountants as the Internal Auditor of your Company for the financial year 2025-2026.

The Internal Auditors are submitting their reports on quarterly basis.

The Company appointed M/s. Anand Mohril & Co., Cost Accountant as Internal Auditor of the Company on 29th May, 2025.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 204 of the Act and rules made there under, the Board has appointed M/s. SPRS & Co. LLP., Company Secretaries., to conduct Secretarial Audit of company for a period of 5 (Five) years from FY 2025-26 till FY 2029-30.

The Company has availed loans from the Director during the financial years 2021-22, 2022-23, 2023-24, 2024-25 and 2025-26. The Board acknowledges the observation regarding compliance with the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The Company is in the process of reviewing the relevant provisions and taking necessary steps to ensure compliance with the applicable requirements. The Board further confirms that appropriate measures shall be undertaken to ensure that such transactions are duly documented and comply with the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the rules made thereunder.

Remark No.2:

The Company has availed loan/ expenses paid by the Priya International Limited during FY 2023-24, FY 2024-25 & FY 2025-26, which is subject to compliance of provision of the Companies Act, 2013.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board notes the observation of the Statutory Auditors. The Company has availed certain loans/funding and has also had certain expenses paid on its behalf by Priya International Limited during the financial years 2023-24, 2024-25 and 2025-26. The transactions are subject to compliance with the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the rules made thereunder.

The management is in the process of reviewing the nature, terms and documentation of the aforesaid transactions and shall take appropriate steps to ensure compliance with the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, including making necessary disclosures, wherever applicable.

Remark No.3:

The Company has availed loan from Brent Properties Investments Pvt Ltd during FY 2025-26, which is subject to compliance of provision of the Companies Act, 2013.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors notes the observation regarding the loan availed by the Company from Brent Properties Investments Pvt. Ltd. during the financial year 2025-26. The Company acknowledges that the said transaction is required to be undertaken in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the rules made thereunder. The Board shall take necessary steps to ensure compliance with the applicable statutory requirements, including making the requisite disclosures and filings, wherever applicable.

Remark No.4:

The website of the Company is non-functional.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors acknowledges the observation regarding the non-functional website of the Company. The Board has taken note of the matter and has advised the management to take necessary steps to restore and operationalize the Company's website at the earliest, subject to availability of the necessary resources and funds, and to ensure that the website is maintained and updated in compliance with applicable statutory and regulatory requirements.

Remark No.5:

The events occurred during the period under the review are captured by the Company in the Structured Digit Database software after the occurrence of the event.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board takes note of the observation. The Company has been capturing and recording events occurring during the period under review in the Structured Digital Database (SDD) software subsequent to the occurrence of such events. The Company is in the process of strengthening its internal procedures to ensure that all relevant events are recorded in the SDD within the prescribed timelines and in accordance with the applicable provisions of the SEBI (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 2015.

Remark No.6:

Mr. Rakesh Kumar Jain has resigned as Chief Financial Officer of the Company with effect from 30th November, 2022. The vacancy caused due to resignation is required to be filled by the Company within six months from the resignation but vacancy is still not filled by the Company as of report date. Accordingly, the Company has not complied with the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the rules made thereunder.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors takes note of the resignation of Mr. Rakesh Kumar Jain from the position of Chief Financial Officer of the Company with effect from 30th November, 2022 and acknowledges the resultant vacancy in the office of Chief Financial Officer.

The Board further acknowledges that the vacancy has remained unfilled beyond the period prescribed under the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the rules made thereunder, and consequently, the Company has not been in compliance with the said provisions.

The Board is conscious of the importance of having a duly appointed Chief Financial Officer and is taking necessary steps to identify and appoint a suitable and qualified person to fill the vacancy at the earliest. The Board shall also take appropriate measures to ensure compliance with the applicable statutory requirements going forward.

Remark No.7:

The Company has made delay in the payment of listing fees of BSE Limited.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors acknowledges the delay in payment of the listing fees payable to BSE Limited. The delay was primarily due to the financial constraints and liquidity challenges faced by the Company during the year under review.

The Company is taking necessary steps to improve its financial position and liquidity and is making efforts to regularise the outstanding listing fees at the earliest. The Board is closely monitoring the matter and remains committed to ensuring timely compliance with the applicable listing requirements going forward.

Remark No.8:

Ms. Rajeshree Maruti Chougule (DIN: 10647042) served as the Company Secretary and Compliance Officer of the Company from April 2, 2019 to February 14, 2022. Subsequently, she was appointed as an Independent Director of the Company with effect from September 19, 2024, which is in contravention of the provisions of Section 149 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors has taken note of the observation regarding the appointment of Ms. Rajeshree Maruti Chougule (DIN: 10647042) as an Independent Director of the Company with effect from September 19, 2024, subsequent to her having served as the Company Secretary and Compliance Officer of the Company during the period from April 2, 2019 to February 14, 2022.

The Board acknowledges the regulatory observation in relation to the eligibility and appointment of Ms. Chougule as an Independent Director under Section 149 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the applicable provisions of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015. The Company is reviewing the matter in detail with its professional advisors and shall take appropriate corrective and regularisation measures, as may be applicable, in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the SEBI Listing Regulations.

The Board further confirms that necessary steps shall be taken to ensure that all future appointments and compliances relating to Independent Directors are undertaken after due verification of eligibility and in accordance with the applicable statutory and regulatory requirements.

Remark No.9:

The outcomes of certain Board of Directors' meetings were uploaded on the BSE portal beyond the prescribed timeline as stipulated under the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.

Comment of Board of Directors:

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors has taken note of the observation. The Company confirms that the intimations regarding closure of the Trading Window, as required under the SEBI (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 2015, were duly uploaded on the respective commencement dates of the closure of the Trading Window. The Company shall ensure strict adherence to the applicable regulatory requirements and prescribed timelines in respect of all future disclosures.

Neelambari P. Patil & Associates, Cost Accountants, as the Internal Auditors of the Company with effect from December 31, 2024. Further, the outcome for the aforesaid meeting has not been uploaded on the BSE portal.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors has taken note of the observation regarding the appointment of M/s. Anand Mohril & Co., Cost Accountants, as the Internal Auditors of the Company for the financial year 2024-25, specifically for the period from January 2025 to March 2025, pursuant to the resignation of M/s. Neelambari P. Patil & Associates, Cost Accountants, with effect from 31st December, 2024.

The Board further notes that the outcome of the Board Meeting held on 10th May, 2025 was inadvertently not uploaded on the BSE portal within the prescribed timeline. The omission was procedural in nature and was not intentional.

The Board has taken note of the matter and has directed the concerned officers to ensure strict compliance with the applicable provisions of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 and the requirements of the BSE portal, including timely submission and uploading of all necessary disclosures and outcomes of Board Meetings. The Company shall also take appropriate corrective measures, wherever feasible, to regularise the disclosure.

Remark No.13:

M/s. Anand Mohril & Co., Cost Accountants, were appointed as the Internal Auditors of the Company for the financial year 2025-26. Further, subject to the approval of the Members of the Company, M/s. SPRS And Co. LLP, Company Secretaries, were appointed as the Secretarial Auditors of the Company for a period of five financial years, commencing from FY 2025-26 to FY 2029-30. The aforesaid appointments were made pursuant to the resolutions passed by the Board of Directors at its meeting held on May 29, 2025. However, the disclosures pertaining to the aforesaid appointments were not included in the outcome of the said Board Meeting uploaded on the BSE portal.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors has taken note of the observation regarding the appointment of M/s. Anand Mohril & Co., Cost Accountants, as the Internal Auditors of the Company for the financial year 2024-25, specifically for the period from January 2025 to March 2025, pursuant to the resignation of M/s. Neelambari P. Patil & Associates, Cost Accountants, with effect from 31st December, 2024.

The Board further notes that the outcome of the Board Meeting held on 10th May, 2025 was inadvertently not uploaded on the BSE portal within the prescribed timeline. The omission was procedural in nature and was not intentional.

The Board has taken note of the matter and has directed the concerned officers to ensure strict compliance with the applicable provisions of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 and the requirements of the BSE portal, including timely submission and uploading of all necessary disclosures and outcomes of Board Meetings. The Board of Directors noted that the Company had received the consent letter and certificate from M/s. JM & Associates, Chartered Accountants, dated August 11, 2025, confirming their eligibility and willingness to act as the Statutory Auditors of the Company for a period of five consecutive financial years commencing from FY 2025-26 to FY 2029-30.

The Board further noted that M/s. JM & Associates, Chartered Accountants, were appointed as the Statutory Auditors of the Company for the aforesaid period, subject to the approval of the Members, pursuant to the resolution passed by the Board of Directors at its meeting held on May 29, 2025. The Board is of the view that the appointment is in the best interest of the Company and recommends the same for approval of the Members.

Remark No.15:

In certain cases, the Certificate under Regulation 74(5) were uploaded on the BSE portal beyond the prescribed timeline stipulated under the SEBI (Depositories and Participants) Regulations, 2018.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors acknowledges the observation regarding the delay in uploading certain Certificates under Regulation 74(5) of the SEBI (Depositories and Participants) Regulations, 2018, on the BSE portal within the prescribed timeline.

The delay was inadvertent and occurred due to certain administrative and procedural constraints. The Company has taken note of the matter and has strengthened its internal monitoring and compliance mechanism to ensure timely submission and uploading of such certificates within the prescribed timelines in future. The Board assures that necessary steps have been taken to avoid recurrence of such delays.

Remark No.16:

The Board of Directors notes that the Financial Results of the Company for the quarter ended 30th September, 2025 were not uploaded on the BSE portal under the "Results" section due to an inadvertent omission. The Company acknowledges the lapse and has taken note of the same. The Board has advised the concerned personnel to ensure that all applicable financial results and statutory disclosures are uploaded within the prescribed timelines and in accordance with the applicable regulatory requirements, going forward.

Remark No.17:

In certain cases, the Integrated Filing – Financials, comprising the Financial Results along with the Limited Review Report/Auditor's Report under Regulation 33(3)(a), Disclosure of Related Party Transactions under Regulation 23(9), and Statement of Deviation(s) or Variation(s) under Regulation 32(1), were submitted beyond the prescribed timelines stipulated under the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors acknowledges the observation regarding the delay in submission of certain Integrated Filings – Financials, including the Financial Results along with the Limited Review Report/Auditor's Report under Regulation 33(3)(a), Disclosure of Related Party Transactions under Regulation 23(9), and Statement of Deviation(s) or Variation(s) under Regulation 32(1) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.

The delays were primarily attributable to various administrative and operational constraints faced by the Company during the relevant periods, including delays in finalisation of financial information and compilation/verification of the requisite disclosures and supporting documents. The Company has taken note of the matter and is strengthening its internal compliance and reporting processes to ensure that all statutory and regulatory filings are made within the prescribed timelines in future.

The Board remains committed to ensuring timely compliance with all applicable provisions of the SEBI Regulations and other statutory requirements.

Remark No.18:

The Company did not provide QR Code in the newspaper publications of the financial results, as required under Regulation 47(1) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors acknowledges the observation regarding non-compliance with Regulation 47(1) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, relating to the non-provision of the QR Code in the newspaper publications of the financial results.

The Board has taken note of the matter and has advised the concerned officials to ensure strict compliance with the applicable provisions of the SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015, including the requirement relating to QR Code in future newspaper publications of financial results. The Company shall exercise due care and diligence to avoid recurrence of such non-compliance.

Remark No.19:

The Company has not published the newspaper advertisement regarding the special window for the transfer and dematerialisation of physical securities, as required under the applicable SEBI Circular.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board acknowledges the observation regarding non-publication of the newspaper advertisement in relation to the special window provided for transfer and dematerialisation of physical securities, as required under the applicable SEBI Circular.

The delay/non-compliance was inadvertent and occurred due to an oversight in the compliance process. The Company has taken note of the requirement and has initiated necessary steps to ensure compliance with the applicable provisions and issuance of the requisite newspaper advertisement. The Board has further advised the management to strengthen the compliance monitoring mechanism to ensure that such requirements are duly complied with within the prescribed timelines in future.

Remark No.20:

The Company has not dispatched the KYC letters to its physical shareholders, as required under the applicable SEBI Circulars.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board noted the observation regarding non-dispatch of KYC letters to the physical shareholders of the Company as required under the applicable SEBI Circulars. The Board has taken note of the matter and has advised the management to ensure that the requisite KYC letters are dispatched to all eligible physical shareholders at the earliest and that necessary steps are taken to ensure compliance with the applicable SEBI requirements within the prescribed timelines.

Remark No.21:

The Company has not dispatched letters to its physical shareholders containing the web link/path for accessing the Annual Report, as required under the applicable provisions.

Comment of Board of Directors:

The Board acknowledges the observation regarding non-dispatch of letters to the physical shareholders containing the web link/path for accessing the Annual Report. The non-compliance was inadvertent and occurred due to an oversight in the communication process. The Company has taken note of the matter and shall ensure that the requisite communication is duly made to the physical shareholders in accordance with the applicable provisions and within the prescribed timelines, going forward. The Board has also advised the concerned officials to strengthen the compliance and review mechanism to avoid recurrence of such instances.

The Company has stopped all its business activities due to blockage of bank accounts; total liabilities exceeds total assets by Rs. 5,198.17 Lakhs. During the FY 2020-21, the Company has also closed down all its branches except Mumbai branch, has written off/ sold fixed assets located at such branches and has also laid off maximum employees across all branches since the business operations are nil. Indian Bank, Bank of Maharashtra and Union Bank have declared the company, promoters, directors and corporate guarantors as willful defaulters, the management of the company has represented against the same. During the current period, the Bank has auctioned the properties situated at Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai. The Company has voluntarily handover the possession of one of the properties situated at Mumbai to the Bank. The company has again approached a consortium of three banks for one-time settlement letter dated November 26, 2024, discussion is in process. The company has deposited 1.75 crore in "No Lien Account" with Indian bank out of proposed Rs.22.81 crore as one-time settlement.

The Company has recognized and provided notional interest aggregating to ₹357.05 lakhs during the year ended March 31, 2026, on accounts classified as Non-Performing Assets (NPA). The cumulative outstanding interest payable on such accounts amounts to ₹2,763.82 lakhs as of 31st March 2026.

The total outstanding interest payable on such borrowings amounts to ₹ 2,763.82 lakhs as of March 31, 2026.*

The Company has accounted for such interest based on its internal estimates, in the absence of bank statements and balance confirmations from the respective lenders, including details relating to the applicable rate of interest and penal charges.

8. *As of March 31, 2026, the Company has Advance tax refund receivable amounting to Rs. 47.58 Lakhs pertaining to ten assessment years. As per Income tax records the same has been refunded to the company. In the absence of Bank statements in respect of NPA accounts, the Company is unable to record the amount of refunds received. Therefore, Statutory Auditor are unable to comment upon the closing balances of advance taxes and loans appearing in the books of accounts.*

12. *The Company has made default in payment of term loans availed from Bank of Maharashtra, Indian Bank and Union Bank of India. Further, as per audit report, the Company has been declared a wilful defaulter by the banks due to loans outstanding as mentioned above.*
13. *The future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.*

Notes to financial statements for the Year Ended March 31, 2026

1 Company Overview

Priya Limited ("the Company"), is a public limited Company domiciled in India and incorporated under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The Company's equity shares are listed on the bourses of The BSE Ltd. The Company engaged in the business of Trading in Electronics and Chemicals .

2 Significant Accounting Policies

This note provides a list of the significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

(A) Basis Of Preparation Of Financial Statement

i) Compliance with Ind AS

The financial statements Complies in all material aspects with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 as amended and notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the "Act") and other relevant provisions of the Act and other accounting principles generally accepted in India.

The financial statements were authorized for issue by the Company's Board of Directors on 28th May, 2026.

These financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees (INR), which is also the functional currency. All the amounts have been rounded off to the nearest lacs, unless otherwise indicated.

ii) Historical cost convention

The Company follows the mercantile system of accounting and recognizes income and expenditure on an accrual basis. The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, except in case of significant uncertainties and except for the following:

- (a) Certain financial assets and liabilities (Including Derivative Instruments) that are measured at fair value;
- (b) Defined benefit plans where plan assets are measured at fair value.
- (c) Investments are measured at fair value.

iii) Current and Non Current Classification.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013. Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realisation in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current – non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

(B) Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions in the application of accounting policies that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Continuous evaluation is done on the estimation and judgments based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively.

(C) Financial Instruments

A financial instrument is any contract that gives rise to a financial asset of one entity and a financial liability or equity instrument of another entity.

(I) Financial Assets

(i) Classification

The Company classifies its financial assets in the following measurement categories:

- (a) those to be measured subsequently at fair value (either through other comprehensive income, or through profit or loss); and
- (b) those measured at amortised cost.

The classification depends on the entity's business model for managing the financial assets and the contractual terms of the cash flows.

- (a) For assets measured at fair value, gains and losses will either be recorded in profit or loss or other comprehensive income.
- (b) For investments in debt instruments, this will depend on the business model in which the investment is held.
- (c) For investments in equity instruments, this will depend on whether the Company has made an irrevocable election at the time of initial recognition to account for the equity investment at fair value through other comprehensive income.

The Company reclassifies debt investments when and only when its business model for managing those assets changes.

(ii) Measurement

At initial recognition, the Company measures a financial asset at its fair value plus, in the case of a financial asset not at fair value through profit or loss, transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition of the financial asset. Transaction costs of financial assets carried at fair value through profit or loss are expensed in profit or loss.

(a) Debt instruments

Subsequent measurement of debt instruments depends on the Company's business model for managing the asset and the cash flow characteristics of the asset. There are three measurement categories into which the Company classifies its debt instruments:

Amortised cost: Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows where those cash flows represent solely payments of principal and interest are measured at amortised cost. A gain or loss on a debt investment that is subsequently measured at amortised cost and is not part of a hedging relationship is recognised in profit or loss when the asset is derecognised or impaired. Interest income from these financial assets is included in other income using the effective interest rate method.

Fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI): Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows and for selling the financial assets, where the assets' cash flows represent solely payments of principal and interest, are measured at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI). Movements in the carrying amount are taken through OCI, except for the recognition of impairment gains or losses, interest income and foreign exchange gains and losses which are recognised in profit and loss. When the financial asset is derecognised, the cumulative gain or loss previously recognised in OCI is reclassified from equity to profit or loss and recognised in other income or other expenses (as applicable). Interest income from these financial assets is included in other income using the effective interest rate method.

Fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL): Assets that do not meet the criteria for amortised cost or FVOCI are measured at fair value through profit or loss. A gain or loss on a debt investment that is subsequently measured at fair value through profit or loss and is not part of a hedging relationship is recognised in profit or loss and presented net in the statement of profit and loss within other income or other expenses (as applicable) in the period in which it arises. Interest income from these financial assets is included in other income or other expenses, as applicable.

(b) Equity instruments

The Company subsequently measures all equity investments at fair value. Where the Company's management has selected to present fair value gains and losses on equity investments in other comprehensive income and there is no subsequent reclassification of fair value gains and losses to profit or loss. Dividends from such investments are recognised in profit or loss as other income when the Company's right to receive payments is established.

Changes in the fair value of financial assets at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in other income or other expenses, as applicable in the statement of profit and loss. Impairment losses (and reversal of impairment losses) on equity investments measured at FVOCI are not reported separately from other changes in fair value.

(iii) Impairment of financial assets

The Company assesses on a forward looking basis the expected credit losses associated with its assets carried at amortised cost and FVOCI debt instruments. The impairment methodology applied depends on whether there has been a significant increase in credit risk.

For trade receivables only, the Company applies the simplified approach permitted by Ind AS 109 Financial Instruments, which requires expected lifetime credit losses (ECL) to be recognised from initial recognition of the receivables. The Company uses historical default rates to determine impairment loss on the portfolio of trade receivables. At every reporting date these historical default rates are reviewed and changes in the forward looking estimates are analysed.

For other assets, the Company uses 12 month ECL to provide for impairment loss where there is no significant increase in credit risk. If there is significant increase in credit risk full lifetime ECL is used.

(iv) Derecognition of financial assets

A financial asset is derecognised only when -

- (a) The Company has transferred the rights to receive cash flows from the financial asset or
- (b) retains the contractual rights to receive the cash flows of the financial asset, but assumes a contractual obligation to pay the cash flows to one or more recipients.

Where the entity has transferred an asset, the Company evaluates whether it has transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset. In such cases, the financial asset is derecognised. Where the entity has not transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset, the financial asset is not derecognised.

Where the entity has neither transferred a financial asset nor retains substantially all risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset, the financial asset is derecognised if the Company has not retained control of the financial asset. Where the Company retains control of the financial asset, the asset is continued to be recognised to the extent of continuing involvement in the financial asset.

(II) Financial Liabilities

(i) Measurement

Financial liabilities are initially recognised at fair value, reduced by transaction costs (in case of financial liability not at fair value through profit or loss), that are directly attributable to the issue of financial liability. After initial recognition, financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using effective interest method. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash outflow (including all fees paid, transaction cost, and other premiums or discounts) through the expected life of the financial liability, or, where appropriate, a shorter period, to the net carrying amount on initial recognition. At the time of initial recognition, there is no financial liability irrevocably designated as measured at fair value through profit or loss.

(ii) Derecognition

A financial liability is derecognised when the obligation under the liability is discharged or cancelled or expires. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as the de-recognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability. The difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in the statement of profit or loss.

(D) Financial guarantee contracts

Financial guarantee contracts are recognised as a financial liability at the time the guarantee is issued. The liability is initially measured at fair value and subsequently at the higher of the amount determined in accordance with Ind AS 37 Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets and the amount initially recognised less cumulative amortization, where appropriate.

(E) Segment Report

- (i) The company identifies primary segment based on the dominant source, nature of risks and returns and the internal organisation and management structure. The operating segments are the segments for which separate financial information is available and for which operating profit/loss amounts are evaluated regularly by the executive Management in deciding how to allocate resources and in assessing performance.
- (ii) The analysis of geographical segments is based on the areas in which major operating divisions of the Company operate.

(F) Inventories Valuation

Inventories are valued at lower of Cost and Net Realisable Value. Cost of traded goods is arrived at on FIFO basis.

(G) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash in hand, deposits with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purpose of presentation in the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents includes outstanding bank overdraft shown within current liabilities in statement of financial balance sheet and which are considered as integral part of company's cash management policy.

(H) Income tax, deferred tax and dividend distribution tax

The Income tax expense or credit for the year is the tax payable on the current year's taxable income based on the applicable income tax rate adjusted by changes in deferred tax assets and liabilities attributable to temporary differences and to unused tax losses.

Current and deferred tax is recognised in the profit and loss except to the extent it relates to items recognised directly in equity or other comprehensive income, in which case it is recognised in equity or other comprehensive income respectively.

(i) Current income tax

Current tax charge is based on taxable profit for the year. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that are enacted or substantively enacted, at the reporting date where the Company operates and generates taxable income. Management periodically evaluates positions taken in tax returns with respect to situations in which applicable tax regulation is subject to interpretation. It establishes provisions where appropriate on the basis of amounts expected to be paid to the tax authorities.

Current tax assets and tax liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to set off current tax assets against current tax liabilities and Company intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

(ii) Deferred tax

Deferred tax is provided using the liability method on temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements at the reporting date. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable income will be available against which the deductible temporary differences, unused tax losses, depreciation carry-forwards and unused tax credits could be utilised.

Deferred income tax is not accounted for if it arises from initial recognition of an asset or liability in a transaction other than a business combination that at the time of the transaction affects neither accounting profit nor taxable profit (tax loss).

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured based on the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period when the asset is realised or the liability is settled, based on tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at each reporting date and adjusted to reflect changes in probability that sufficient taxable profits will be available to allow all or part of the asset to be recovered.

Deferred income tax assets and liabilities are off-set against each other and the resultant net amount is presented in the Balance Sheet, if and only when, (a) the Company has a legally enforceable right to set-off the current income tax assets and liabilities, and (b) the deferred income tax assets and liabilities relate to income tax levied by the same taxation authority.

(I) Property, plant and equipment

- (i) Freehold land is carried at historical cost including expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the land.
- (ii) All other items of property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.
- (iii) Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. The carrying amount of any component accounted for as a separate asset is derecognised when replaced. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to profit or loss during the reporting period in which they are incurred.
- (iv) Cost of Capital Work in Progress ('CWIP') comprises amount paid towards acquisition of property, plant and equipment outstanding as of each balance sheet date and construction expenditures, other expenditures necessary for the purpose of preparing the CWIP for its intended use and borrowing cost incurred before the qualifying asset is ready for intended use. CWIP is not depreciated until such time as the relevant asset is completed and ready for its intended use.
- (v) Depreciation methods, estimated useful lives and residual value
 - (a) Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.
 - (b) Depreciation is provided on a pro rata basis on the written down method over the estimated useful lives of the assets which is as prescribed under Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. The depreciation charge for each period is recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss, unless it is included in the carrying amount of any other asset. The useful life, residual value and the depreciation method are reviewed at least at each financial year end. If the expectations differ from previous estimates, the changes are accounted for prospectively as a change in accounting estimate.
 - (c) Leasehold Land is depreciated over the period of the Lease.
- (vi) Tangible assets which are not ready for their intended use on reporting date are carried as capital work-in-progress.
- (vii) The residual values are not more than 5% of the original cost of the asset.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Estimated useful lives, residual values and depreciation methods are reviewed annually, taking into account commercial and technological obsolescence as well as normal wear and tear and adjusted prospectively, if appropriate.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount. These are included in profit or loss within other expenses or other income as applicable.

(J) Investment Property

Property that is held for return purpose or Capital appreciation and which is not occupied by the Company, is classified as Investing property. Investment property is measured at cost including related transaction cost and where applicable borrowing cost. Investment properties are depreciated at the same rate applicable for class of asset under Property, Plant and Equipment.

(K) Intangible assets

- (i) An intangible asset shall be recognised if, and only if: (a) it is probable that the expected future economic benefits that are attributable to the asset will flow to the Company and (b) the cost of the asset can be measured reliably.
- (ii) Computer software is capitalised where it is expected to provide future enduring economic benefits. Capitalisation costs include licence fees and costs of implementation / system integration services. The costs are capitalised in the year in which the relevant software is implemented for use. The same is amortised over a period of 3 years on straight-line method.

(L) Leases**(i) As a lessee**

The Company is complying with Ind AS 116 for the recognition, measurement, presentation and disclosure of leases for both lessees and lessors. It introduces a single, on-balance sheet lease accounting model for lessees.

(ii) As a lessor

Lease income from operating leases where the Company is a lessor is recognised in income on a straight-line basis over the lease term unless the receipts are structured to increase in line with expected general inflation to compensate for the expected inflationary cost increases. The respective leased assets are included in the balance sheet based on their nature.

(M) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Amounts disclosed as revenue are net of returns, trade discount, taxes and amounts collected on behalf of third parties. The Company recognises revenue as under:

Effective April 1, 2018, the Company has applied Ind AS 115 which establishes a comprehensive framework for determining whether, how much and when revenue is to be recognised. Ind AS 115 replaces Ind AS 18 Revenue and Ind AS 11 Construction Contracts. The Company has adopted Ind AS 115 using the cumulative effect method. The effect of initially applying this standard is recognised at the date of initial application (i.e. April 1, 2018). There are no material impact on revenue recognition by applying this standard.

(I) Sales**(i) The Company recognizes revenue from sale of goods when:**

- (a) The significant risks and rewards of ownership in the goods are transferred to the buyer as per the terms of the contract, which coincides with the delivery of goods.
- (b) The Company retains neither continuing managerial involvement to the degree usually associated with the ownership nor effective control over the goods sold.
- (c) The amount of revenue can be reliably measured.
- (d) It is probable that future economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Company.
- (e) The cost incurred or to be incurred in respect of the transaction can be measured reliably.
- (f) The company bases its estimates on historical results, taking into consideration the type of customer, the type of transaction and the specifics of each arrangement.

(II) Other Income**(i) Interest Income**

Interest income from debt instruments is recognised using the effective interest rate method. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the gross carrying amount of a financial asset. When calculating the effective interest rate, the group estimates the expected cash flows by considering all the contractual terms of the financial instrument (for example, prepayment, extension, call and similar options) but does not consider the expected credit losses.

(ii) Dividends

Dividends are recognised in profit or loss only when the right to receive payment is established, it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the dividend will flow to the group, and the amount of the dividend can be measured reliably.

(iii) Income from Annual maintenance contract services:

- (a) The amount of revenue can be measured reliably.
- (b) It is probable that future economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Company.
- (c) The stage of completion of the transaction at the end of the reporting period can be measured reliably.
- (d) The cost incurred for transaction and the cost to complete the transaction can be measured reliably.

(N) Employee Benefit**(i) Short-term obligations**

Liabilities for wages and salaries, including non-monetary benefits that are expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employees render the related service are recognised in respect of employees' services up to the end of the reporting period and are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liabilities are settled. The liabilities are presented as current employee benefit obligations in the balance sheet.

(ii) Other long-term employee benefit obligations

The liabilities for earned leave are not expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employees render the related service. They are therefore measured as the present value of expected future payments to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the end of the reporting period using the projected unit credit method. The benefits are discounted using the appropriate market yields at the end of the reporting period that have terms approximating to the terms of the related obligation. Remeasurements as a result of experience adjustments and changes in actuarial assumptions are recognised in profit or loss.

The obligations are presented as current liabilities in the balance sheet if the entity does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the reporting period, regardless of when the actual settlement is expected to occur.

(iii) Post-employment obligations

The group operates the following post-employment schemes:

(a) Defined benefit gratuity plan:

Gratuity and Leave encashment which are defined benefits are accrued based on actuarial valuation working provided by Independent actuary.

The liability or asset recognised in the balance sheet in respect of defined benefit gratuity plans is the present value of the defined benefit obligation at the end of the reporting period less the fair value of plan. The defined benefit obligation is calculated annually as per the report on independent actuary. The present value of the defined benefit obligation is determined by discounting the estimated future cash outflows by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have terms approximating to the terms of the related obligation. The net interest cost is calculated by applying the discount rate to the net balance of the defined benefit obligation and the fair value of plan assets. This cost is included in employee benefit expense in the statement of profit and loss. Remeasurement gains and losses arising from experience adjustments and changes in actuarial assumptions are recognised in the period in which they occur, directly in other comprehensive income. They are included in retained earnings in the statement of changes in equity and in the balance sheet.

(b) Defined Contribution plan:

Contribution payable to recognised provident fund which is defined contribution scheme is charged to Statement of Profit & Loss. The company has no further obligation to the plan beyond its contribution.

(O) Foreign currency translation

(i) Functional and presentation currency

Items included in the financial statements of the Company are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates ('the functional currency'). The financial statements are presented in Indian rupee (INR), which is Company's functional and presentation currency.

(ii) Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rates at the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at year end exchange rates are generally recognised in profit or loss. All the foreign exchange gains and losses are presented in the statement of Profit and Loss on a net basis within other expenses or other income as applicable.

(P) Borrowing Cost

- (i) Borrowings are initially recognised at fair value, net of transaction costs incurred. Borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Any difference between the proceeds (net of transaction costs) and the redemption amount is recognised in profit or loss over the period of the borrowings using the effective interest method. Fees paid on the establishment of loan facilities are recognised as transaction costs of the loan to the extent that it is probable that some or all of the facility will be drawn down. In this case, the fee is deferred until the draw down occurs. To the extent there is no evidence that it is probable that some or all of the facility will be drawn down, the fee is capitalised as a prepayment for liquidity services and amortised over the period of the facility to which it relates.
- (ii) Borrowings are classified as current financial liabilities unless the group has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. Where there is a breach of a material provision of a long-term loan arrangement on or before the end of the reporting period with the effect that the liability becomes payable on demand on the reporting date, the entity does not classify the liability as current, if the lender agreed, after the reporting period and before the approval of the financial statements for issue, not to demand payment as a consequence of the breach.

(Q) Earnings per share

(i) Basic earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing:

- the profit attributable to owners of the Company; and
- by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the financial year, adjusted for bonus elements in equity shares issued during the year.

(ii) Diluted earnings per share

Diluted earnings per share adjust the figures used in the determination of basic earnings per share to take into account:

- the after income tax effect of interest and other financing costs associated with dilutive potential equity shares; and
- the weighted average number of additional equity shares that would have been outstanding assuming the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

(R) Impairment of Assets

Intangible assets that have an indefinite useful life are not subject to amortization and are tested annually for impairment or more frequently if events or changes in circumstances indicate that they might be impaired. Other assets are tested for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use. For the purposes of assessing impairment, assets are grouped at the lowest levels for which there are separately identifiable cash inflows which are largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets (cash-generating units). Non-financial assets that suffered impairment are reviewed for possible reversal of the impairment at the end of each reporting period.

(S) Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets**(i) Provisions:**

Provisions are recognised when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. The expense relating to a provision is presented in the statement of profit and loss.

(ii) Contingent liabilities:

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the Company or a present obligation that is not recognised because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation. A contingent liability also arises in extremely rare cases where there is a liability that cannot be recognised because it cannot be measured reliably. The Company does not recognise a contingent liability but discloses its existence in the financial statements.

(iii) Contingent Assets: Contingent Assets are disclosed, where an inflow of economic benefits is probable.

(T) Investments

Equity investments are measured at fair value, with value changes recognised in Other Comprehensive Income, except for those mutual fund for which the Company has elected to present the fair value changes in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

(U) Trade receivables

Trade receivables are recognised initially at their fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment.

(V) Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Company prior to the end of financial year which are unpaid. Trade and other payables are recognised, initially at fair value, and subsequently measured at amortised cost using effective interest rate method.

(W) Operating Cycle

Based on the nature of products/activities of the Company and the normal time between acquisition of assets and their realisation in cash or cash equivalents, the Company has determined its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of classification of its assets and liabilities as current and non current.

(X) Rounding of amounts

All amounts disclosed in the financial statements and notes have been rounded off to the nearest Rupees Lacs (upto two decimals), unless otherwise stated as per the requirement of Schedule III (Division II).

The Board provides guiding principles for overall risk management, as well as policies covering specific areas such as credit risk, liquidity risk, and Foreign Exchange Risk effecting business operations. The company's risk management is carried out by the management as per guidelines and policies approved by the Board of Directors.

(A) Credit Risk

Credit risk is the risk that counterparty will not meet its obligations under a financial instrument or customer contract, leading to a financial loss. Credit risk encompasses the direct risk of default, risk of deterioration of creditworthiness as well as concentration risks. The Company is exposed to credit risk from its operating activities (primarily trade receivables), deposits with banks and loans given.

Credit Risk Management

The company's credit risk mainly from trade receivables as these are typically unsecured. This credit risk has always been managed through credit approvals, establishing credit limits and continuous monitoring the creditworthiness of customers to whom credit is extended in the normal course of business. The Company estimates the expected credit loss based on past data, available information on public domain and experience. Expected credit losses of financial assets receivable are estimated based on historical data of the Company. The company has provisioning policy for expected credit losses. There is no credit risk in bank deposits which are demand deposits. The credit risk is minimum in case of entity to whom loan has been given.

The maximum exposure to credit risk as at 31 March 2026 and 31 March 2025 is the carrying value of such trade receivables and advances to suppliers as shown in note 7 and note 11 respectively of the financials.

The management assessed that Cash and Cash equivalents, loans, other balances with Banks, trade receivables, trade payables and other current liabilities/assets approximate their carrying amounts largely due to the short-term maturities of these instruments.

33 Lease

The Company's leasing arrangements are in respect of office premises / warehouse. These leasing arrangements, which is mostly cancelable, range between 11 months to 3 years and are usually renewable by mutual consent at mutually agreed terms & conditions. The lease payment of Rs. NIL lakhs (Previous Year Rs. NIL lakhs) has been recognised as expenses in the statement of Profit & Loss under the Note No. 24 "Other Expenses".

- 34** The Company received notices under Sections 13(2) and 13(4) of the Securitization and Reconstruction of Financial Assets and Enforcement of Security Interest Act, 2002 from Indian Bank, Bank of Maharashtra, and Union Bank of India in October 2018, indicating that its accounts had been classified as Non-Performing Assets (NPA) and subsequently leading to symbolic attachment of its properties due to non-repayment of recalled amounts. As a result of blocked bank accounts, the Company ceased all business operations, and as of 31st March 2026, its total liabilities exceeded total assets by Rs. 4,463.55 lakhs. During FY 2020-21, the Company closed all branches except the Mumbai branch, disposed of fixed assets from the closed locations, and laid off the majority of its employees. The aforementioned banks have declared the Company, its promoters, directors, and corporate guarantors as willful defaulters, a classification which the management has formally contested. Properties located in Mumbai, Kolkata, and Chennai were auctioned by the banks, with voluntary possession handed over by the Company. In an effort to resolve the outstanding dues, the Company submitted one-time settlement proposals dated 26th November 2024 and 26th June 2025, and deposited Rs. 1.75 crore in a "No Lien Account" with Indian Bank against the proposed settlement amount of Rs. 22.81 crore. Additionally, properties of Brent Properties Investment Pvt. Ltd. and Cheshire Properties Investment Pvt. Ltd., invoked under corporate guarantees, were auctioned by Indian Bank for Rs. 4.56 crore each, which company became aware of the transactions through the respective Form 26AS statements. Furthermore, in the year, Company's properties invoked under collateral securities, were auctioned by Indian Bank for Rs. 9.03 crore, which company became aware of the transactions through the respective Form 26AS statements. In the financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2026, as it arises from non-recurring transactions relating to the disposal of property assets by bank.

- 35** The Company has incurred losses in the current year and as disclosed above, the Company has not recognised deferred tax assets due to lack of virtual certainty and because of that current year tax expense is Rs. NIL. Hence Tax Reconciliation Statement is not required to be disclosed in the current year.

- 36** During FY 22-23, there was a casual vacancy for Chief Financial Officer w.e.f. 30th November, 2022. The Company is in the process of appointing a new Chief Financial Officer but couldn't appoint the same within the prescribed time limits of six months from the date of resignation.
- 37** No proceeding has been initiated or pending against the Company for holding any benami property under the Benami Transactions (Prohibition) Act, 1988 (45 of 1988) and rules made there under.
- 38** The Company has no transaction with companies struck off under section 248 of the Companies Act, 2013 or section 560 of the Companies Act, 1956.
