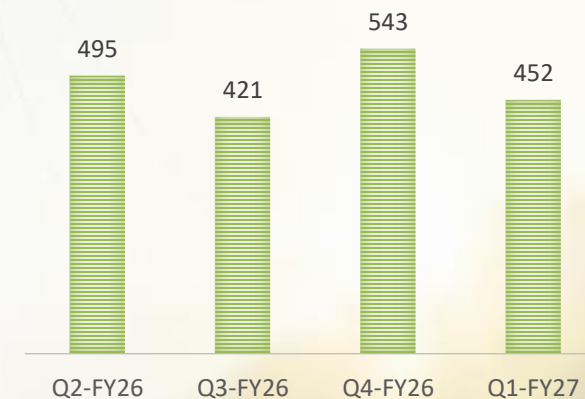
REVENUE FROM OPERATIONS (RS IN MN)

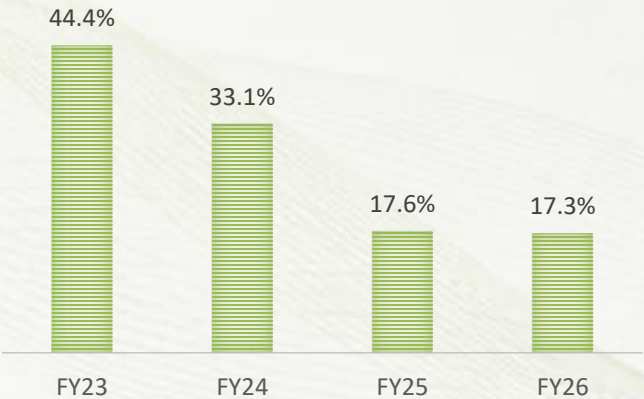

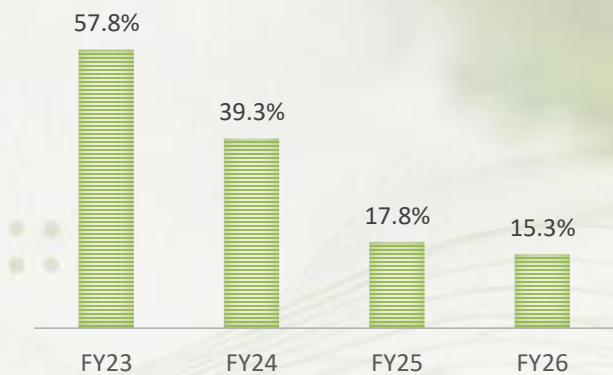
DEBT TO EQUITY

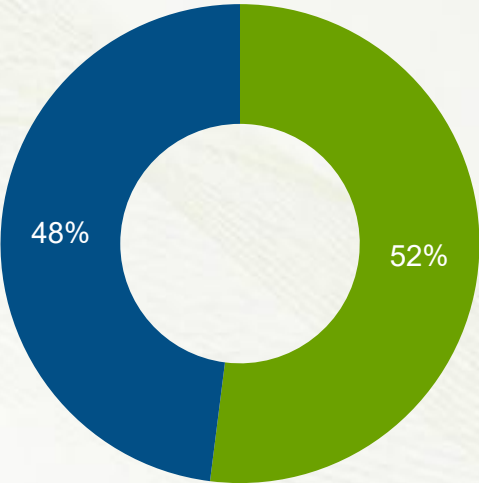

- **Solar:** India's installed solar capacity reached ~162 GW by June 2026, adding 26.3 GW in H1 2026 alone — a 43% YoY jump, led by Gujarat and Rajasthan.
- **Wind:** Cumulative wind capacity stands at 57.4 GW, with 2.9 GW added in H1 2026; Gujarat contributed 43% of new capacity.
- **BESS:** India's battery storage pipeline has crossed 92 GWh, backed by a ~₹5,400 crore VGF outlay (May 2026) for ~30 GWh of new capacity, as tariffs continue to fall sharply.

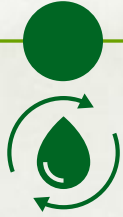
