1. The petitioner has filed this writ petition with the following prayer(s):

“Under the above circumstances, the petitioner most humbly prays that the Hon'ble Court be graciously pleased to issue a writ in the nature of writ of mandamus or any other appropriate writ, direction or order by directing the Opposite party No.1 to grant permanent recognition in favour of the petitioner's institution i.e. Women College, Kamakhyanagar and a direction to the Opposite party no.4 to grant permanent affiliation in favour of the petitioner's institution and to accept forms and fees of the students of the petitioner's institution to appear in the ensuing Annual Council of Higher Secondary Education, 1997 and to conduct the examination centre in accordance with the press Note published by the State Government vide Annexure-15A.

And for this act of kindness, as in duty bound, the petitioner shall ever pray.”



2. Learned Senior Counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that he has no instruction to argue this matter on behalf of the petitioner.

3. In view of the above submission of the learned senior counsel appearing for the petitioner and this matter being of the year 1997, this Court feels that the petitioner has lost its interest to pursue this matter further.

4. Hence, this writ petition stands dismissed for lack of instruction. As a result of disposal of the writ petition, all pending Misc. Case(s) shall stand disposed of.

5. However, learned counsel for the petitioner is at liberty to revive the writ petition within a period of three months, if any cause of action still survives.
