Rahul’s student outreach hits hurdle: Cong, BJP spar over Indore venue

LEADER OF Opposition Rahul Gandhi’sproposed “Chhatron Ki Goonj” programme in Indore has been postponed by a week after the Madhya Pradesh government denied the Congress permission to hold the event at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, giving the opposition a fresh political flashpoint with the Mohan Yadavgovernmenteven as the Congress seeks to turn education, examination irregularities and unemployment into a national electoral issue.

The programme, originally scheduled for September 12, will now be held on September 19 at a venue that the Congress is yet to finalise. On Wednesday, State Congress president Jitu Patwari announced that the programme was being postponed after a review of preparations. The party is seeking to mobilise around 50,000 students from Indore and surrounding areas.

The immediate dispute is over the Nehru Stadium, which is under the Indore Municipal Corporation. Congress leaders had sought to hire the centrally located stadium for the programme, arguing that “Chhatron Ki Goonj” was not a conventional political rally but an interaction with students on issues including education, employment and their future.

Patwari had written to Chief

Minister Mohan Yadav seeking permission for the September 12 programme, saying Rahul Gandhi’s event was “not a typical political event” but a public dialogue concerning “the future of the country, the dreams of youth, the right to education, and the security of the education system.”

Indore city Congress president Chintu Choukse had argued that the “Chhatron Ki Goonj” programme is not a political event and therefore “there is no question of Rahul Gandhi’s live concert not being allowed at Nehru Stadium”. He had said that if the ruling party nevertheless refused permission, “a student- and youth-opposed ruling party” would be responsible.

Choukse had also alleged

that an administrative refusal would reflect political pressure, saying: “If permission is not granted, it will be understood that administrative officials too are afraid of Rahul Gandhi’s movement and campaign under pressure from the ruling party, due to which the municipal corporation is objecting even to giving the Nehru Stadium on rent”.

The civic administration, however, has maintained that the decision is governed by existing restrictions on the use of the stadium. Municipal commissioner Kshitij Singhal had said that the administration would take a decision only after examining “the guidelines previously given by the High Court regarding any kind of programme at Nehru Stadium.”

Mayor Pushyamitra Bhargava subsequently said the Madhya Pradesh High Court had clearly stipulated that the stadium could be used for sports activities or state-level government programmes. The government’s position has therefore been that the issue is one of compliance with the court’s directions rather than opposition to Gandhi’s political programme.

The dispute comes as the Congress is expanding its campaign, using student interactions to raise questions about examination paper leaks, cost of education, government recruitment and unemployment.

The party has already held programmes in Kota in Rajasthan, Dehradun in Uttarakhand, Prayagraj in Uttar Pradesh and Pune in Maharashtra over the past three months. The campaign seeks to bring together concerns around education and employment, particularly those affecting students and candidates preparing for competitive examinations.

Party leaders say Madhya Pradesh is an important stop in that campaign. Indore is a major education centre and the Congress is seeking a large student turnout for Gandhi’s interaction. The event would bring the party’s national campaign on education, examinations and employment directly into a BJP-ruled state.

Allahabad HC dismisses plea against Rahul’s citizenship, cites lack of evidence

Lucknow: The Lucknow bench of the Allahabad High Court has dismissed as withdrawn a writ petition challenging Congress leader Rahul Gandhi’s Indian citizenship, observing that the petitioners failed to produce any document to substantiate the allegation that he was a British citizen. A bench of Justices Shekhar B Saraf and Abdhesh Kumar Chaudhary passed the order on Monday, which was made available on Wednesday.

The petition filed by Ashok Pande and Rajnish Kumar Singh, sought a writ of quo warranto, challenging Rahul’s right to continue as an MP from Rae Bareilly on the ground that he was allegedly a British national.

Singh alleged that Rahul had incorporated UK-based Backups Limited in 2003 and declared himself its director, major shareholder and a British national. When asked to substantiate, Singh could not produce any purported declaration by Rahul claiming British citizenship. The writ petition was dismissed as withdrawn. PTI

Modi calls for robust water data governance

PRIME MINISTER Narendra Modi on Wednesday called for robust water data governance and recommended the use of AI for data collection and analysis.

Chairing the valedictory session of the two-day National Departmental Summit on Water, organised by the Ministry of Jal Shakti, the Prime Minister also stressed on anticipatory and integrated planning to address water scarcity through suitable utilisation of treated water for agriculture and industrial purposes.

“Prime Minister called for robust water data governance, with water-sector data brought together, systematically managed, analysed and effectively utilised. He recommended the use of AI for data collection and analysis through a uniform format,” the PMO said in a statement.

It said the Prime Minister called for greater adoption of water-saving technologies. He also suggested dedicated exhibitions and workshops, including exposure to global best practices, to enable Indian manufacturers and stakeholders to develop and scale efficient solutions, the statement said.

Jaishankar allays JDU’s Farakka treaty concerns

THE NDA government at the Centre has assured its ally Janata Dal United (JDU) that it will take “an appropriate decision” on the Farakka treaty, bearing in mind Bihar’s drinking water and industrial water needs.

“We fully understand your concerns relating to Ganga Water Treaty,” External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar wrote in a letter to JDU national working president Sanjay Kumar Jha last week.

Jaishankar said inter-ministerial discussions were held under the aegis of the Jal Shakti Ministry and with various stakeholders so that the future of the treaty could be examined comprehensively “The Government will take an appropriate decision keeping these factors in mind”.

Reacting to the letter, Jha said, “We sincerely hope that any decision taken...will factor in Bihar’s interests fully and fairly...We are asking only for what our own scientific assessment establishes, so that 13 crore people are not left short of drinking water...for another 30 years.” The 1996 agreement for management of the river at Farakka completes its term this year.

Democratic structure in Shiv Sena established by Balasaheb altered by Uddhav: Shinde faction to SC

THE EKNATH Shinde-led faction told the Supreme Court on Wednesday that the organisational structure established by Shiv Sena founder Balasaheb Thackeray to prevent the concentration of power in the hands of the party chief and make it more “democratic” was significantly altered by Uddhav Thackeray in 2018.

A bench comprising Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justices Joymalya Bagchi and V Mohana was told by Senior Advocate Neeraj Kishan Kaul, appearing for the Shinde-led faction, that the party constitution was submitted to the Election Commission in 1999 after

the poll body directed all political parties to place their constitutions under review.

After the demise of Balasaheb Thackeray, the party proceeded to fundamentally alter that structure, Kaul submitted.

“One of the principal arguments sought to be raised is that ECI embarked and created



that party constitutions are democratic. Shiv Sena at some stage came and said that our constitution does not permit elections. ECI convinced Shiv Sena and amended constitution came into being. After that, suddenly in 2018, new constitution emerges,” Kaul said.

The Senior Advocate also submitted that Balasaheb Thackeray’s son Uddhav Thackeray amended the constitution and placed power in the hands of the party chief. He further argued that the party didn’t place the amended constitution on the commission’s record.

The hearing remained inconclusive and will continue on September 15.

Once rivals, now friends: MNS, KRV unite to fight ‘Hindi imposition’ on southern states

SETTING ASIDE a decade-long rivalry marked by fierce border disputes, the Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) and the Karnataka Rakshana Vedike (KRV) have formed a joint front against national political narratives, alleged Hindi imposition, and central tax disparities.

The two regional outfits met in Bengaluru on Tuesday after a 13-year hiatus, having last engaged officially in 2013 over the Railway Recruitment Board (RRB) exam language controversy, to establish a unified platform titled “Indian Languages Forum”.

An MNS delegation led by party leader Sandeep Deshpande met KRV chief T A Narayana Gowda and other office-bearers to draft a 10-point common minimum programme aimed at safeguarding regional language identity and state rights. The two organisations plan to host a national forum convention in New Delhi between October and November, and to extend invitations to representatives from Maharashtra, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Telangana, Puducherry, Goa, West Bengal, and Punjab.

“The Centre and national parties have been killing the interests of the South Indian states, be it in GST, language imposition or regional political parties. There is a sense of urgency for South Indian organisations to unite and fight it,” B Sannirappa, state chief secretary of KRV, said.

Further, Deshpande said that the MNS is also reaching out to regional political parties across southern India, including planned visits to Tamil Nadu.

During Tuesday’s meeting, both groups highlighted structural issues they argue disadvantage high-contributing states. Both Maharashtra and Karnataka contribute substantial revenue to the Centre but receive a disproportionately lower share in return. The forum will advocate for the rationalisation of central tax devolution.

Concerns were raised that the upcoming constituency delimitation based on population will further dilute political representation for states with lower population growth, leaving states like Uttar Pradesh and Bihar, with significantly higher numbers of

MPs compared to Maharashtra and Karnataka. Both groups agreed that MPs affiliated with national parties like the BJP and Congress fail to champion regional demands effectively.

KRV leaders cited recent narratives from the BJP as a threat, attempting to marginalise regional language politics and identity movements.

While the MNS and the KRV have clashed for more than two decades over regional supremacy, particularly regarding the border district of Belagavi, both the groups now agreed to prioritise their shared fight over regional identity.

KRV representatives stated they have “no objection” to people in Belagavi learning Marathi, provided they also learn Kannada given Belagavi’s official status as part of Karnataka.
