Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial results of Khandwala Securities Limited ("the Company") for the quarter ended March 31, 2026 and the year to date from April 01, 2025 to March 31, 2026 ("the statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 and Regulation 52 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("the Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Statement:

- i. is presented in accordance with the requirements of the Regulation 33 and 52 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- ii. gives a true and fair view **except for the effects of the matters described in the basis for qualified opinion section of our report** in conformity with the applicable Indian accounting standards ("Ind AS") prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"), as amended and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the standalone net profit/loss including other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company for the quarter ended March 31, 2026 and for the year ended March 31, 2026.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the standards on auditing ("SAs") specified under section 143(10) of the Act. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the standalone financial results section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the code of ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) together with the independence requirements that are relevant to our audit of the standalone financial results under the provisions of the Act and the rules made thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's code of ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the standalone financial statements. However we draw your kind attention to the following **qualifications** to the audit opinion of the financial statements produced as under:-

- 1. The Company had advanced application money towards purchase of shares of Rs 216.69 lakhs which is outstanding for a period of 288 months as at the end of the year. In the absence of information regarding the status of the allotment or the net worth of the entities in which the company made applications, we are unable to ascertain the extent to which an amount of Rs 216.69 lakhs is recoverable and accordingly, the effect thereof on the financial statements cannot be ascertained. However, it has been noted and confirmed after looking at relevant documents that at present the said matter is under litigation and pending for hearing before the Hon'ble High Court of Mumbai.*
- 2. Long-Term deposits of Rs 350.00 lakhs are subject to subsequent adjustments. We are unable to ascertain the recoverability of these amounts, as the Company has not made any provisions for the same in the standalone financial statements.*

Board of Director's Responsibility for the Standalone Financial Results

These financial results have been prepared on the basis of the audited standalone annual financial statements of the Company. The Management and the Board of Directors of the Company are responsible for the preparation and presentation of these standalone financial results that give a true and fair view of the net profit/loss including other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company in accordance with the Ind AS prescribed under Section 133 of the Act as amended read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 and 52 of the Listing Regulations. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; the selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the standalone financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the standalone financial results, the management and the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the management and the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Management and the Board of Directors are responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the standalone financial results as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these standalone financial results.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the standalone financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal financial controls relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. Under section 143(3)(i) of the Act, we are also responsible for expressing our opinion on whether the Company has adequate internal financial controls system in place and the operating effectiveness of such controls.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management and the board of directors.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the board of director's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the standalone financial results or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the standalone financial results, including the disclosures, and whether the standalone financial results represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

Other Matters

The Statement includes the results for the quarter ended March 31, 2026 being the balancing figure between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year ended March 31, 2026 and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the third quarter of the current financial year, which were subject to a limited review by us, as required under the Listing Regulations.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.




