O R D E R

1. We have heard Mr. Mukul Rohatgi, learned Senior Counsel for the petitioners.
2. Regardless of the impugned order dated 09.09.2026, declining *ad interim* injunction to the petitioners, we are inclined to grant them one more opportunity. To this effect, if the petitioners deposit an additional sum of Rs.3 crores with the High Court of

Bombay, without prejudice to the legal rights of the parties, the High Court may direct the parties to maintain *status quo* re: subject property comprising the residential flat.

3. The High Court will entertain the second application for *interim* relief only when the petitioners deposit the above-stated amount with the Registry of the High Court.

4. The Special Leave Petition is, accordingly, disposed of.

5. All pending applications, if any, also stand disposed of.
