01. 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical) Mode.

2. At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner contended that the present Writ Petition be confined to Petitioner No.1 only and liberty be given to file separate Writ Petitions in respect of other petitioners. Such prayer is allowed.

3. Heard learned counsel for the Parties.

4. Petitioner has filed the present Writ Petition with the following prayer:-

“In the facts and circumstances of the case, the humble petitioners fervently pray this Hon'ble Court to



be graciously pleased to issue notice to the Opp. parties, call for the relevant records and after hearing the counsel of the parties, issue a writ in the nature of mandamus or any other appropriate writ commanding the Opp. parties particularly the Opp. party No. 2, IDCO to regularize the service of the petitioners retrospectively with continuity of service and financial benefits like that of DLR/CLR employees regularized vide order No. 3761 dated 07.02.2026 of the Opp. party No.2, IDCO within a stipulated period.

And/or pass such other order/direction as deems fit and proper in the interest of justice.”

4. However, taking into account the claim raised in the present Writ Petition, liberty is granted to the Petitioner No.1 to make a detailed representation before Opp. Party No.2 by enclosing all the relevant documents and citations in support of his claim, if any, within a period of three weeks hence.

5. It is observed that if such a representation is filed within the aforesaid period, Opp. Party No.2 shall do well to take a lawful decision on the same within a period of three months from the date of receipt of such representation. The order so passed by the Opp. Party No.2 be communicated to the Petitioner No.1 within the aforesaid time period.

6. With the aforesaid observation and direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of.
