UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1. In the present case, initially a writ petition was preferred before the High Court of Delhi at New Delhi i.e. Writ Petition (Civil) No. 5608/2026, and the proceedings

were stayed by the learned Single Judge on 24.04.2026. The Union of India thereafter, has filed LPA No. 336/2026 in the matter and the same was decided on 26.05.2026, vacating the interim order granting by the learned Single Judge.

2. In the meanwhile, the Estate Officer has passed eviction order on 11.08.2026 and thereafter, an appeal has been preferred in the matter before the District Judge/appellate authority and at the same time, the present Special Leave Petition has also been filed on 13.08.2026.

3. The facts remain that appeal is pending before the District Judge/appellate authority. Learned Senior counsel appearing for the petitioner has informed this Court that because of the pendency of the present appeal, the learned District Judge/appellate authority has not decided the application for grant of stay and from tomorrow onwards, the courts are closed for three days.

4. In the considered opinion of this Court, as an appeal has been preferred in the matter, we do not find any reason to interfere in the present Special Leave Petition. However, the appellate authority shall decide the application without being influenced by the order passed by the learned Single Judge as well as by the Division Bench, in accordance with law.

5. So far as the application for grant of interim relief is concerned, the same is pending before the District Judge/appellate authority, and the parties are

given liberty to approach the District Judge/appellate authority today itself for preponement of hearing and the appellate authority shall be free to pass appropriate order in accordance with law.

6. With the aforesaid observations, the present Special Leave Petition stands dismissed.

7. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
