A W A R D

- 1.** As of now the settlement has not been entered into between the parties.
- 2.** Learned counsel appearing for the parties in chorus have submitted that they are agreeable for resolution of the dispute. In furtherance of the same, respondent No.2 – Insurance Company, namely, the insurer of the offending vehicle, whose policy issued to the offending vehicle is not in dispute, has offered a sum of Rs.8,00,000/- as lumpsum which would be in addition to the compensation awarded by the High Court. The said offer is accepted by the petitioner – claimant. Accordingly, their statements are taken on record. The said enhanced compensation, namely, Rs.8,00,000/- shall be deposited before

the jurisdictional Tribunal within eight weeks from today. On such deposit being made, the petitioner – claimant would be at liberty to withdraw the same.

3. The petitioner – claimant is at liberty to furnish the bank details to transfer the amount through NEFT / RTGS, if she so desires.

4. Learned counsel for the parties state that award may be passed in terms of settlement arrived at before the Special Lok Adalat.

5. Registry to draw the award accordingly.

6. The special leave petition is disposed of in terms of the aforestated settlement.
