UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1. Delay condoned.
2. The petitioner is aggrieved by the interim order dated 26.03.2026 passed by the High Court in Arbitration Appeal

No.18 of 2024 preferred by the Union against the order passed by the Commercial Court, Bareilly in Section 34 proceedings.

3. We take notice of the fact that the appeal pending before the High Court is under Section 37 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. There is an Arbitral Award in favour of the petitioner. Section 34 application also came to be dismissed.

4. The only grievance of the petitioner is that although 50% of the Arbitral Award has been deposited by the Union, yet the same has not been permitted to be withdrawn or disbursed in their favour and the matter is not proceeding further before the High Court.

5. It shall be open for the petitioner to request the Court concerned to permit the withdrawal of the 50% amount deposited by the Union, subject to terms and conditions that the Court may deem fit to impose and, at the same time, we also request the High Court to see that the Arbitration Appeal No.18 of 2024 is taken up for hearing at the earliest and the same is disposed of within a period of two months from today.

6. Mr. Kanakamedala Ravindra Kumar, the learned ASG as well as Mr. Raghavendra Shankar, the learned ASG appearing for the Union have assured that they will extend full cooperation in effective and expeditious disposal of the appeal before the High Court.

7. With the aforesaid, the Special Leave Petition stands disposed of.

8. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
