1. Pursuant to the General Circular No. 10/2022 dated December 28, 2022, issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) and Circular SEBI/HO/CFD/PoD-2/P/CIR/2023/4 dated January 5, 2023 issued by SEBI (hereinafter collectively referred to as “the Circulars”), companies are allowed to hold AGM through VC, without the physical presence of members at a common venue. Hence, in compliance with the Circulars, the AGM of the Company is being held through VC/OAVM and the registered office of the Company shall be deemed to be the venue for the AGM.

4. EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

PURSUANT TO SECTION 102 OF THE COMPANIES ACT, 2013

The following Statement sets out all material facts relating to the Special Business mentioned in the Notice:

SPECIAL BUSINESS

ITEM NO.04 The Board of Directors of the Company at its meeting held on 30th July, 2026 subject to the approval of Members, re-appointed Mr. Manoj R. Patel as a Managing Director for a further period of 5 years with effect for 30th July, 2026. The approval of the members is being sought to the terms, conditions and stipulations for the re-appointment of Mr. Manoj R. Patel as a Managing Director and the remuneration payable to him. Broad particulars of the terms of re-appointment of and remuneration payable to Mr. Manoj R. Patel as a Managing Director, are as under:

1. Salary up to Rs. 1,00,000/- (Rs. One Lacs only) per month as consolidated.

2. Commission in addition, to the salary, Mr. Manoj R. Patel shall be entitled to receive commission on net profits. The commission payable to him will be determined by the Board and/or the Nomination and Remuneration Committee of the Board for each financial year. The overall remuneration including commission to him shall not exceed 5% of the net profits of the Company for each financial year or part thereof to be computed in the manner referred to under Section 197 of the Act and other applicable provisions thereof, or any statutory modification(s) or re- enactment thereof.

3. Perquisites & Allowances

I. House Rent Allowance in accordance with the rules of the Company.

II. Medical Reimbursement: Reimbursement of Medical Expenses incurred by him for self and family subject to the ceiling of Rs. 1,00,000/- (Rs. One Lac Only) in a year.

III. Leave Travel Allowance: Leave Travel Allowance for him and his family, once in a year up to a sum of Rs. 40,000/-(Rs. Forty Thousand only) per year, incurred in accordance with the rules of the Company.

IV. Car and Telephone: Provision of car for use on Company's business and telephone, mobile and communication facilities like Internet shall not be considered as perquisites. Reimbursement of other business related expenses not to be considered as perquisites.

4. General:

(i) The Managing Director will perform his duties as such with regard to all work of the Company and he will manage and attend to such business and carry out the directions given by the Board from time to time in all respects and confirm to and comply with all such directions and regulations as may from time to time be given and made by the Board and his functions will be under the overall authority of the Board of Directors.

(ii) The Managing Director shall adhere to the Company's Code of Business Conduct and Ethics for Directors and Management personnel.

(iii) Mr. Manoj R. Patel satisfy all the conditions set out in Part-I of Schedule V to the Act for being eligible for the re- appointment. Mr. Manoj R. Patel, the appointee and Mr. Rajeev R. Patel are related parties and hence should be considered as interested parties in the proposed resolution.

Save and except the above, none of the other Directors/ Key Managerial Personnel of the Company/ their relatives are, in any way, concerned or interested, financially, or otherwise, in the resolution.

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THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR MEMBERS FOR REMOTE E-VOTING AND JOINING GENERAL MEETING ARE AS UNDER: -

- i. The voting period begins on Sunday, 06th September, 2026 at 9:00 A.M. IST and ends on Wednesday, 09th September, 2026 at 5:00 P.M. During this period shareholders of the Company, holding shares either in physical form or in dematerialized form, as on the cut-off date (record date) of 1st September, 2026 may cast their vote electronically. The e-voting module shall be disabled by Bigshare for voting thereafter.
- ii. Shareholders who have already voted prior to the meeting date would not be entitled to vote at the meeting venue.
- iii. Pursuant to SEBI Circular No. **SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD/CIR/P/2020/242 dated 09.12.2020**, under Regulation 44 of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, listed entities are required to provide remote e-voting facility to its shareholders, in respect of all shareholders' resolutions. However, it has been observed that the participation by the public non-institutional shareholders/retail shareholders is at a negligible level.

Currently, there are multiple e-voting service providers (ESPs) providing e-voting facility to listed entities in India. This necessitates registration on various ESPs and maintenance of multiple user IDs and passwords by the shareholders.

In order to increase the efficiency of the voting process, pursuant to a public consultation, it has been decided to enable e-voting to **all the demat account holders, by way of a single login credential, through their demat accounts/ websites of Depositories/ Depository Participants**. Demat account holders would be able to cast their vote without having to register again with the ESPs, thereby, not only facilitating seamless authentication but also enhancing ease and convenience of participating in e-voting process.

- iv. In terms of **SEBI circular no. SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD/CIR/P/2020/242 dated December 9, 2020** on e-Voting facility provided by Listed Companies, Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode are allowed to vote through their demat account maintained with Depositories and Depository Participants. Shareholders are advised to update their mobile number and email Id in their demat accounts in order to access e-Voting facility.

1. Electricity deposit having balance of Rs. 2,14,16,973/- as on the period ended on 31st March, 2026, the accrued interest income is not accounted as the amount is paid under protest and management is not sure about the outcome of the appeal.
2. The Management has sold all the lands and they are of the opinion of starting a new business from the proceeds of sale of land, but yet no detailed plan or business type is informed to us by management. Hence there is significant doubt on the going concern of the entity.
3. There are trade payable / other payable of which is still unpaid by the entity till year end 31st March, 2026
4. Long term borrowings from inter corporate which is subject to confirmations.
5. Entity has closed down the operation and sold all the assets and demolished the existing structure but yet not refunded the security deposit of M.K Printpack Pvt LTD (electricity deposit) till year end 31st March 2026.

EXPLANATIONS OR COMMENTS BY THE BOARD ON EVERY QUALIFICATION

In the recent audit of our financial statements for the FY 2025-26, the auditors raised certain qualifications as mentioned in above Auditors Report point related to specific aspects of our financial reporting. Our comments to the auditor's qualifications are as follows:

1. Electricity Deposit has been paid under protest as we have matter pending before the Honorable High Court of Gujarat which the Management is confident of getting judgment in its favor and will be eligible for refund of this amount with additional interest till receipt date.
2. Management is in the process of identifying uses of funds to enter new businesses directly or through joint ventures to enhance shareholder value. The process of identifying value enhancing business opportunities keeping the company's conservative profile may take additional time and the management is of the opinion that the company is hence a going concern.
3. Management has verified that all the above liabilities (Part 3 and Part 4) are payable and the company is in the process of making final payments to all the parties after reconciliations. The electricity deposit mentioned (Part 5) is held as a security deposit against the sub judice matter in High Court of Gujarat and will be resolved upon judgment

20. STATUTORY AUDITOR

Pursuant to Sections 139, 141, 142 and all other applicable provisions, if any, of the Companies Act, 2013, read with the Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014, (including any statutory modification(s) or re-enactment thereof) and pursuant to the recommendations of the audit committee and the Board of Directors of the Company, M/s M I SHAH And Co., Chartered Accountants (Firm Registration No. 119025W) are proposed to be appointed as auditors for a period of one year commencing from the conclusion of this AGM till the conclusion of the AGM to be held in the year 2026.

Terms of reference:

The present terms of reference of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee is aligned as per the provisions of Section 178 of the Companies Act, 2013 and include the roles as laid out in Part D Para (A) of Schedule II of the SEBI Listing Regulations. The brief description of the terms of reference of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee in line with the Companies Act, 2013 and the SEBI Listing Regulations are as follows:

1. Formulation of the criteria for determining qualifications, positive attitudes and independence of a director and recommend to the Board a policy, relating to the remuneration for the Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, and other employees

- f. Fulfilment of functions: Whether the Independent Director understands and fulfils the functions as assigned to him/ her by the Board and the law (e.g. Law imposes certain obligations on Independent Directors).
- g. Ability to function as a team: Whether the Independent Director is able to function as an effective team- member
- h. Initiative: Whether the Independent Director actively takes initiative with respect to various areas.
- i. Availability and attendance: Whether the Independent Director is available for meetings of the Board and attends the meeting regularly and timely, without delay
- j. Commitment: Whether the Independent Director is adequately committed to the Board and the entity
- k. Contribution: Whether the Independent Director contributed effectively to the entity and in the Board meetings

3. Stakeholders Grievances Committee

Report on Audit of the Financial Statements**Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of **Vapi Enterprise Limited** (the “Company”) which comprise the Balance sheet as at 31 March 2026, and the statement of profit and loss (including other comprehensive income), statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Indian Accounting Standards prescribe under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015, as amended, (“Ind AS”) and accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31 March 2026, and its profit, total comprehensive profit its cash flow and changes in equity for the year ended on that date.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs), specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act 2013. Our responsibilities under the Standards are further described in the ‘Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statement’ section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules there under, and we have fulfilled our ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. Emphasis of Matters Paragraph :

- i. The following accounting standard is not complied by the company:
 - a. Indian Accounting Standard (Ind AS-19) on “Employee Benefits”; regarding non-provisioning of employee benefits.
- ii. We are unable to form an opinion about the obligations of:
 - a. We draw attention to Note No. 19 to the financial statements regarding the

deposit against electricity department's demand matter amounting to ₹ **2,14,04,744/-** as at **31 March 2026**, representing amounts paid under protest in connection with an appeal pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Gujarat. Pending the final outcome of the litigation, the management has not recognized any interest income on such deposit considering the uncertainty relating to the outcome of the appeal. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

- b. We draw attention to Note No. 21 to the Financial Statements regarding the sale of the Company's factory land and management's ongoing efforts to identify new business opportunities, markets, projects and partnerships for deployment of the proceeds arising from such sale. As at the date of this report, no definitive business plan has been finalized or communicated. However, considering the explanations provided by the management and the positive net worth position of the Company as at 31 March, 2026, the management has prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis. Nothing has come to our attention indicating that the use of the going concern assumption by management is inappropriate. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

The effect of the above on assets and liabilities, as well as Profit and Reserves is not ascertainable.

iii. **Long Term Inter Corporate Borrowings:**

We draw attention to Note No. 30 to the Financial Statements regarding long-term borrowings amounting to ₹47,48,076/- from companies in which one of the Directors of the Company has an interest. Balance confirmations in respect of such borrowing has been obtained and management has represented that the amount continues to be payable. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

iv. **Security deposit of Rs. 12,00,000/- :**

This security deposit is towards premises taken on rent from M.K. Principal Pvt. Ltd. in year 2013. This Deposit is related to the DGVCL Appeal case discussed at point 20 of the notes to accounts. As informed by the management, the said amount are payables related to operations of the Company and will be settled upon conclusion of the case, this balance funds shall be released. Accordingly, we have not modified our opinion in this regard.

Key Audit Matters

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR THE YEAR ENDED ON 31ST MARCH, 2026

Note 1: Significant accounting policies

a. Corporate Information

Vapi Enterprise Limited (Formerly known as Vapi Paper Mills Limited) is currently having treasury income as a major source of income as the Company has deployed all of its surplus funds in Bank FDRs in view of the fact that the Company is looking for proper business opportunities.

The Company is a public limited company incorporated and domiciled in India. The address of its corporate office is 213, Udhog Mandir No. 1, 2nd Floor, 7/C, Pitamber Lane, Mahim- West, Mumbai -400 016.

b. Basis of preparation

These financial statements are prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standard (Ind AS), under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis. The Ind AS are prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with Rule 3 of the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and relevant amendment rules issued thereafter. However, amendment to Ind AS 116 does not have any impact on the amounts recognized in current year.

Accounting policies have been consistently applied except where a newly issued accounting standard is initially adopted or a revision to an existing accounting standard requires a change in the accounting policy hitherto in use.

c. Estimates and Judgements

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Ind AS requires the Management to make estimates, judgments and assumptions. These estimates, judgments and assumptions affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the period.

d. Foreign Currency Transactions

- i. Foreign Currency Transactions are recorded on the basis of the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transaction.
- ii. Non-monetary items which are carried at historical cost denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction.
- iii. Monetary items which are denominated in foreign currency are restated at the exchange rates prevailing at the Balance Sheet date.
- iv. Profit/ loss on translation thereon is credited or charged to the Profit and Loss Account except in case of long-term liabilities, where they relate to acquisition of Fixed Assets, in which case they are adjusted to carrying cost of such assets.

e. Revenue recognition

The Interest and dividend income is recognized based on establishment of the right to receive such income. The interest income is recognized on accrual basis

f. Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment represent a significant proportion of the asset base of the Company. The charge in respect of periodic depreciation is derived after determining an estimate of an asset's expected useful life and the expected residual value at the end of its life. The useful lives and residual values of Company's assets are determined by the Management at the time the asset is acquired and reviewed periodically, including at each financial year end. The lives are based on historical experience with similar assets as well as anticipation of future events, which may impact their life.

Depreciation methods, estimated useful lives and residual value

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and impairment, if any. Costs directly attributable to acquisition are capitalized until the property, plant and equipment are ready for use, as intended by the Management. The Depreciation is calculated on written down value (WDV) method to allocate their cost, net of their residual values, over their estimated useful lives. Depreciation is provided based on useful life of the assets as prescribed in Schedule II to Companies Act, 2013.

Impairment

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period. Reversal of impairment loss recognized in prior years is recorded when there is an indication that the impairment losses recognized for the assets no longer exist or have decreased.

g. Income Taxes

Income tax expense comprises current and deferred income tax. Income tax expense is recognized in net profit in the Statement of Profit and Loss except to the extent that it relates to items recognized directly in equity.

- i. Current income tax for current and prior periods is recognized at the amount expected to be paid to or recovered from the tax authorities, using the tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the Balance Sheet date.
- ii. Deferred income tax assets and liabilities are recognized for all temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realized. A deferred income tax asset is recognized to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profit will be available against which the deductible temporary differences and tax losses can be utilized.

h. Investments and Financial Assets

POLICY CHANGED: Investment in quoted mutual fund units (UTI Units) is now measured at Fair Value Through Profit or Loss (FVTPL) as required under Ind AS 109 - Financial Instruments. Previously, the policy stated investments at cost with provision for other-than-temporary diminution.

Financial Assets – Classification and Measurement

The Company classifies its financial assets into the following measurement categories in accordance with Ind AS 109 – Financial Instruments:

- (i) Financial Assets measured at Amortised Cost: Financial assets held within a business model whose objective is to hold assets in order to collect contractual cash flows and where the contractual terms give rise to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest are measured at amortised cost. Bank fixed deposits (FDRs) and interest receivables fall under this category.
- (ii) Financial Assets measured at Fair Value Through Profit or Loss (FVTPL): Financial assets not qualifying for amortized cost or FVOCI measurement are classified at FVTPL. Quoted investments in mutual fund units (UTI Units) are mandatorily classified at FVTPL as their cash flows are not solely payments of principal and interest.

Recognition and Measurement of FVTPL Investments:

- Quoted investment in UTI Units (5,000 units) is initially recognised at transaction price.
- Subsequently measured at Net Asset Value (NAV) at each reporting date.
- Changes in fair value (unrealized gains/losses) are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss under 'Fair Value Gain/(Loss) on Financial Assets'.
- Transaction costs on FVTPL instruments are expensed as incurred.
- For FY 2025-26: Fair value as at 31.03.2026 = Rs. 8,87,545 (NAV Rs. 177.5089 x 5,000 units); Fair value as at 31.03.2025 = Rs. 9,94,505 (NAV Rs. 198.901 x 5,000 units); carrying value as at 31.03.2025 under old policy = Rs. 50,000 (at cost); Unrealised Fair Value Gain recognised in P&L for FY 2025-26 = Rs. 8,37,545.

i. Inventories

Inventories of stock in process, finished goods and raw materials have been valued at lower of cost or net realizable value. Inventory of stores and spares are stated at cost.

j. Employee Benefits

The company accounts for leave encashment benefits, bonus and gratuity based on an estimated actual provision.

k. Borrowing Cost

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition / construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is an asset that requires a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are recognized as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

l. Provisions and Contingencies

A provision is recognized if, as a result of a past event, the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation that is reasonably estimable, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. Provisions are determined by discounting the expected future cash flows at a pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the liability.

Contingent liability is a possible obligation arising from past events and whose existence will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the entity or a present obligation that arises from past events but is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation or the amount of the obligation cannot be measured with sufficient reliability.

m. Fair Value Measurement (Ind AS 113)

NEW POLICY ADDED: Ind AS 113 – Fair Value Measurement is applicable to the Company in the context of its FVTPL investment in quoted UTI Units. This policy governs how fair value is determined and disclosed.

The Company measures financial instruments at fair value at each reporting date. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value measurement is based on the presumption that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability takes place either:

- (i) In the principal market for the asset or liability; or
- (ii) In the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market for the asset or liability accessible to the Company.

The principal or the most advantageous market must be accessible by the Company.

Fair Value Hierarchy

All assets and liabilities for which fair value is measured or disclosed in the financial statements are categorized within the fair value hierarchy, described as follows, based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement as a whole:

Level 1 – Quoted (unadjusted) market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 – Valuation techniques for which the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement is directly or indirectly observable.

Level 3 – Valuation techniques for which the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement is unobservable.

Application to the Company's Financial Instruments:

The Company's quoted investment in UTI Units (5,000 units) is classified under Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy. The fair value is determined based on the Net Asset Value (NAV) published by UTI Asset Management Company on the relevant reporting date, which constitutes a quoted price in an active market for an identical instrument. No significant unobservable inputs are used in determining the fair value.

Fair value as at 31.03.2026: Rs. 8,87,545 — Level 1 input.

For assets and liabilities that are recognised in the financial statements on a recurring basis, the Company determines whether transfers have occurred between levels in the hierarchy by re-assessing categorization (based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement as a whole) at the end of each reporting period.

Bank fixed deposits and other financial assets carried at amortised cost are short-term in nature and their carrying values are reasonable approximations of fair value. No separate fair value disclosure is considered necessary for these instruments.

For the purpose of fair value disclosures, the Company has determined classes of assets and liabilities on the basis of the nature, characteristics and risks of the asset or liability and the level of the fair value hierarchy as explained above.

19. Deposit against Appeal – DGVCL Matter pending before Hon'ble High Court of Gujarat

A supplementary electricity bill amounting to **₹69,64,717/-** was raised by Dakshin Gujarat Vij Company Limited (DGVCL) under Section 126 of the Electricity Act, 2003 on **19 March 2013**, pursuant to an inspection carried out on **19 February 2013**.

The Company deposited **₹34,82,360/-**, being 50% of the assessed amount, on **08 April 2013** as mandatory pre-deposit for filing appeal before the Chief Electrical Inspector (CEI), Gandhinagar. The CEI, vide order dated **24 July 2014**, decided the matter in favour of the Company.

Subsequently, DGVCL challenged the said order before the Hon'ble High Court of Gujarat by filing **Special Civil Application No. 9169 of 2015**. The Company also filed **Special Civil Application No. R/SCA/10750/2015** seeking implementation of the CEI order. Both matters are presently clubbed and pending adjudication before the Hon'ble High Court of Gujarat.

Pending disposal of the matter, DGVCL raised a total demand of **₹1,79,34,613/-**, comprising principal amount of **₹34,82,357/-** and interest aggregating to **₹1,44,52,256/-**, calculated by DGVCL.

During FY 2023-24, the Company remitted **₹1,67,62,198/-** to DGVCL through RTGS **strictly under protest and without prejudice to its legal rights**, solely to facilitate electricity connection formalities for the purchaser of leasehold rights relating to Plot No. 298/298, GIDC, Vapi. The Company has also requested DGVCL to adjust the existing security deposit amounting to **₹11,72,415/-** against the above demand.

The aforesaid amount of **₹2,14,04,744/-** has been classified as **Non-Current Asset – Deposit against Appeal**, considering that the matter remains sub judice before the Hon'ble High Court of Gujarat and the Company continues to contest the demand.

Management believes that the payments made do not constitute acceptance of liability and have been made solely under protest and without prejudice to the Company's rights. In the event of a

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favourable outcome, the amounts paid are expected to be recoverable in accordance with applicable law. Conversely, an adverse outcome may affect recoverability of the deposit.

Considering the uncertainty associated with the final outcome of the litigation, **no interest income has been recognised** on the aforesaid deposit during the year.

The management, based on legal position and available information, believes that the existing accounting treatment and disclosures are appropriate.

- 20. Capital Commitment:** Estimated amounts of contracts remaining to be executed on capital account is Nil (Net of advances).
- 21. Going Concern Assumption:** The Company's net worth is positive as on March 31, 2026 and assumed that Company is a going concern.
- 22. Current Assets, Loans and Advances:** In the opinion of the Board, the current assets, loans and advances are approximately of the value stated, if realized in the ordinary course of business, provision for depreciation and all known liabilities is adequate and not in excess of the amount reasonably necessary.
- 23. Other Receivables:** Balance of Trade Payables, Trade Deposits, Advance from Customers, Trade Receivables, Non-Current and Current Loans and Advances are subject to confirmation by the parties. In case of doubts regarding recoverability of receivables the provision for bad debt have been provided accordingly.
- 24. MSME Trade Payables:** There are no payables to Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, to whom the Company owes dues, which are outstanding for more than 45 days at the Balance Sheet date. The Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises have been identified on the basis of information available with the Company. This has been relied upon by the auditors.
