## **Karur Vysya Bank partners with Tambaram City Municipal Corporation to make Mullai Nagar greener; launches Sponge Park**

*Nature-based urban infrastructure project aims to enhance groundwater recharge, mitigate flooding, and create sustainable community spaces*
