This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts giving rise to present IA (re-filing) are that the Appellant e-filed the Memo of Appeal on 24.11.2025. The Office after scrutiny of the Memo of Appeal on 29.11.2025, intimated the defects to the Appellant on the same day. The Appellant re-filed the Appeal on 16.06.2026. It is stated in the IA that although the Appeal was refiled, but the Registry raised certain other defects. During the period the officer incharge/ authorised representative of the Appellant had resigned from his job. The file being voluminous also took some time in removal of defects. Clerk of the Counsel for the Appellant has also left the job owing to personal matter. Some time was also taken to understand and remove the objections raised. The approval for re-filing also took some time owing to administrative exigencies and procedural formalities. Further reasons for delay of 189 days have been mentioned in paragraphs 8, 9 and 10, with prayer to condone the same.

None appeared on behalf of the Appellant. Perused the averments made in the IA as well as Office report.

The Appellant was required to re-file the Memo of Appeal within seven days from the date of intimation of the defects. However, the Appellant re-filed the Memo of Appeal with a delay of 192 days, hence, the case may be placed before the Hon'ble Bench with defect for appropriate orders.
