This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts giving rise to present IA (re-filing) are that the Appellant e-filed the Memo of Appeal on 09.05.2026. The Office after scrutiny of the Memo of Appeal on 15.05.2026, intimated the defects to the Appellant on the same day. The Appellant re-filed the Appeal on 16.07.2026. It is stated in the IA that the delay of 55 days in refiling the Appeal was owing to the numerous defects pointed out by the registry and the fact that in addition to the Captioned Appeal, two interlocutory Applications were also required to be refiled. The Applicant was diligently trying to refile the present Appeal but due to multiple annexures, there has been an inadvertent delay in refiling the present Captioned Appeal, so the same may be condoned.

Heard Ld. Counsel for Appellant and perused the averments made in the IA as well as Office report.

The Appellant was required to re-file the Memo of Appeal within seven days from the date of intimation of the defects. However, the Appellant re-filed the Memo of Appeal with a delay of 55 days, hence, the case may be placed before the Hon'ble Bench with defect for appropriate orders.
