Women’s Asia Cup cricket

India beat Bangladesh to storm into 10th final

New Delhi Sep 10

Shafali Verma capitalised on three reprieves from a blazing half-century before India’s spin attack, led by Deepti Sharma, took control as the seven-time champions defeated Bangladesh by 40 runs to storm into their 10th Women’s Asia Cup final in Dubai on Thursday.

Shafali smashed 64 off 40 balls, hitting seven fours and three sixes, to provide the foundation for India’s 149/6 after Bangladesh opted to bowl on a sluggish surface at the Dubai International Cricket Stadium.

Deepti then produced a disciplined spell to finish with 3/26, while Sree Charani (1/14) and Prema Rawat (1/25) chipped in with key wickets as Bangladesh were restricted to 109/7 in the first semifinal.

Bangladesh made a brisk start to their chase, with Dilara Akter (21) and Juairiya Ferdous (14) putting together 26 runs for the opening wicket.

But India’s spinners soon tightened the screws, picking up wickets at regular intervals and

denying Bangladesh any sustained momentum.

Shorna Akter remained unbeaten on 22, but with wickets continuing to fall around her, Bangladesh fell short in the end.

Earlier, Shafali was given three lives, dropped on 1, 11 and 56, and made Bangladesh pay for every mistake.

After Smriti Mandhana departed cheaply, Shafali and Pratika Rawal added 50 for the second wicket before Rabeya Khan dismissed Rawal for 20 off 24 balls.

The 22-year-old Haryana right-hander continued to attack despite losing partners, reaching her 20th T20I half-century in just 35 balls. She then put on 43 with Harmanpreet Kaur (24 not out off 28 balls), who initially adopted a cautious approach before accelerating towards the end.

Bangladesh finally held on to a chance when substitute fielder Farjana Easmin caught Shafali at long-on as she attempted another big hit.

Her 40-ball 64 had, however, put

India firmly in control.

Harmanpreet then shifted gears alongside Richa Ghosh, who immediately made an impact with a straight six. The skipper followed with a maximum over long-off before Ghosh launched Shorna for another six.

Ghosh’s aggressive cameo ended when she was stumped for 21 off 16 balls, but Harmanpreet continued the assault, hitting a six with eight deliveries remaining.

Deepti provided the final push with a quick 13 off six balls as India finished on 149/6, a total that proved beyond Bangladesh’s reach.

India will now await the winner of Friday’s second semifinal between defending champions Sri Lanka and Pakistan.

East end 13-year wait, clinch 3rd Duleep Trophy

Chennai, Sept 11:

East Zone ended a 13-year wait for the Duleep Trophy title, beating South Zone on the basis of their first-innings lead in the final at the M.A. Chidambaram Stadium in Chennai on Thursday.

The title was East Zone’s third in the competition, with their previous triumph coming in the 2012-13 season.

With the match effectively decided after East Zone’s commanding first-innings total of 708, skipper Ishan Kishan declared at 388/7 in their second essay after 99.2 overs.

The declaration brought the final to an end and sparked celebrations among the East Zone players.

Md Kounain Quraishi was at the centre of the final day’s action, remaining unbeaten on 116 off 190 balls to register his maiden first-class century.

Anukul Roy provided valuable support with a composed 64 as the pair put on 150 for the seventh wicket.

East Zone had taken a stranglehold on the final after Kishan’s extraordinary 270 and Kumar Kushagra’s 101 powered them to 708 in the first innings.

Kishan then added 80 in the second innings, finishing the match with 350 runs.

Jharkhand’s players made a significant contribution to the title-winning campaign.

Kushagra’s century was followed by an impressive 85 from Shikhar Mohan

on his Duleep Trophy debut, while Kishan led the side from the front with both the bat and as captain.

Quraishi reached his century in the 96th over when he drove pacer CV Milind through extra cover for two runs. He took off his helmet and raised his arms as his teammates applauded from the balcony. The youngster then celebrated the milestone in style, smashing consecutive sixes off spinner Tripurana Vijay over mid-wicket and long-on.

Roy, meanwhile, brought up his half-century in the 89th over, guiding Shaik Rasheed through point for a single. His innings ended soon after when he edged MD Nidheesh to slip, where Devdutt Padikkal completed the catch.

South Zone were also docked five runs for a slow over-rate during the morning session after match officials held discussions with captain Tilak Varma.

After Quraishi fell safely short of the mid-on fielder off Milind in the 100th over, Kishan called his players in and declared.

The umpires removed the bails, formally confirming East Zone as champions.

South Zone pacer Mohammed Siraj continued to give his all despite the result being virtually settled, bowling nine successive overs in difficult conditions at Chepauck.

The East Zone players then celebrated on the

field, with Kishan and Vaibhav Sooryavanshi joining the festivities, dancing with a stump in hand and acknowledging the spectators.

Who should stay at home?

At a conference in Cochin, a Sunni cleric reportedly declared that their religious texts teach women to remain inside their homes, and that bringing them into public spaces could cause great destruction.

I looked outside nervously. Women were everywhere.

One was driving a bus. Another was performing surgery. A third was arguing a case in court. Several were teaching children, running companies, flying aircraft and administering districts.

Strangely, the buildings were still standing.

“Where is the great destruction?” I asked a gentleman nearby.

“It will come,” he whispered. “A woman may soon become independent.”

“Terrible,” I said. “She may even start thinking.”

He shuddered.

For centuries women have struggled for the simple right to be treated as equal human beings. Yet whenever they move forward, someone reaches for a religious book, pulls out a convenient sentence, and throws it at them.

The book is rarely opened to discover its context. It is simply used as a brick.

“Stay at home,” says a priest from the pulpit.

“Why?” asks the woman.

“Because God says so.”

“Where?”

“Do not ask too many questions. That also causes destruction.”

Many ancient instructions arose in societies where life was entirely different. Men hunted, fought wars, travelled through dangerous territories and earned outside the home. Women generally protected children and managed households. Those arrangements reflected the conditions of their age.

But today, wars are fought with satellites, computers, intelligence and technology. Women serve in armies, command aircraft, design missiles and lead governments. Physical strength no longer decides who can contribute to society.

Brains do.

And perhaps that is what frightens some men.

An educated woman can question. An independent woman can refuse injustice. A confident woman may ask why the man quoting scripture at her has never quoted the passages demanding that he practise kindness, justice, humility and self control.

Religion should lift people, not

lock them inside rooms.

Every faith has beautiful teachings about dignity, compassion and justice. But when scripture is pulled out of context and used to preserve male privilege, it does not strengthen religion. It makes religion look like an accomplice to bullying.

Such pronouncements are especially dangerous because they influence families where education is limited. A controlling husband hears them and imagines heaven has endorsed his behaviour. A frightened daughter is denied education. A talented wife is prevented from working. Oppression suddenly acquires a holy vocabulary.

If women entering public spaces causes great destruction, then perhaps what is being destroyed is not society, but male domination.

And that, dear reader, may be a destruction worth celebrating.

So, gentlemen, before telling women to stay at home, remember that the doctor saving your life, the judge protecting your rights, or the pilot flying your plane may be a woman.

And if that still troubles you, perhaps you should stay at home..!

Rybakina rallies past Gauff to reach first US Open final

New York, Sep 11:

Elena Rybakina fought back from a set down to defeat Coco Gauff 3-6, 6-4 in the US Open women’s singles semifinal on Thursday, securing a place in her first final at Flushing Meadows.

Gauff made the stronger start at Arthur Ashe Stadium, taking the opening set 6-3 as Rybakina struggled to find her rhythm. The American appeared in control early, but Rybakina gradually settled into the contest and began putting greater pressure on Gauff’s forehand.

The second-seeded

Kazakh broke through in the second set and held her nerve to level the match at one set apiece. Her powerful first serve and aggressive baseline play then became increasingly difficult for Gauff to contain.

Rybakina continued to dictate the rallies in the deciding set, although Gauff fought back late and threatened to extend the contest. The Kazakh held firm to close out the 2-hour, 18-minute battle 6-4 and reach her first US Open final.

The victory is another major milestone in a breakthrough year for

Rybakina. The 27-year-old, who won the Australian Open earlier this year, will become the world’s No. 1 player when the new rankings are released, making her the first player from Kazakhstan to reach the top of the women’s rankings.

For Gauff, the defeat ended her hopes of winning a second US Open title. The 22-year-old had reached the semifinal after surviving a dramatic quarterfinal against Mirra Andreeva, saving two match points before winning 2-6, 7-6, 6-2.

Rybakina will face defending champion Aryna Sabalenka in Saturday’s final. Sabalenka defeated American Jessica Pegula 7-5, 6-2 in the other semifinal and is attempting to win her third consecutive US Open title.

The final will also renew one of the biggest rivalries in women’s tennis. Rybakina defeated Sabalenka in the Australian Open final earlier this year, while Sabalenka will be seeking revenge and a historic third straight title in New York.
